CHURCH MILITANT OR CHURCH DEFEATED?

"They were filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak God's word with confidence." —Acts 4:31
The apostles were thrown into prison by the Jewish leaders for healing a crippled man and then "teaching the people and proclaiming the resurrection of the dead in the person of Jesus" (Acts 4:2). They were then threatened by the leaders to never mention the name of Jesus again (Acts 4:17) and were released. The apostles returned to the other disciples and prayed for complete assurance when they proclaimed the Word of God (Acts 4:29-30). After this prayer, they were filled with the Holy Spirit. They continued to speak God's Word with confidence (Acts 4:31).

Like the first believers in the risen Jesus, we must not be alarmed that the powerful of the world rage and conspire against us (see Acts 4:25). The Church and its members have been attacked for centuries. God in heaven simply laughs (Ps 2:4). He has eternal, almighty power. The powerful of the world wield their power for but a moment in time.

Therefore, we must pray for that same confidence, assurance, and boldness that the apostles possessed. God wants us to confidently know that if He is for us, no one can be against us (Rm 8:31). "He Who is in you is greater than he who is in the world" (1 Jn 4:4, RSV-CE). We are more than conquerors in Jesus (Rm 8:37). Persevere in spreading the Word of God. We are invincible when we are rooted in Jesus and stand securely in the center of His will.

Prayer: May we stir up the Holy Spirit in the world, Lord Jesus. Raise up many teenagers and adults to accept holy, confident, and bold religious vocations and to speak God's Word with confidence

Sometimes our sorrow overwhelms us so much that we no longer can believe in joy. Life just seems a cup filled to the brim with war, violence, rejection, loneliness, and endless disappointments. It might be hard for us to trust that any joy can come from our sorrow, but when we start taking steps in the direction of our friends' advice, even when we ourselves are not yet able to feel the truth of what they say, the joy that seemed to be lost may be found again and our sorrow may become livable.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El 20 de abril de 1906 los ojos de una imagen de la Dolorosa comenzaron a parpadear durante un lapso de 15 minutos en el colegio jesuita San Gabriel, en Quito, Ecuador. En 1995 en Cochabamba, Bolivia, donde una imagen del Divino rostro lagrimó sangre y después, una imagen de la Inmaculada hizo lo mismo. En el transcurso del siglo veinte, muchísimas imágenes de Cristo, María e incluso, el Espíritu Santo, lloraron lágrimas de agua, sangre u óleo, emitieron aroma de rosa o mostraron alguna manifestación paranormal.

La ciencia logró explicar algunos de estos fenómenos, pero en muchos casos no fue posible. Normalmente, la jerarquía eclesiástica prefiere no hacer declaraciones oficiales al respecto, por lo menos, no antes de mucho escrutinio. El apóstol san Juan recomienda examinar cada espíritu (1 Juan 4:1-3) y esto es lo que la Iglesia hace con estas manifestaciones sobrenaturales. Con investigaciones científicas, sociales y espirituales se examinan cuidadosamente estas manifestaciones a fin de asegurar que provienen de Dios y no del diablo u otros orígenes. En fin, la mejor prueba de la veracidad de estos fenómenos es la conversión de los fieles.

CONFESIÓN

"Reciban al Espíritu Santo. Los pecados serán perdonados a los que ustedes se los perdonen" (Juan 20, 22-23).

Al atardecer del día en que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos, Jesús vino a Sus discípulos, les mostró las manos cicatrizadas por los clavos y el costado herido, sopló sobre ellos, les dio el Espíritu Santo, y los envió a hacer lo mismo que Él (Jn 20, 19-22). Jesús envió a Sus discípulos no para hacer un anuncio general de su Resurrección, sino para invitarnos específicamente a confesar nuestros pecados y ser perdonados (ver Jn 20, 23; Lc 24:47; Hch 2, 38; 3:19; 5, 31; 10, 43; 13, 38).

Uno de los primeros hechos de Cristo resucitado fue el de empezar a desarrollar el Sacramento de la Reconciliación para el perdón de los pecados. Una de las primeras cosas que tenemos que hacer esta temporada de Pascua es arrepentirnos y confesarnos. Cuando hemos removido los tabloncillos del pecado de nuestros propios ojos, entonces podremos quitar las manchas de los ojos de los demás; llamándolos al arrepentimiento, a perdonar, a ir a confesión, ser perdonados (Mt 7:5), y sumergirnos en la misericordia ilimitada de Dios.

Sin confesión, nuestra celebración del tiempo de Pascua se cancelará y no llegará a término. Con confesión, nos encontraremos con Cristo resucitado, somos enviados a proclamar el perdón de los pecados, y a celebrar al Cristo resucitado para la temporada completa de Pascua y para la eternidad. Oración: Padre, Hijo resucitado y Espíritu Santo, creo en Ti con toda mi alma.

Oración: Padre, que mi primera confesión en este tiempo pascual pueda cambiar mi vida. Que en este día de la Misericordia pueda experimentar la profundidad de Tú océano de misericordia, como Tú me reconcilias contigo.

Promesa: La hermandad escucha "la enseñanza de los Apóstoles y participar en la vida común, en la fracción del pan y en las oraciones" (Hch 2, 42)

Alabanza: Alabado seas Jesús, "la Resurrección y la Vida" (Jn 11, 25), "el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida" (Jn 14, 6).
