DIVINE WISDOM - The Lord's message, through Moses, was to "take no revenge and cherish no grudge . . . love your neighbor as yourself" (Leviticus 19:18). We might think, "Great in theory, but not always realistic!"

Then Jesus in today's Gospel goes even further. Take a slap in the face and then turn the other cheek? Treat enemies the same as friends? Again, we're tempted to think that those are nice ideals, but not very practical in the "real world."

Paul echoes Jesus when he tells the Corinthians that what passes for human wisdom is absurdity to God. Divine wisdom casts sunshine on the good and the bad, showers rain on the honest and the dishonest—without distinction. We must examine our wisdom and common sense to see how they compare to the wisdom of God, and make adjustments accordingly. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

LOVING THOSE WHO HURT YOU

"Take no revenge and cherish no grudge against your fellow countrymen. You shall love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord." —Leviticus 19:18

Jesus was asked: "Teacher, which commandment of the law is the greatest?" (Mt 22:36) Jesus surprised His questioner by mentioning not one commandment but two. He surprised all of Judaism by maintaining that loving one's neighbor as oneself is the second commandment, and together with the first commandment forms the basis of the law and the prophets (Mt 22:40).

The Biblical context for the second commandment isn't merely about generally helping out our neighbors or being friendly to them. In Leviticus 19:18, to love our neighbor specifically means not bearing hatred toward them, not taking revenge on them, and not cherishing a grudge against them. So when Jesus was asked to name the greatest commandment, He did not merely add to the first commandment the command to love our neighbor; He also implied a prohibition against hating, taking revenge, and cherishing grudges.

Is there anyone you hate? Do you want to get back at someone? Are you holding a grudge? Have you forgiven from your heart everyone for everything? (Mt 18:35) Do you love your neighbor as yourself by God's standards? This Lent, be reconciled, forgive, and love your neighbor.

Prayer: Sacred Heart of Jesus, purify my heart this Lent to love the Samaritans and enemies in my life (Lk 10:29ff).

Promise: "Are you not aware that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" —1 Cor 3:16

Praise: Praise You, Jesus, Lord of forgiveness and mercy. You had mercy on those who crucified You, and You have mercy on each of us. We adore You.

Y en el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús se adelanta. ¿Si te golpean, pon la otra mejilla? ¿Tratar a los enemigos como si fueran amigos? Y así otra vez, estamos tentados a pensar que son bonitos ideales, pero no muy prácticos en el “mundo real”.

Pablo hace eco a las palabras de Jesús cuando les dice a los corintios que lo que parece ser sabiduría de los hombres es absurdo para Dios. La sabiduría divina brilla sobre los buenos y los malos, llueve sobre los honestos y deshonestos, sin distinción. **AMAR A AQUELLOS QUE TE HACEN DAÑO
"No serás vengativo con tus compatriotas ni les guardarás rencor. Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. Yo soy el Señor" (Levítico 19, 18).**

Le preguntaron a Jesús: "Maestro, ¿cuál es el mandamiento más grande de la Ley?" (Mt 22, 36) Jesús sorprendió a su interlocutor mencionando no solo un mandamiento, sino dos. Sorprendió a todo el judaísmo al sostener que el amor al prójimo como a uno mismo es el segundo mandamiento, y junto con el primer mandamiento forma la base de la ley y los profetas (Mt 22, 40). El contexto bíblico para el segundo mandamiento no es simplemente ayudar a nuestros vecinos o ser amable con ellos. En Levítico 19, 18, amar a nuestro vecino concretamente significa no llevar odio hacia ellos, no tomar venganza, y no plantar un resentimiento. Por eso, cuando se le preguntó a Jesús nombrar el mayor mandamiento, Él no solo agregó al primer mandamiento el mandamiento de amar al prójimo; Él también implicaba una prohibición de odio, de venganza, y de cultivar rencores.

¿Hay alguien a quién odias? ¿Quieres vengarte de alguien? ¿Estás conteniendo un resentimiento? ¿Haz perdonado a todo el mundo desde tu corazón por todo? (Mt 18, 35) ¿Quieres a tu prójimo como a ti mismo de acuerdo a las normas de Dios? En esta Cuaresma, reconcíliate, perdona y ama al prójimo.

Oración: Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, purifica mi corazón en esta Cuaresma para amar a los samaritanos y a los enemigos (Lc 10, 29ss).

Promesa: "¿No saben que ustedes son templo de Dios y que el Espíritu de Dios habita en ustedes?" (1 Co 3,16)
