CONTEMPORARY GnosticISM | CONTEMPORARY PELAGIANISM

New pelagians

57. Still, some Christians insist on taking another path, that of justification by their own efforts, the worship of the human will and their own abilities. The result is a self-centred and elitist complacency, bereft of true love. This finds expression in a variety of apparently unconnected ways of thinking and acting: an obsession with the law, an absorption with social and political advantages, a punctilious concern for the Church’s liturgy, doctrine and prestige, a vanity about the ability to manage practical matters, and an excessive concern with programmes of self-help and personal fulfilment. Some Christians spend their time and energy on these things, rather than letting themselves be led by the Spirit in the way of love, rather than being passionate about communicating the beauty and the joy of the Gospel and seeking out the lost among the immense crowds that thirst for Christ.[63]

58. Not infrequently, contrary to the promptings of the Spirit, the life of the Church can become a museum piece or the possession of a select few. This can occur when some groups of Christians give excessive importance to certain rules, customs or ways of acting. The Gospel then tends to be reduced and constricted, deprived of its simplicity, allure and savor. This may well be a subtle form of pelagianism, for it appears to subject the life of grace to certain human structures. It can affect groups, movements and communities, and it explains why so often they begin with an intense life in the Spirit, only to end up fossilized... or corrupt.

59. Once we believe that everything depends on human effort as channeled by ecclesial rules and structures, we unconsciously complicate the Gospel and become enslaved to a blueprint that leaves few openings for the working of grace. Saint Thomas Aquinas reminded us that the precepts added to the Gospel by the Church should be imposed with moderation “lest the conduct of the faithful become burdensome”, for then our religion would become a form of servitude.[64]

The summation of the Law

60. To avoid this, we do well to keep reminding ourselves that there is a hierarchy of virtues that bids us seek what is essential. The primacy belongs to the theological virtues, which have God as their object and motive. At the centre is charity. Saint Paul says that what truly counts is “faith working through love” (Gal 5:6). We are called to make every effort to preserve charity: “The one who loves another has fulfilled the law... for love is the fulfilment of the law” (Rom 13:8.10). “For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, ‘You shall love your neighbour as yourself’” (Gal 5:14).

61. In other words, amid the thicket of precepts and prescriptions, Jesus clears a way to seeing two faces, that of the Father and that of our brother. He does not give us two more formulas or two more commands. He gives us two faces, or better yet, one alone: the face of God reflected in so many other faces. For in every one of our brothers and sisters, especially the least, the most vulnerable, the defenceless and those in need, God’s very image is found. Indeed, with the scraps of this frail humanity, the Lord will shape his final work of art. For “what endures, what has value in life, what riches do not disappear? Surely these two: the Lord and our neighbour. These two riches do not disappear!”[65]

62. May the Lord set the Church free from these new forms of gnosticism and pelagianism that weigh her down and block her progress along the path to holiness! These aberrations take various shapes, according to the temperament and character of each person. So I encourage everyone to reflect and discern before God whether they may be present in their lives.

WHAT'S THE SMOKE FOR?

Dear Johan,

I never understood the significance of priests' robes, their layers and colors. Could you please explain?

Gentle Reader,

The vestments worn by the liturgical ministers point to their function within the church. The alb, the white tunic, is the common vesture of all the baptized. The word alb comes from the Latin word *albus*, which means white.

Liturgical ministers wear albs to indicate that they minister by virtue of their baptism. Technically speaking, all the baptized could wear such a garment when attending the liturgy. In many churches the newly baptized (neophytes) wear albs during the Easter Vigil. Some churches even invite the neophytes to wear their albs throughout the entire Easter season.

The stole is the long scarf-like garment worn by the deacon, the priest, and the bishop. The deacon wears the stole on the left shoulder, while the priest and the bishop wear it over both shoulders. Over the stole, priests and bishops wear a chasuble, the long garment worn for the celebration of the Eucharist. On occasion, they will wear a cope (sort of like a cape) for the beginning of a solemn Eucharist such as on Palm Sunday or for the celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours. In addition, typical liturgical garb for the bishop includes the crozier (staff), the miter (bishop's hat), and the pectoral cross.

The colors of the vestments relate to the liturgical season or feast. There are four basic colors: **green for Ordinary Time**; **violet for Advent and Lent**; **white/gold for Christmas, Easter, and certain solemnities and feasts**; **red for Pentecost, Passion Sunday, Good Friday, and feasts of martyrs**. In addition, rose may be used on the Third Sunday of Advent and Fourth Sunday of Lent while black may be used for funerals. The color blue, which is increasingly more popular for Advent, is not an official liturgical color. But then again, this is a detail only liturgists lose sleep over.

Footnote: To those of you who prefer the priest wear purple on days when the Vikings play, I say: advise them to play during Advent or Lent.

NEGOCIACIONES DE TU PAZ

"Porque Cristo es nuestra paz; Él ha unido a los dos pueblos en uno solo, derribando el muro de enemistad que los separaba" (Efesios 2:14).

Miqueas profetizó que el Mesías no solo sería pacífico o haría la paz, sino que Él sería la Paz (Mi 5:4). Jesús es el cumplimiento de la profecía de Miqueas, porque cuando Jesús nació, los ángeles cantaron: "Paz en la tierra" (Lc 2:14). Está claro que Jesús es la paz. ¿Pero es Él tu paz? Para que esto sea así, debemos seguir a Jesús haciendo la paz por medio de la sangre de la cruz (Col 1:20). Para que Jesús sea nuestra Paz, debemos aceptar a Jesús como nuestra Paz, perdonando, amando y reconciliándonos con todos, incluyendo a nuestros enemigos. Hacemos de Jesús nuestra paz en la cruz. Toma la cruz de la paz, tu paz.
