**LET GO AND LET GOD** - Many twelve-step programs use the phrase “Let go and let God.” In all their simplicity, these five words are the heart of today’s readings. For people who struggle with addictive behavior, these words plainly remind us that we can’t manage, control, or manipulate certain areas of our lives. How many times can we look back in our lives and find evidence of some plan at work other than our own? These are the moments when, for whatever reasons, we let someone greater than ourselves work the plan. We probably didn’t even recognize at the time that we were letting go of anything, but in retrospect, we see God’s hand and loving presence. It is our awareness of these moments that gives us the courage and initiative to let go again later on. It is this courage and initiative that are highlighted in today’s readings. ### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In the mid-1960s, many religious congregations that had maintained a custom of assigning new names to their members allowed a return to baptismal names. The practice stems from the origins of monastic life, when a desire to flee the world and its enchantments caused a severe break with family life and commitments. A new name signified that the old person had died and a new one was coming to life. Some orders even spread funeral palls over their entrants and tolled the funeral bell. On a practical level, in a crowded monastery of a few hundred monks or nuns, it made sense not to have six Brother Alfrics or nine Sister Clares. The one name, one person rule worked well.

In more recent times, a young woman entering the convent might be given her parents' names as a way of honoring their generosity, so Hilda might become Sister Philip Margaret after her father and mother. A cherished name in the order might be bestowed on a newcomer so that there would always be a Brother Owen around, or a young person might adopt the name of a beloved saint. A handful of religious congregations, like Mother Barat's Religious of the Sacred Heart, always used family names. Many monasteries still bestow a new name at the end of probation. Other religious institutes have revived the custom of changing their candidates' names at the end of novitiate, although for the most part religious who were around at the time of the Council were happy to get their baptismal names back. A few, of course, cherished their acquired names and have held on to them, so convents still hold the creativity badge for naming. Where else today can you find great names today like Madeleva, Siena, and Celestina?

### JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY | OCTOBER 2, 2016 | TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



"How long, O LORD?" (Habakkuk 1:2). With Habakkuk's question echoing across twenty-six hundred years, Respect Life Sunday finds all life claiming sanctuary in our hearts: unborn infant, senior citizen, immigrant and refugee, imprisoned and addicted, people burdened with illness and disabilities of body, mind, or spirit. Even Mother Earth, Pope Francis notes in *Laudato Si'*, bears scars of disrespect for the life she nurtures and sustains. Life is still threatened, as in Habakkuk's day, with ruin and misery, "destruction and violence, . . . strife and clamorous discord" (see 1:3). Since our efforts so often seem ineffective, we "unprofitable servants" cry with the apostles, "Increase our faith" (Luke 17:10, 5). But Jesus' reply might be paraphrased, "Not quantity—quality." Next weekend marks the *Jubilee Year of Mercy's* special devotion to Mary, whose willingness to shelter Jesus in her womb and stand at the foot of his cross bears witness to the qualities that Jesus expects our faith to manifest: the willingness to trust, to risk, and to dare to speak up for life. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. ### QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK | TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

*Theme: Faith is the anchor and force of life.*

**Breaking Open the Word** - Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's 2nd Reading

**Step One: Listen to the Word:** As you hear the words of St. Paul proclaimed in this reading, what strikes you most? What word or phrase caught your ear?

**Step Two: Look into Your Life:** QUESTION FOR CHILDREN: Jesus teaches us that our faith is powerful and with it, we can do great things. We can forgive, love, and share with others. Which of these do you do most often? QUESTION FOR YOUTH: The Gospel tells us even a little bit of faith is enough to make amazing things happen. How are you keeping your faith alive and growing? What good things happen in your life because of your faith? QUESTION FOR ADULTS: Being "in Christ" means living as Christ teaches. What signs do you see in your life of generosity, forgiveness, hospitality, or any other of Jesus' teachings?

#### FAITH, NOT PESSIMISM

**"Increase our faith." —Luke 17:5**

When Habakkuk prayed, he cried out, "Violence!" (Hab 1:2) He described his situation as "ruin," "misery," "destruction," "strife," and "clamorous discord" (Hab 1:3). He begged God to intervene (Hab 1:2), but God didn't seem to do anything.

We live in times which fit Habakkuk's description. We live in the most violent and murderous of times for several reasons. One major reason is the mass murders occurring through abortions. We tend to feel depressed and hopeless. However, the Lord calls this a "rash" response to the violence and evil in our society (see Hab 2:4). Rather, our response should be one of faith (Hab 2:4). If we have faith the size of a mustard seed, we can uproot the violence and death entrenched in our society (Lk 17:6).

Pope St. John Paul II taught: "If we look at today's world, we are struck by many negative factors that can lead to pessimism. But this feeling is unjustified: we have faith in God our Father and Lord, in His goodness and mercy" (Mission of the Redeemer, 86). Therefore, despite violence and sin, don't be pessimistic, but have even greater faith. Walk by faith, not sight (2 Cor 5:7).

**Prayer:** Father, may my faith become stronger, especially when conditions become worse.

**Promise:** "I remind you to stir into flame the gift of God bestowed when my hands were laid on you. The Spirit God has given us is no cowardly spirit, but rather One that makes us strong, loving, and wise." —2 Tm 1:6-7

**Praise:** Alleluia! "Death is swallowed up in victory. O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" (1 Cor 15:54-55) Jesus is risen! Alleluia!

## FE, NO PESIMISMO

"Aumenta nuestra fe" (Lucas 17, 5).

Cuando Habacuc oró, clamó "¡Violencia!" (Hab 1, 2) Él describió su situación como "iniquidad", "opresión", "saqueo", "violencia", y "aumento de la discordia" (Hab 1, 3). Él rogó a Dios que interviniera (Hab 1, 2), pero no parecía que Dios le hiciera mucho caso.

Vivimos en una época que se parece a la descripción de Habacuc. Vivimos en los tiempos violentísimos y asesinos por varias razones. Un hecho evidente es que se dan asesinatos en masa por medio de los abortos. Tenemos la tendencia a sentirnos deprimidos y sin esperanza. Sin embargo, el Señor llama a esto una respuesta "precipitada" a la violencia y el mal en nuestra sociedad (ver Hab 2, 4). Por el contrario, nuestra respuesta debe ser una de fe (Hab 2, 4). Si tenemos una fe del tamaño de un grano de mostaza, podremos erradicar la violencia y la muerte arraigada en nuestra sociedad (Lc 17, 6).

El Papa san Juan Pablo II enseñó: "Si nos fijamos en el mundo de hoy, nos llaman la atención muchos factores negativos que pueden llevarnos al pesimismo. Pero esto es un sentimiento injustificado: tengamos fe en Dios nuestro Padre y Señor, en su bondad y misericordia" (Misión del Redentor, 86). Por lo tanto, a pesar de la violencia y el pecado, no seamos pesimistas, sino tengamos aun mayor fe. Caminemos por fe, no por la vista (2 Co 5, 7).

**Oración:** Padre, que mi fe sea más fuerte, especialmente cuando las condiciones empeoren.

**Promesa:** "Por eso te recomiendo que reavives el don de Dios que has recibido por la imposición de mis manos. Porque el Espíritu que Dios nos ha dado no es un espíritu de temor, sino de fortaleza, de amor y de sobriedad" (2 Tim 1, 6-7).

**Alabanza:** ¡Aleluya! "La muerte ha sido vencida. Oh muerte, ¿dónde está tu victoria? O la muerte, ¿dónde está tu aguijón?" (1 Co 15, 54-55) ¡Jesús ha resucitado! ¡Aleluya!
