MORE OF GOD

"We are at peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ."

—Romans 5:1

Most people know there is a God. Some people even experience that God is present, loving, and/or personal. Others only sense God as a force. Those people who are aware of God as a person know they can reject God by sinning. They sometimes know when they're not at peace with God. Then they feel a need to get right with God, to be justified (Rm 5:1). Few people experience much more of God than this, but there is much, much more of God. Jesus said to His disciples: "I have much more to tell you" (Jn 16:12). God is Trinity, three Persons in one God. God is a family. God has become a man. This God-made-Man is Jesus (see Jn 1:14), Who is fully God and fully Man. There is so much more to God than our experiences. The holiest saints who have ever lived have only just begun to know God. "Eye has not seen, ear has not heard, nor has it so much as dawned on man what God has prepared for those who love Him" (1 Cor 2:9).

On this Trinity Sunday, may we experience in a new way the fear of the Lord which is the beginning of wisdom (Ps 111:10). May we devote all our energies to developing as deep a personal relationship with the Trinity as possible. May we let the Spirit guide us to all truth about the Trinity (Jn 16:13).

REFLECTIONS

WHAT'S THE SMOKE FOR?

Dear Johan,

I was offended by the fact that we prayed for people with AIDS at Mass today. Apparently it was World AIDS Day.

What is that? A day to honor people with AIDS? Why should that be mentioned in church?

Gentle Reader,

Just recently I attended daily Eucharist in our parish. I like daily Eucharist for its simplicity, which may come as a surprise to those who know my proclivity for more elaborate liturgies. My peaceful state of mind was quickly dashed as I witnessed the battle of prayers that ensued when the priest opened the intercessions for individual intentions. After the customary yet baffling series of "special intentions," we were subjected to several prayers that resembled political statements more so than prayers. Moreover, they seemed to be occasioned by one another and intended to cancel out the preceding intercession. I will refrain from giving an example but I suspect you have experienced what I am talking about.

I wonder if your somewhat polemical question was occasioned by such a prayer that you thought political and deemed inappropriate because it was related to AIDS. I hope and pray you resisted the temptation to offer a counter-prayer. Surely, you loved Pope John Paul II. Did you know that on his apostolic visits throughout the world he made a point of stopping by hospices for HIV-AIDS patients? And did you know that he not only prayed for people with AIDS but also prayed with them?

At his midday Angelus address on November 30, 2003, the day before World AIDS Day, John Paul II said the following: "I pray for those struck by this plague, and I encourage all those in the Church who provide a priceless service of welcome, care, and spiritual accompaniment to these brothers and sisters of ours."

These are the words of a true Christian. These are the words of a saint. These are the words of Christ. Let's follow Pope John Paul and now Pope Francis as they show us how to be Christ to the world and live out the call for radical hospitality for all, free of all judgment and condescension.

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DON'T FEED THE PHISH!! - EMAIL AND TEXTING SCAM ON THE RISE

The Diocese has received multiple reports from parishioners receiving scam emails from an imposter who creates an email address using the pastor's name and then sends a phony email asking for money in the form of gift cards. The scam has recently evolved, and parishioners are now receiving text messages from the imposter/scammer using the pastor's name and a local telephone number.

Typically, the scam is initiated when the parishioner receives a casual email or text message from the imposter with a subject like, "Many Blessings." The body of the email is written something like, "Good morning, how are you doing?" "I need a favor from you, email me as soon as you get this message." Then the email is signed using the pastor's name.

Unbeknownst to the recipient, he or she replies to an address that is not the pastor's, but an imposter's email address. This type of social engineered attack is commonly referred to as Phishing or CEO Fraud (the latter because the imposter uses the name of a person you trust or have a close relationship and plays on a sense of urgency). The next email usually asks the parishioner to buy gift cards and to transmit the photo of the gift cards with the numbers revealed to the imposter.

What is Phishing? Phishing is an email or text message that will attempt to trick the recipient into doing something s/he wouldn't normally do (in this case emailing or texting the image of gift cards) because the request seems urgent, yet simple (like sending money, a bank or credit card number, or your email and network credentials). Close examination of the sender's email address will reveal that the address is not a legitimate email address for the actual person (like the pastor). But, it could be easily overlooked because the imposter will create an email address similar to the pastor's (e.g. FrJoe@gmail.com and use FrJoe@aol.com) that incorporates the pastor's name.

DON'T FEED THE PHISH REMEMBER: A pastor or clergy member will never ask for gift cards electronically via email or text message!!

Hoy celebramos a la Santísima Trinidad, uno de los misterios más confusos de nuestra fe. Por medio de este misterio, experimentamos nuestra relación con Dios: Creador, Salvador y Santificador. Esta relación no es fácil de entender o describir. No se hace más clara por el análisis. Su complejidad refleja la complejidad de todas nuestras relaciones. Entendemos nuestras relaciones con nuestra esposa, nuestros hijos, nuestros padres y nuestros amigos solamente en el día a día, ritos anuales y esos momentos que cambian la vida que compartimos. Entendemos nuestras relaciones al vivir con ellas. Las relaciones que tenemos con los que amamos y con quienes nos aman, nos sustentan por medio de una vida incierta y difícil. Esta es la Santísima Trinidad.

Lo que es sorprendente de las lecturas de hoy es que cada una está incompleta. Lo que ellas ofrecen es una descripción de un momento de nuestra relación, una memoria de un tiempo y un evento donde nuestra relación tiene sentido, aunque ese sentido pueda estar más allá de nuestra habilidad para describirla completamente. Frecuentemente eso es todo lo ofrece nuestra fe, es decir, una memoria de lo que es posible, lo que se promete lo que se ha dado. Una memoria de eternidad, de amor, más allá del entendimiento, debe ser apreciada y nutrita incluso si no es completamente comprendida. Esta es la Santísima Trinidad.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En 1910, cuatro años antes de iniciar el día de las madres, el pueblo de los Estados Unidos empezó a celebrar ocasionalmente un día para los padres de familia. Pero, no fue hasta 1972 que se fijó un día oficial para el papá. Poco a poco esta fecha del segundo domingo de junio se ha ido expandiendo al resto del mundo con algunas excepciones. En Italia por ejemplo, la fiesta del padre se celebra el 19 de marzo, día de san José.

Durante la Revolución Industrial del siglo diecinueve, José, esposo de María recibió su primera fiesta oficial. La Iglesia, preocupada por el ingreso del padre a las fábricas, propuso a este santo varón como ejemplo de lo que los padres deben ser en la vida de sus hijos e hijas; ejemplos de fe, ternura y trabajo. Aún en nuestro tiempo, el Rito del Bautismo de Niños insiste que el padre, junto con la madre, deben ser los mayores maestros de sus hijos. Al igual que José, el papá debe cuidar y proteger a su familia, enseñarle a los niños a trabajar y ser honestos para el bien de la familia y la sociedad.

LA ÚNICA VIDA DIGNA DE VIVIR

"Al contrario, siempre nos comportamos como corresponde a ministros de Dios" (2 Corintios 6:4).

Espero que, al tomar la decisión más importante de sus vidas, se hayan decidido por seguir a Jesús y trabajar para Él a tiempo completo. Si eres plomero, recogedor de basura, profesor, electricista, ama de casa y estás sirviendo a Jesús a tiempo completo, tu vida es realmente valiosa, llena de desafíos e indescriptible gozo. Vives "como corresponde a ministros de Dios, "con una gran constancia: en las tribulaciones, en las adversidades, en las angustias, al soportar los golpes, en la cárcel, en las revueltas, en las fatigas, en la falta de sueño, en el hambre" (2 Co 6:4-5). Por el poder del Espíritu Santo, actúas "con integridad, con inteligencia, con paciencia" (2 Co 6:6); con "armas ofensivas y defensivas de la justicia" (2 Co 6:7) y eres un privilegiado por ser una amenaza para el diablo.

En Jesús, experimentas un cambio tan radical que tu vida trasciende las categorías convencionales. Al negarte a ti mismo, te llenas de vida (ver 2 Co 6:9). Estás siempre alegre en el Señor (Fil 4:4) aunque al mismo tiempo triste por los frecuentes sufrimientos (ver 2 Co 6:10). Promesa: "Ustedes han oído que se dijo: 'Ojo por ojo y diente por diente'. Pero Yo les digo que no hagan frente al que les hace mal: al contrario, si alguien te da una bofetada en la mejilla derecha, preséntale también la otra" (Mt 5:38-39).

Alabanza: Al morir su esposa, Guillermo siguió el llamado de Dios y se ordenó sacerdote.

MÁS DE DIOS

"Estamos en paz con Dios, por medio de nuestro Señor Jesucristo" (Romanos 5:1).

La mayoría de la gente sabe que hay un Dios. Algunas personas incluso experimentan que Dios está presente, amando y / o en persona. Otros solo perciben a Dios como una fuerza. Aquellas personas que son conscientes de Dios como una persona saben que pueden rechazar a Dios pecando. A veces saben cuando no están en paz con Dios.
