SPIRITUAL DRYNESS | *Henri Nouwen Society*

Sometimes we experience a terrible dryness in our spiritual life. We feel no desire to pray, don't experience God's presence, get bored with worship services, and even think that everything we ever believed about God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit is little more than a childhood fairy tale. Then it is important to realize that most of these feelings and thoughts are just feelings and thoughts, and that the Spirit of God dwells beyond our feelings and thoughts. It often means that God is calling us to a greater faithfulness. It is precisely in times of spiritual dryness that we must hold on to our spiritual discipline so that we can grow into new intimacy with God.

TWO KINDS OF LONELINESS | *Henri Nouwen Society*

In the spiritual life we have to make a distinction between two kinds of loneliness. In the first loneliness, we are out of touch with God and experience ourselves as anxiously looking for someone or something that can give us a sense of belonging, intimacy, and home. The second loneliness comes from an intimacy with God that is deeper and greater than our feelings and thoughts can capture. We might think of these two kinds of loneliness as two forms of blindness. The first blindness comes from the absence of light, the second from too much light. The first loneliness we must try to outgrow with faith and hope. The second we must be willing to embrace in love.

JESUS' LONELINESS | *Henri Nouwen Society*

When Jesus came close to his death, he no longer could experience God's presence. He cried out: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:47). Still in love he held on to the truth that God was with him and said: "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit" (Luke 23:46).

The loneliness of the cross led Jesus to the resurrection. As we grow older we are often invited by Jesus to follow him into this loneliness, the loneliness in which God is too close to be experienced by our limited hearts and minds. When this happens, let us pray for the grace to surrender our spirits to God as Jesus did.

PUTTING OUR TEMPERAMENTS IN THE SERVICE OF GOD | *Henri Nouwen Society*

Our temperaments - whether flamboyant, phlegmatic, introverted, or extroverted - are quite permanent fixtures of our personalities. Still, the way we "use" our temperaments on a daily basis can vary greatly. When we are attentive to the Spirit of God within us, we will gradually learn to put our temperaments in the service of a virtuous life. Then flamboyancy gives great zeal for the Kingdom, phlegmatism helps to keep an even keel in times of crisis, introversion deepens the contemplative side, and extroversion encourages creative ministry.

BOMBS AWAY

"A surging stream of fire flowed out from where He sat." —Daniel 7:10

When Jesus was transfigured, "from the cloud came a voice which said, 'This is My Son, My Chosen One. Listen to Him'" (Lk 9:35). However, the apostles did not listen to Jesus, especially regarding His death on the cross and His Resurrection. Even after Jesus died and rose, they didn't listen to Him. Jesus knew this would happen. He concluded one of His parables with the statement: "If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, they will not be convinced even if one should rise from the dead" (Lk 16:31). Finally, after Jesus' Ascension, the apostles listened to Jesus a little bit by remaining in Jerusalem until they were baptized with the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:4-5). At this first Christian Pentecost, they received the power of the Spirit (Acts 1:8). A spiritual bomb exploded. Their hardness of heart and hardness of hearing were melted. From this point on, the apostles listened to Jesus.

On this day, we sorrowfully remember the atomic bombing of Hiroshima. Similarly, Jesus' Transfiguration was a beginning of bringing together a "critical mass" of spiritually explosive material. This bomb exploded at Pentecost. The bomb of Pentecost causes us to listen to Jesus. Other bombs cause us to hold our hands over our ears (see Acts 7:57) and not listen. Choose your bomb.

Prayer: Father, throughout this year, explode the bomb of Pentecost.

Promise: "We possess the prophetic message as something altogether reliable. Keep your attention closely fixed on it, as you would on a lamp shining in a dark place until the first streaks of dawn appear and the Morning Star rises in your hearts." —2 Pt 1:19

Praise: Praise Jesus, transfigured in glory, the "Light of the world" (Jn 8:12), shining in radiant splendor.

THE REAL PRESENCE OF JESUS CHRIST IN THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST: BASIC QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

What are appropriate signs of reverence with respect to the Body and Blood of Christ?

The Body and Blood of Christ present under the appearances of bread and wine are treated with the greatest reverence both during and after the celebration of the Eucharist (cf. Mysterium Fidei, nos. 56-61). For example, the tabernacle in which the consecrated bread is reserved is placed "in some part of the church or oratory which is distinguished, conspicuous, beautifully decorated, and suitable for prayer" (Code of Canon Law, Can. 938, §2). According to the tradition of the Latin Church, one should genuflect in the presence of the tabernacle containing the reserved sacrament. In the Eastern Catholic Churches, the traditional practice is to make the sign of the cross and to bow profoundly. The liturgical gestures from both traditions reflect reverence, respect, and adoration. It is appropriate for the members of the assembly to greet each other in the gathering space of the church (that is, the vestibule or narthex), but it is not appropriate to speak in loud or boisterous tones in the body of the church (that is, the nave) because of the presence of Christ in the tabernacle. Also, the Church requires everyone to fast before receiving the Body and Blood of Christ as a sign of reverence and recollection (unless illness prevents one from doing so). In the Latin Church, one must generally fast for at least one hour; members of Eastern Catholic Churches must follow the practice established by their own Church.

If someone without faith eats and drinks the consecrated bread and wine, does he or she still receive the Body and Blood of Christ?

If "to receive" means "to consume," the answer is yes, for what the person consumes is the Body and Blood of Christ. If "to receive" means "to accept the Body and Blood of Christ knowingly and willingly as what they are, so as to obtain the spiritual benefit," then the answer is no. A lack of faith on the part of the person eating and drinking the Body and Blood of Christ cannot change what these are, but it does prevent the person from obtaining the spiritual benefit, which is communion with Christ. Such reception of Christ's Body and Blood would be in vain and, if done knowingly, would be sacrilegious (1 Cor 11:29). Reception of the Blessed Sacrament is not an automatic remedy. If we do not desire communion with Christ, God does not force this upon us. Rather, we must by faith accept God's offer of communion in Christ and in the Holy Spirit, and cooperate with God's grace in order to have our hearts and minds transformed and our faith and love of God increased.

TESTIGOS — Hoy, la fiesta de la Transfiguración del Señor, es día de testimonios de testigo ocular. El primero, una visión que el profeta Daniel reporta, era muy conocido por Jesús y sus apóstoles. Es una poderosa y memorable visión del cielo. Tiene llamaradas de fuego, ruedas encendidas, el sabio anciano y el Hijo del Hombre. Es claro que Daniel vio algo. Pero, ¿fue un sueño? ¿Fue algo real? ¿O fue solamente un mito astuto?

¡Pedro no quiere que su visión sea confundida de igual manera! Nos cuenta el Evangelio de san Marcos lo que él y sus amigos Santiago y Juan vieron cuando subieron un día a la montaña con Jesús. Jesús les ordenó a los tres testigos que no dijeran nada hasta que “el Hijo del Hombre resucitara de entre los muertos” (Marcos 9:9). Por si los lectores del Evangelio dan por descontada la historia o simplemente la descartan como un mito piadoso, Pedro escribe su propia versión de la Transfiguración de Jesús en su segunda carta a la Iglesia. Escribe con autoridad, como testigo ocular. Reporta este mensaje de Dios referente a Jesús: “Este es mi Hijo muy querido, al que miro con cariño”, y nos asegura que el mensaje es digno de “creer(se) firmemente”. *Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.*

LA PRESENCIA REAL DE JESUCRISTO EN EL SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCHARÍSTIA PREGUNTAS BÁSICAS Y RESPUESTAS

CONTINUACIÓN...

¿Qué señales de reverencia son apropiadas con respecto al Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo?

El Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo presentes bajo la apariencia de pan y vino son tratados con la mayor de las reverencias tanto durante como después de la celebración de la Eucaristía (cf. Mysterium Fidei, nos. 56-61). Por ejemplo, el sagrario en que se reserva el pan consagrado debe estar situado "en una parte de la iglesia u oratorio verdaderamente noble, destacada, convenientemente adornada y apropiada para la oración" (Código de Derecho Canónico, can. 938, §2).

- Según la tradición de la Iglesia Latina, se debe doblar la rodilla en presencia del sagrario que contiene el sacramento reservado. En las Iglesias Católicas Orientales, la práctica tradicional es **hacer la señal de la cruz e inclinarse profundamente**. En ambas tradiciones, los ademanes litúrgicos expresan reverencia, respeto y adoración.
- Es apropiado que los miembros de la asamblea se saluden en el área de recepción de la iglesia (es decir, en el vestíbulo o narthex), pero **no es apropiado hablar en voz alta o tono bullicioso en el cuerpo de la iglesia** (decir es, en la nave), debido a la presencia de Cristo en el sagrario.

Además, la Iglesia requiere que todos **ayunen antes de recibir el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo**, como señal de reverencia y recolección (a menos que por enfermedad no se pueda hacerlo). BOMBAS FUERA

"Un río de fuego brotaba y corría delante de él" (Daniel 7,10).

Cuando Jesús se transfiguró, "desde la nube se oyó entonces una voz que decía: Este es mi Hijo, el Elegido, escúchenlo" (Lc 9,35). Sin embargo, los apóstoles no escucharon a Jesús, especialmente en relación con Su muerte en la cruz y Su resurrección. Incluso después de que Jesús murió y resucitó, ellos no lo escucharon. Jesús sabía que esto sucedería. Concluyó una de sus parábolas con la declaración: "si no escuchan a Moisés y a los Profetas, aunque resucite alguno de entre los muertos, tampoco se convencerán" (Lc 16, 31).

Después de la Ascensión de Jesús, los apóstoles permanecieron en Jerusalén y escucharon a Jesús y al fin fueron bautizados con el Espíritu Santo (Hch 1, 4-5). En este primer Día de Pentecostés cristiano, recibieron el poder del Espíritu Santo (Hch 1, 8). Una bomba espiritual explotó. Su dureza de corazón y su dureza de escuchar se combinaron. A partir de este momento, los apóstoles escucharon a Jesús. En este día, recordamos con tristeza el bombardeo atómico de Hiroshima. Del mismo modo, la transfiguración de Jesús fue un comienzo para reunir una "masa crítica" de material espiritualmente explosivo. Esta bomba explotó en Pentecostés. La bomba de Pentecostés nos hace escuchar a Jesús. Otras bombas hacen que pongamos las manos sobre nuestros oídos (ver Hch 7, 57) y no escuchar. Escoge tu bomba.

Oración: Padre, que durante este año, explote la bomba de Pentecostés.

Promesa: Así hemos visto confirmada la palabra de los profetas, y ustedes hacen bien en prestar atención a ella, como a una lámpara que brilla en un lugar oscuro hasta que despuente el día y aparezca el lucero de la mañana en sus corazones" (2 Pe 1, 19).

Alabanza: Alabado sea Jesús, transfigurado en la gloria, la "luz del mundo" (Jn 8, 12), que brilla en radiante esplendor.
