### TERESA OF CALCUTTA

Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu, the nun known to the world as Mother Teresa of Calcutta, was born to Albanian parents in what is now Macedonia in 1910. As a Sister of Loreto, she taught girls in her order's mission schools in India for twenty years. But in 1946, on a train journey in the mountains, she suddenly realized that God was calling her to something more—to care for the poorest of the poor.

Mother Teresa won several awards for her work, including the Nobel Peace Prize. She always used the money from such prizes to found new homes and hospitals for poor people. She died in 1997 at the age of 87. Her life and work remind us that happiness and holiness come from doing "something beautiful for God." She was beatified in 2003, and will be canonized on Sunday, September 4, 2016.

### JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY



"If anyone comes to me without hating . . . father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his [or her] own life" (Luke 14:26). Hating? Can anyone imagine a less appropriate Gospel for the *Jubilee Year of Mercy*? But scholars call this Semitic hyperbole. Jesus exaggerates to jolt us into confronting life-changing challenges. Faced with conflicting loyalties, disciples must reorder priorities, even relationships, to give Jesus and the gospel's demands first place. Today's second reading presents a real-life example. Paul challenges his wealthy convert, Philemon, to welcome back Philemon's runaway slave, Onesimus, whom Paul has baptized in prison. Not only with unconditional forgiveness but with a counter-cultural, world-shattering change of status—as an equal. No, even more—a beloved brother in Christ. What in my life does the *Jubilee Year of Mercy* challenge me to "hate"—meaning reform, redo, even utterly revamp—so I can give everyone, no conditions, no exceptions, shockingly Christ-like love?

### QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

Theme: Commitment is required to follow Jesus.

Breaking Open the Word: Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's Gospel

**Step One: Listen to the Word:** As you listen to the reading today, what image caught your imagination? What word or phrase struck you?

**Step Two: Look into Your Life:** QUESTION FOR CHILDREN: Jesus says that in order to be one of his followers, we must be close to him. When do you feel closest to Jesus? QUESTION FOR YOUTH: Jesus tells his disciples that they must renounce their possessions in order to be His disciple. If you had to, could you leave everything behind to be with God? What would hold you back? How much of a struggle would it be? QUESTION FOR ADULTS: Today's Gospel is demanding. How do you as a modern man or woman "denounce your possessions?" What does this mean for you?

### SUPREME AND EXTREME LOVE

**"If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, his wife and his children, his brothers and sisters, indeed his very self, he cannot be My disciple."** —Luke 14:26, our transl.

A traditional hymn begins: "Jesus, my Lord, my God, my All, how can I love Thee as I ought?" We love Jesus as we ought by loving Him with all our hearts, all our souls, all our minds, and all our strength (Lk 10:27). When we give our "all" to Jesus, our relationship with Him is in a class by itself (see Lk 14:26). When we love Jesus as we ought, we die to ourselves and take up our crosses daily (Lk 14:27; 9:23). When we make Jesus our Lord, God, and All, we renounce all our possessions (Lk 14:33). We are owned by God (see 1 Cor 6:19-20), and everything we supposedly own belongs to Him.

To love Jesus as He ought to be loved seems to be extreme, and it is. Nevertheless, Jesus loved us to the extremities of the cross. Consequently, to love Him rightly means to give Him nothing less than everything. To give all to Jesus is the most and the least that we can do. He alone died on the cross for love of each of us. He is God. He must be loved accordingly. By grace, we can love Him as He ought to be loved. Love Him Who is Love (1 Jn 4:16).

**Prayer:** Father, may I "grasp fully, with all the holy ones, the breadth and length and height and depth of Christ's love, and experience this love" (Eph 3:18-19).

**Promise:** "Who ever knew Your counsel, except You had given Wisdom and sent Your Holy Spirit from on high?" —Wis 9:17

**Praise:** Praise the risen Jesus, Who holds "the keys of death and the nether world!" (Rv 1:18)

3. Reservar la iglesia por lo menos 6 meses antes de la celebración.
4. Deben llenar una forma con su información personal y recibir un folleto con las lecturas y más información. La forma y el folleto están disponibles en la oficina.
5. La quinceañera y sus acompañantes deben participar en 3 reuniones de preparación espiritual al evento religioso. El Sacerdote les avisará del día y la hora.
6. La celebración en la Iglesia es por naturaleza un evento espiritual, por lo tanto se espera que los acompañantes junto con la quinceañera se preparen para este evento. Se ofrecerá el Sacramento de la Confesión si así lo desean.
7. Es costumbre programar una hora y día para el ensayo en la Iglesia. La quinceañera junto con sus acompañantes deben participar.
8. Se exige puntualidad para la celebración.
9. La quinceañera y sus acompañantes deben vestirse con modestia.

### AMOR EXTREMO Y SUPREMO

**"Cualquiera que venga a mí y no me ame más que a su padre y a su madre, a su mujer y a sus hijos, a sus hermanos y hermanas, y hasta a su propia vida, no puede ser mi discípulo" (Lucas 14, 26).**

Un himno tradicional comienza así: "Jesús, mi Señor, mi Dios, mi todo, ¿cómo puedo amarte como debo?" Amarás al Señor, tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con todas tus fuerzas y con todo tu espíritu, y a tu prójimo como a ti mismo (Lc 10, 27). Cuando damos nuestro "todo" a Jesús, nuestra relación con Él es de una sola clase (ver Lc 14, 26). Cuando amamos a Jesús como debemos, morimos a nosotros mismos y cargamos diariamente nuestras cruces (Lc 14, 27; 9, 23). Cuando hacemos a Jesús nuestro Señor, Dios, y Todo, renunciamos a todo lo que poseemos (Lc 14, 33). Somos propiedad de Dios (ver 1 Co 6, 19-20), y todo lo que supuestamente poseemos le pertenece a Él. Amar a Jesús como Él debe ser amado parece ser extremo, y lo es. Sin embargo, Jesús nos amó hasta los extremos de la cruz. En consecuencia, amarlo correctamente significa darle nada menos que todo. Para darle todo a Jesús es lo más y lo menos que podemos hacer. Solo Él murió en la cruz por amor a cada uno de nosotros. Él es Dios. Según esto, Él debe ser amado. Por la gracia, podemos amarle como Él debe ser amado. Ama a Dios Que es amor (1 Jn 4, 16).

**Oración:** Padre, que pueda "comprender, con todos los santos, cuál es la anchura y la longitud, la altura y la profundidad, en una palabra, ustedes podrán conocer el amor de Cristo" (Ef 3, 18-19).
