THE CHOSEN REMNANT - Zephaniah is one of the least-known of the Old Testament prophets. He speaks in today's first reading of impending judgment. But the Lord will leave a "remnant" in Israel. This image of a remnant, or remainder, was to become vital to both Judaism and Christianity.

Paul's letter to Corinth makes obvious his deep concern for the Christians there. They are too self-confident, he says, too sure of themselves. He admonishes them to remember that Christ has given them all they have.

Today's Gospel comprises the opening of Jesus' "Great Sermon." As God gave Moses the law on Sinai, so now Jesus gathers his disciples on a hillside to teach them the new law. Each of these Beatitudes contrasts the humiliation of the present with the glory of the future: poverty vs. the riches of God's kingdom, hunger for holiness vs. fulfillment in the Spirit, persecution vs. the reign of God. 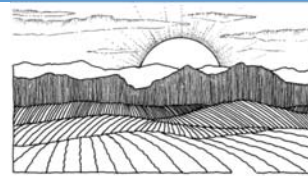

JESUS: THE BEATITUDE

Jesus "began to teach them: 'How blest...' " —Matthew 5:2-3

The eight Beatitudes go together. For example, we will never be poor in spirit, that is, voluntarily live below our means, unless we have mourned for our sins, have the strength of meekness, and are seeking first God's kingdom and righteousness (see Mt 6:33). Yet if we hunger and thirst for righteousness, we will certainly be persecuted (see 2 Tm 3:12). However, only those committed to the Lord and repentant of sin, that is, those who are clean of heart, will accept the privilege of being persecuted. The clean of heart mourn for their sins and hunger and thirst for righteousness. The eight Beatitudes are eight ways of looking at one thing.

The basic Beatitude is: "Blessed are the disciples of Jesus, who live to imitate Him." Blessedness is found by living in and for Jesus. The main thing about the Beatitudes is that they are revealed to us by Jesus and are revelations of Jesus' character. Jesus is the only name by which we can be saved and ultimately blessed (see Acts 4:12). Jesus is our only Way, Truth, and Life (Jn 14:6). God has made Jesus "our Wisdom and also our Justice, our Sanctification, and our Redemption" (1 Cor 1:30). Jesus is our Love, Hope, Joy, Lord, Savior, and God. Blessed are those living in Jesus.

Prayer: Father, send the Holy Spirit so that I will love Jesus much more deeply.

Promise: "Seek the Lord, all you humble of the earth, who have observed His law; seek justice, seek humility." —Zep 2:3

Praise: All praise to You, Jesus, our Savior, risen Lamb of God. You are the King of kings and Lord of lords. Alleluia!

RECEIVING FORGIVENESS

There are two sides to forgiveness: giving and receiving. Saint Blaise is invoked for protection against injuries and illnesses of the throat.

It is a Catholic tradition that on his feast, February 3, the blessing of St. Blaise is given with two candles. The two candles are held in a crossed position by a priest over the heads of the faithful or the people are touched on the throat with them. At the same time the following blessing is given: **"May Almighty God at the intercession of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, preserve you from infections of the throat and from all other afflictions"**. Then the priest makes the sign of the cross over the faithful.

JESÚS: LAS BEATTITUDES

"[Jesús] comenzó a enseñarles diciendo: 'Felices' (Mateo 5:2-3). Las ocho Bienaventuranzas van de la mano. Por ejemplo, nunca vamos a ser pobres en espíritu, es decir, vivir voluntariamente por debajo de nuestras posibilidades, a menos que nos hayamos arrepentido por nuestros pecados, tener la fuerza de la mansedumbre, y buscar el reino y la justicia de Dios en primer lugar (ver Mt 6:33). No obstante, si tenemos hambre y sed de justicia, sin duda seremos perseguidos (véase 2 Tim 3:12). Sin embargo, solo aquellos comprometidos con el Señor y arrepentidos del pecado, es decir, aquellos que son limpios de corazón, aceptarán el privilegio de ser perseguidos. Los limpios de corazón se lamentan por sus pecados, el hambre y sed de justicia. Las ocho Bienaventuranzas son ocho maneras de ver una cosa.

La Beatitud básica es: "Bienaventurados los discípulos de Jesús, que viven para imitarlo". La santidad se encuentra viviendo en y por Jesús. Lo principal de las Bienaventuranzas es que nos son reveladas por Jesús y son revelaciones del carácter de Jesús. Jesús es el único nombre por el cual podemos ser salvados y en última instancia bendecidos (ver Hch 4:12). Jesús es nuestro el único Camino, la Verdad y la Vida (Jn 14:6). Dios ha hecho a Jesús "nuestra sabiduría y justicia, en santificación y redención" (1 Co 1:30). Jesús es nuestro amor, esperanza, alegría, Señor, Salvador y Dios. Bienaventurados son los que viven en Jesús.
