BORN TO BE WILD?

"Why...did it bring forth wild grapes?" —Isaiah 5:4

God took perfect care of His vineyard, the house of Israel (Is 5:1ff). With a perfect Gardener and perfect care, you would expect the vineyard to produce domesticated, fruitful grapes. No one would logically expect wild grapes to be produced. For this to happen, the domesticated grapevines that were planted and cultivated would seemingly need to have new DNA, that of wild grapes, and that is what resulted.

Therefore, God told the people of Israel, and us also, that if they want to change their nature to be wild, He would let them live in a condition which fits their desire for wildness. Thus, the Lord tore down the walls which protected the vineyard, allowing wild conditions, wild plants, and wild animals to invade (Is 5:5-6). Perhaps then the Israelites, and us as well, would come to their senses (see Lk 15:17ff) and return to the Lord. Perhaps the wild grapes would learn from the merciless effects of wild living and humbly return to their domesticated, fruitful nature that comes with being a child of God.

When Jesus proclaimed the parable of the vineyard in today's Gospel reading, those who heard understood Jesus' message all too clearly. It was not that they couldn't understand Jesus; it was that most of those who heard Him rejected His message, rejected God and His protection, and chose wildness and separation from Him.

The message is clear. God's plan is to bring us into His family so we'll bear good fruit. Repent of any desire to "run wild" and rebel against the Lord (Ex 32:25).

Prayer: Father, do in me whatever it takes in order to do through me whatever You will.

Promise: "Then God's own peace, which is beyond all understanding, will stand guard over your hearts and minds." —

Phil 4:7

Praise: Praise You, Jesus, "my Lord and my God!" (Jn 20:28)

BAPTISM AND EUCHARIST

Sacraments are very specific events in which God touches us through creation and transforms us into living Christs. The two main sacraments are baptism and the Eucharist. In baptism water is the way to transformation. In the Eucharist it is bread and wine. The most ordinary things in life - water, bread, and wine - become the sacred way by which God comes to us.

These sacraments are actual events. Water, bread, and wine are not simple reminders of God's love; they bring God to us. In baptism we are set free from the slavery of sin and dressed with Christ. In the Eucharist, Christ himself becomes our food and drink.

BAPTISM: BECOMING CHILDREN OF THE LIGHT

Today's readings focus our attention on vineyards. Isaiah's song concerning his friend's vineyard begins with inspiring and poetic images of an idyllic vineyard where the choicest harvest is expected. Instead, the vineyard yields wild grapes, which causes the owner to abandon it. The psalmist cries out to God, asking that God once again take care of the vineyard, which is the house of Israel. The parable told in today's Gospel offers a stern warning that those who commit treachery in the hopes of attaining personal wealth will be "put . . . to a wretched death" (Matthew 21:41). Jesus warns his listeners not to act like the murderous tenants in the vineyard. Instead he exhorts them to produce the kind of fruit that will lead them to the kingdom of God.

DAR BUEN FRUTO

Las lecturas de hoy ponen su atención en las viñas. El cántico de Isaías respecto a la viña de su amada comienza con inspiradoras y poéticas imágenes de una idílica viña de la cual se espera la más exquisita cosecha. En cambio, la viña da uvas agrias, lo cual hace que el dueño la abandone. El salmista clama a Dios, pidiéndole que la visite otra vez, ya que es la casa de Israel. La parábola que cuenta hoy el Evangelio ofrece la seria advertencia de que a los que cometan traición esperando obtener ganancia personal se les “dará muerte terrible” (Mateo 21:41). Jesús advierte a sus oyentes que no actúen como los viñadores asesinos en la viña. Más bien los exhorta a que produzcan el tipo de fruto que los llevará al Reino de Dios.

HACIENDO CRISTIANOS

Entonces, llena de una alegría desbordante, exclamé: "Uno de los Padres de la Iglesia, Tertuliano, en el siglo II de nuestra era, escribió que los 'los cristianos se hacen, no nacen'. Tertuliano nos dice que es responsabilidad de la Iglesia convertir personas para hacerlas cristianas y que para ello se necesitan ciertas herramientas que se han de utilizar de cierta manera. Tertuliano no hacía más que recordarnos lo que Jesús nos dijo justo antes de su Ascensión a los cielos: 'Vayan y hagan discípulos entre todos los pueblos, bauticénlos consagrándolos al Padre y al Hijo y al Espíritu Santo, y ensenándoles a cumplir todo lo que les he mandado' (Mateo 28, 19-20).

Jesús deja claro que hacer discípulos es nuestra gran misión...Jesús mismo nos indicó aquello que necesitamos para tener unos cimientos firmes en la fe cristiana: fe, esperanza, amor, misericordia, compasión, bondad, justicia, etcétera, pero no terminó ahí. Nos enseñó con el ejemplo de su propia vida cómo se construyen unos cimientos firmes y cómo lograr que se hagan aún más fuertes. Esta labor de edificar la fe y hacer discípulos de Cristo se llama evangelización, y es la labor más importante de la Iglesia. El Papa Pablo VI dijo claramente en su exhortación apostólica *Evangelii Nuntiandi* acerca de la evangelización en el mundo contemporáneo: 'La Iglesia existe para evangelizar.' Evangelizar es convertir a las personas; es lograr que las personas que siguen caminos equivocados sigan a Jesús, que es el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida. Hacer un cristiano significa impartir una forma de vida. Esto significa que convertirse en seguidor de Jesús, en discípulo, requiere no solo información sino también transformación. Tenemos que saber ciertas cosas para ser discípulos de Jesús, pero también tenemos que hacer cosas específicas para vivir como seguidores suyos.

¿NACIDOS PARA SER SALVAJES?

"¿Por qué dio frutos agrios?" (Isaías 5:4).

Dios cuidó perfectamente de su viña, la casa de Israel (Is 5:1ss). Con un jardinero y un cuidado perfecto, se esperaría que el viñedo produzca uvas orgánicas y fructíferas. Lógicamente, nadie esperaría que se produjeran uvas silvestres. Para que esto suceda, las vides orgánicas que fueron plantadas y cultivadas deberían tener aparentemente un nuevo ADN, el de las uvas silvestres y eso resultaría.

Por lo tanto, Dios dijo al pueblo de Israel y a nosotros también, que si quieren cambiar su naturaleza para que sea salvaje, Él les dejaría vivir en una condición que se ajuste a su deseo de ser silvestres. Así, el Señor derribó los muros que protegían la viña, permitiendo que las condiciones salvajes, las plantas silvestres y los animales lo invadieran (Is 5:5-6). Tal vez entonces los israelitas, y nosotros también, llegaríamos a recapacitar (ver Lc 15:17ss) y volveríamos al Señor. Tal vez las uvas silvestres aprenderían de los efectos despiadados de la vida salvaje y humildemente regresarían a su naturaleza domesticada y fructífera que viene con ser un hijo de Dios.

Cuando Jesús proclamó la parábola de la viña en la lectura del Evangelio de hoy, aquellos que lo escucharon, entendieron todo el mensaje de Jesús muy claramente. No fue que no pudieron entender a Jesús; fue que la mayoría de los que lo escucharon, rechazaron Su mensaje, rechazaron a Dios y su protección, y eligieron la insensatez y la separación de Él.

El mensaje es claro. El plan de Dios es hacernos también parte de Su familia y dar buen fruto. Arrepíéntanse de cualquier deseo de "correr como salvajes" y rebelarse contra el Señor (Ex 32:25).

Oración: Padre, haz en mí lo que sea necesario para realizar lo que Tú quieras.

Promesa: "Entonces la paz de Dios, que supera todo lo que podemos pensar, tomará bajo su cuidado los corazones y los pensamientos" (Fil 4:7).

Alabanza: Alabado sea Jesús, "Señor mío y Dios mío" (Jn 20:28).
