JUNE 24/25, 2017

Our church is missionary by nature. Each of us as baptized Catholics are called to share in the work of evangelization. The diocese of Sacramento collaborates with mission groups every year to raise fund for their missions through a program called the Missionary Cooperative Plan. The group assigned to our parish this year is the Missionary Society of St. Paul. Fr. Evaristus Chukwu, MSP will be speaking to us from the Missionary Society of St Paul on the weekend of June 24/25. There will be a second collection to support them in their work. Special envelopes will be provided for your convenience. Donations made by check should be made payable to Saint Theresia Parish. All funds collected throughout the Diocese will be equally divided among the 51 missionary organizations visiting the Diocese of Sacramento this year.

The Missionary Society of St. Paul (MSP) is a congregation of priests founded in Nigeria in 1977. The Society now has 255 priests. They are working in ten countries of Africa, (South Africa, Malawi, Botswana, Cameroon, Liberia, Chad, The Gambia, Nigeria, Kenya and Southern Sudan), Grenada in the West Indies, the United States, England, Sweden and Ireland. They also have about 110 seminarians in their seminary in Nigeria.

Their mission in Malawi provides rehabilitation and support for orphans who lost their parents due to AIDS. They need our financial assistance to continue this mission. They also need funds to: 1) provide portable water and education in rural communities of Chad, Malawi, South Sudan and Nigeria; 2) Sponsoring seminarians, our future priests; 3) Supporting priests in the founding/building of new churches. THE REAL PRESENCE OF JESUS CHRIST IN THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST: BASIC QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Introduction

The Lord Jesus, on the night before he suffered on the cross, shared one last meal with his disciples. During this meal our Savior instituted the sacrament of his Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the ages and to entrust to the Church his Spouse a memorial of his death and resurrection. As the Gospel of Matthew tells us:

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, "Take and eat; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins." (Mt 26:26-28; cf. Mk 14:22-24, Lk 22:17-20, 1 Cor 11:23-25)

Recalling these words of Jesus, the Catholic Church professes that, in the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. . . For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink" (Jn 6:51-55). The whole Christ is truly present, body, blood, soul, and divinity, under the appearances of bread and wine—the glorified Christ who rose from the dead after dying for our sins. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist. This presence of Christ in the Eucharist is called "real" not to exclude other types of his presence as if they could not be understood as real (cf. Catechism, no. 1374). The risen Christ is present to his Church in many ways, but most especially through the sacrament of his Body and Blood.

What does it mean that Jesus Christ is present in the Eucharist under the appearances of bread and wine? How does this happen? The presence of the risen Christ in the Eucharist is an inexhaustible mystery that the Church can never fully explain in words. We must remember that the triune God is the creator of all that exists and has the power to do more than we can possibly imagine. As St. Ambrose said: "If the word of the Lord Jesus is so powerful as to bring into existence things which were not, then a fortiori those things which already exist can be changed into something else" (De Sacramentis, IV, 5-16). God created the world in order to share his life with persons who are not God. This great plan of salvation reveals a wisdom that surpasses our understanding. But we are not left in ignorance: for out of his love for us, God reveals his truth to us in ways that we can understand through the gift of faith and the grace of the Holy Spirit dwelling in us. We are thus enabled to understand at least in some measure what would otherwise remain unknown to us, though we can never completely comprehend the mystery of God. >>>>>>>>>

MASS CONFUSION

The man who feeds on My flesh and drinks My blood remains in Me, and I in him." —John 6:56

This book, One Bread, One Body, is written to motivate you to go to Mass daily or as often as possible. Our prayer is that you would live the Mass and make our eucharistic Lord the center of your life.

Jesus proclaimed: "The bread I will give is My flesh, for the life of the world" (Jn 6:51). This is a hard saying, and "the Jews quarreled among themselves" about it (Jn 6:52).

"Thereupon Jesus said to them: 'Let Me solemnly assure you, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you. He who feeds on My flesh and drinks My blood has life eternal and I will raise him up on the last day. For My flesh is real food and My blood real drink' " (Jn 6:53-55). The Lord has made it very clear that "in the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist 'the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained'" (Catechism, 1374).

If we don't believe the Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Jesus, Who is God, then we shouldn't trust the Church, which has always taught this. If we don't trust the Church, we have little reason to believe the Bible, for the Bible was compiled, established, and interpreted by the Church. If we don't believe in the Eucharist, the Church, and her Bible, then we have no objective basis for believing in Christianity. We then exist in a subjective, new-age confusion or in the empty hopelessness of agnosticism. Instead, we must believe that the Eucharist is the Body and Blood of God.

Prayer: Father, make me so in love with Your eucharistic Son that I will be willing to risk my life to receive Holy Communion.

Promise: "We, many though we are, are one body, for we all partake of the one bread." —1 Cor 10:17, our transl.

Praise: All praise to you, risen, eucharistic Jesus!



LA PRESENCIA REAL DE JESUCRISTO EN EL SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCHARISTÍA PREGUNTAS BÁSICAS Y RESPUESTAS

CONTINUACIÓN...

Cristo no tiene que dejar su lugar en el cielo para estar con nosotros. Nosotros, más bien, participamos de la liturgia celestial en la que Cristo intercede eternamente por nosotros y presenta su sacrificio al Padre, y en la que los ángeles y santos glorifican constantemente a Dios y dan gracias por todos sus dones: "*Al que está sentado en el trono y al Cordero, la alabanza, el honor, la gloria y el poder, por los siglos de los siglos*" (Ap 5, 13). Como indica el *Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica*, "Por la celebración eucarística nos unimos ya a la liturgia del cielo y anticipamos la vida eterna cuando Dios será todo en todos" (no. 1326). La proclamación del "Sanctus", "Santo, Santo, Santo es el Señor. . .", es la canción de los ángeles que están en la presencia de Dios (Is 6, 3). Cuando en la Eucaristía proclamamos el "Sanctus", hacemos eco en la tierra de la canción con la que los ángeles adoran a Dios en el cielo. En la celebración eucarística no recordamos simplemente un acontecimiento de la historia, sino que, mediante la acción misteriosa del Espíritu Santo en la celebración eucarística, el Misterio Pascual del Señor se hace presente y se actualiza a su Esposa la Iglesia.

Asimismo, en la actualización eucarística del eterno sacrificio de Cristo ante el Padre, nosotros no somos simples espectadores. El sacerdote y la comunidad de fieles están activos de maneras diferentes en el sacrificio eucarístico. El sacerdote ordenado, de pie ante el altar, representa a Cristo como cabeza de la Iglesia. Todos los bautizados, como miembros del Cuerpo de Cristo, participan del sacerdocio del Salvador, como sacerdote y víctima a la vez. La Eucaristía es también el sacrificio de la Iglesia. La Iglesia, Cuerpo y Esposa de Cristo, participa en la ofrenda sacrificial de su Cabeza y Esposo. En la Eucaristía el sacrificio de Cristo se convierte en el sacrificio de los miembros de su Cuerpo que unidos a Cristo forman una sola ofrenda sacrificial (cf. *Catecismo*, no. 1368). Como el sacrificio de Cristo, se hace presente de manera sacramental, unidos a Cristo, ***nosotros nos ofrecemos como sacrificio al Padre***. "La Iglesia, al desempeñar la función de sacerdote y víctima juntamente con Cristo, ofrece toda entera el sacrificio de la misa, y toda entera se ofrece en él" (*Mysterium Fidei*, no. 31; cf. *Lumen Gentium*, no. 11).

CONFUSIÓN MASIVA

"El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre permanece en mí y yo en él" (Juan 6, 56).

Este libro, Un Pan, Un Cuerpo, se escribe para motivarlo a ir diariamente a Misa tan frecuentemente como sea posible. Nuestra oración es que usted viva la Misa y haga de nuestro Señor eucarístico el centro de su vida.

Jesús proclamó: "El pan que yo daré es mi carne para la Vida del mundo" (Jn 6, 51). Esta es una dura expresión, y "los judíos discutían entre sí" (Jn 6, 52). "Jesús les respondió: 'Les aseguro que si no comen la carne del Hijo del hombre y no beben su sangre, no tendrán Vida en ustedes. El que come Mi carne y bebe Mi sangre tiene Vida eterna, y yo lo resucitaré en el último día. Porque Mi carne es la verdadera comida y Mi sangre, la verdadera bebida'" (Jn 6, 53-55). El Señor ha dejado muy claro que "En el Santísimo Sacramento de la Eucaristía están 'contenidos verdadera, real y substancialmente el Cuerpo y la Sangre junto con el alma y la divinidad de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, y, por consiguiente, Cristo entero'" (Catecismo 1374)

Si no creemos que la Eucaristía es el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesús, Quien es Dios, entonces no deberíamos confiar en la Iglesia, la cual siempre nos ha enseñado esto. Si no confiamos en la Iglesia, tenemos pocas razones para creer en la Biblia, porque la Biblia fue compilada, establecida e interpretada por la Iglesia. Si no creemos en la Eucaristía, la Iglesia y su Biblia, entonces no tenemos bases objetivas para creer en el Cristianismo. Entonces nosotros existimos en una confusión subjetiva de nueva era o en la desesperanza vacía del agnosticismo. En cambio deberíamos creer que la Eucaristía es el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Dios.

Oración: Padre, haz que me enamore tanto de Tu Hijo eucarístico, como para estar dispuesto a arriesgar mi vida para recibir la Santa Comunión.

Promesa: "Todos nosotros, aunque somos muchos, formamos un solo Cuerpo, porque participamos de ese único pan" (1 Co 10:17).
