### "THE DISCIPLINE OF THE LORD" AND THE LORD OF THE DISCIPLINE

**"Someone asked Him, 'Lord, are they few in number who are to be saved?' " —Luke 13:23**

To be saved, we must confess with our lips that Jesus is Lord (Rm 10:9). However, we human beings have trouble saying "Yes" when we mean "Yes" and "No" when we mean "No" (Mt 5:37). We have trouble telling the truth because we speak from our hearts' abundance (Lk 6:45) and our hearts are twisted and deceitful (Jer 17:9). We must find a way to straighten out our twisted hearts so we can truly acknowledge Jesus as Lord.


The Lord has given His beloved sons and daughters the gift of discipline. By God's grace, discipline makes "straight the paths you walk on" (Heb 12:13). The Lord works through discipline to make straight even our twisted, deceitful hearts. Therefore, we must "not disdain the discipline of the Lord" (Heb 12:5). At first, "all discipline seems a cause for grief and not for joy, but later it brings forth the fruit of peace and justice" (Heb 12:11). By accepting the discipline of discipleship, we can truthfully accept Jesus as our Lord and our Justice (see 1 Cor 1:30). Thank the Lord for the discipline of our daily crosses (see Lk 9:23), of our vocations, of our call to almsgiving, prayer, and fasting (see Mt 6:16-18), and for our responsibility to forgive and love even our enemies (Mt 5:44).

#### WHAT'S THE SMOKE FOR?

*Dear Johan,*

***As I was walking through the sacristy I heard someone use the word sacrarium. I had never heard the word. I had to write it down so I could remember. Please tell me what it is.***

Gentle Reader,

Wow, not very many people have this word as part of their vocabulary. Congratulations!

The root of the Latin word sacrarium is sacer, meaning sacred. Since ancient Roman times this word has been used to refer to a place where sacred objects are preserved. Roman temples, for example, had a sacrarium.

It is from sacrarium that the English words sacristy and sanctuary are derived. The sacristy is the place where liturgical vessels and vestments are preserved. It is also the place where liturgical ministers prepare themselves for the liturgy. The sanctuary is the area immediately surrounding the altar, often encompassing the ambo and the altar. In older churches, the sanctuary was architecturally delineated from the rest of the church. In more contemporary churches, the sanctuary is less clearly defined, hinting at the fact that the entire building is made sacred by sacred actions that are celebrated in it. As an aside, in some Christian traditions the word sanctuary is used to refer to the entire worship space.

The word sacrarium itself was adopted for liturgical use in English from the Latin for a very specific usage. A sacrarium is a sacred sink in the sacristy. This sink is not an ordinary sink as it cannot drain into the sewer system but rather needs to drain directly into the ground. This basin is exclusively intended for sacred usage.

The linens that are used during the liturgy are cleaned in the sacrarium. This includes the purificators or the linen napkins used to wipe the chalice during Communion and during the purification of the chalice. This also includes the corporal or the linen cloth, which is spread on the altar underneath the chalice and paten.

After the chalices have been purificated, meaning they have been rinsed with water that has been consumed, they can be further rinsed in the sacrarium. Consecrated wine is never to be poured down the sacrarium.

Finally, the sacrarium is also used for the proper disposal of blessed ashes, holy water, and oils.

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#### LET GO

All the good things our world has to offer are yours to enjoy. But you can enjoy them truly only when you can acknowledge them as affirmations of the truth that you are the Beloved of God. The truth will set you free to receive the beauty of nature and culture in gratitude, as a sign of your Belovedness. That truth will allow you to receive the gifts you receive from your society and celebrate life. But that truth will also allow you to let go of what distracts you, confuses you, and puts in jeopardy the life of the Spirit within you.

## ¿ERES SALVO?

"Una persona le preguntó: 'Señor, ¿es verdad que son pocos los que se salvan?' Él respondió: 'traten de entrar por la puerta estrecha, porque les aseguro que muchos querrán entrar y no lo conseguirán.' " (Lucas 13,23-24).

Jesús parece haber señalado que mucha gente podría salvarse. Él dijo: "Entren por la puerta estrecha, porque es ancha la puerta y espacioso el camino que lleva a la perdición y son muchos los que van por ahí. Pero es angosta la puerta y estrecho el camino que lleva a la Vida y son pocos los que la encuentran" (Mt 7,13-14). Pareciera tan simple como dejar que Jesús haga su obra, y podremos irnos directo al cielo. Pero para que esto suceda, debemos aceptar a Jesús como Señor de nuestras vidas, arrepentirnos de vivir a "nuestra manera" y decidir vivir conforme a la suya. No basta con pensar sólo en nuestra salvación sino también estamos llamados a ir a otras personas e hablarles de Jesús nuestro Señor. Invitarles, con palabra y ejemplo, a entrar por la puerta angosta e ir por el camino áspero que conduce a la vida eterna.
