

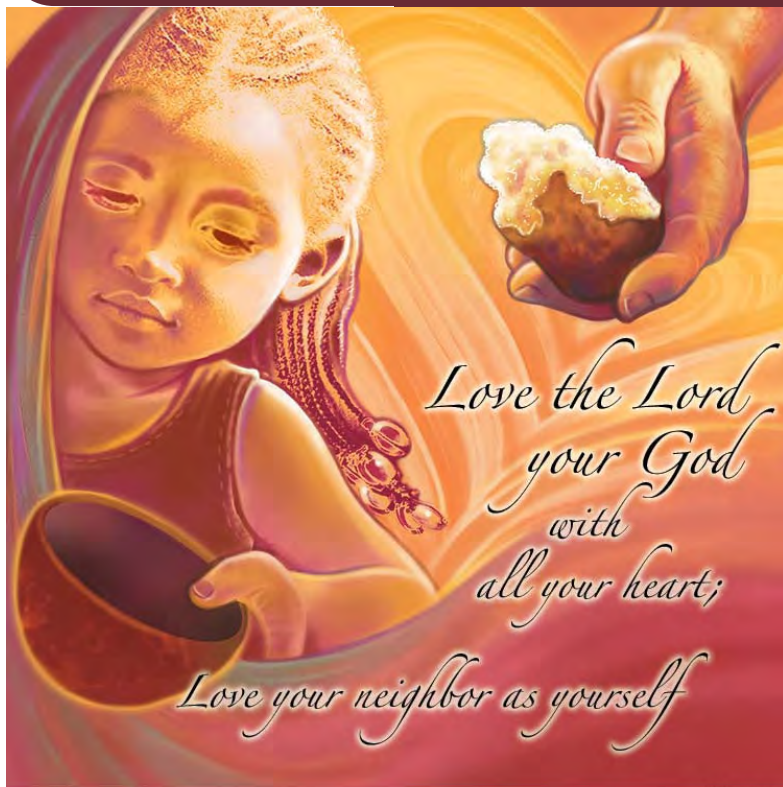

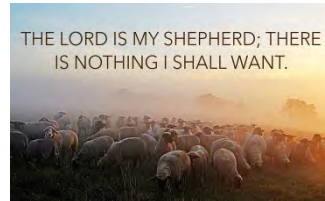

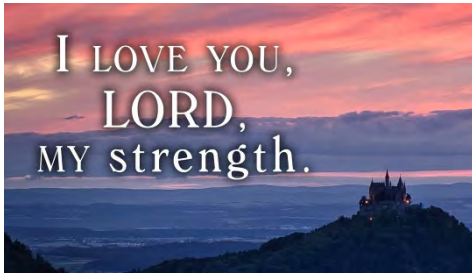

LABOURÉ TO THE RESCUE STUDENT DEBT? NO PROBLEM

What if a young Catholic feels called, but has too much student debt to enter the seminary or convent? It's a serious problem that has put the brakes on many vocations. A young woman with \$50k in student loans simply can't expect a religious order to assume her debt.

Fortunately, there's a solution. The Labouré Society is responsible for rescuing hundreds of vocations, helping young men and women who otherwise could not have pursued God's call.

Labouré doesn't simply pay off student loans. Instead, they organize young people into "classes" and train them how to fundraise as a group. Depending on the level of debt, it can take six months to a couple of years of fundraising. Graduates of the program say it didn't just help them enter formation; it solidified their call and taught valuable lessons about working within the Church with all kinds of people.

If a young man gives seminary a try and later decides to "discern out," the donations he received go to other candidates, which satisfies both the donors and the IRS. To learn more or make a donation, visit rescuevocations.org.



180-DAY DISCERNMENT CHALLENGE

"As I worked with young men, I began to see that they needed more structure in their lives, especially while they're seeking to know their vocations," said Fr. Greg Gerhart, the Vocation Director for the Diocese of Austin. To help men on their journey, Fr. Greg created Discernment 180, a "rule of life" for six months of deep discernment, with daily readings and specific spiritual practices. "It's already borne incredible fruit in our diocese," he said. "Three of our new seminarians completed D180 before entering." Now the program is free for anyone to use at discernment180.com



U.S. SEMINARIES

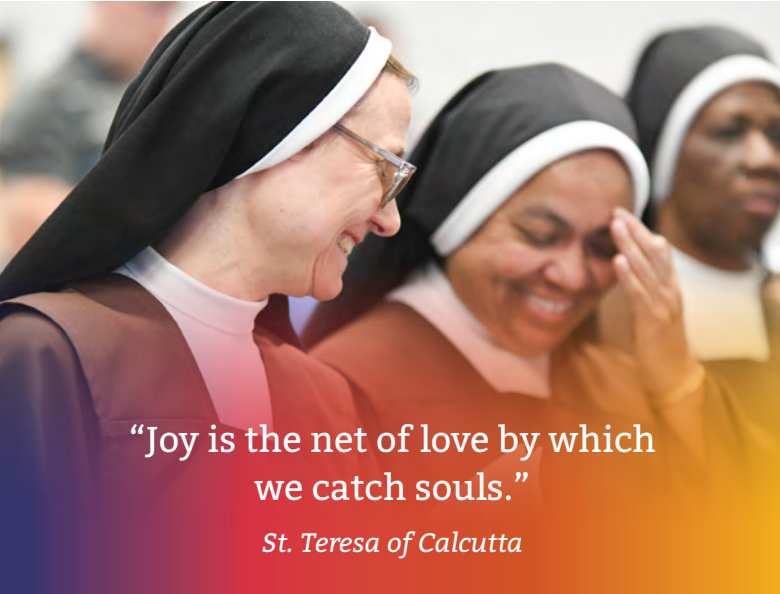
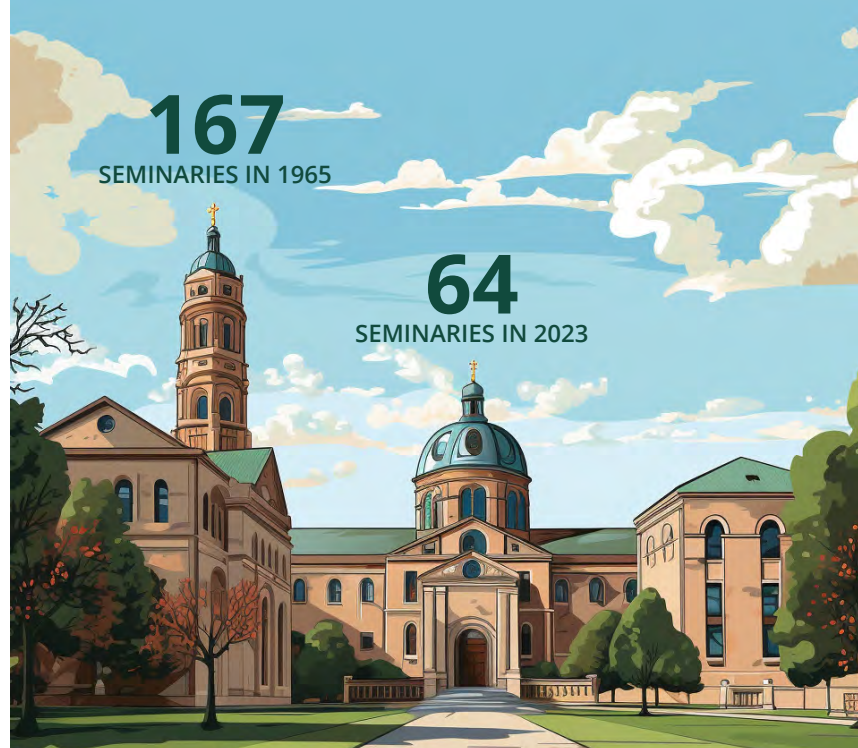
FEWER BUT STRONGER

We sometimes hear that seminaries in the U.S. are nearly full, which is true of many—but mainly because we have a hundred fewer seminaries than sixty years ago.

The Church envisions that in ideal circumstances, every diocese would have its own seminary. But fewer men in formation and scarce resources mean that most seminaries operate as regional institutions.

Ask any seminary rector, and he'll tell you that the scarcest resource is not money, but *personnel*—in particular, diocesan priests who are released by their bishops to leave parish ministry and serve in the seminary as spiritual directors.

Please pray for our men in formation and for the generous priests who serve as their mentors.

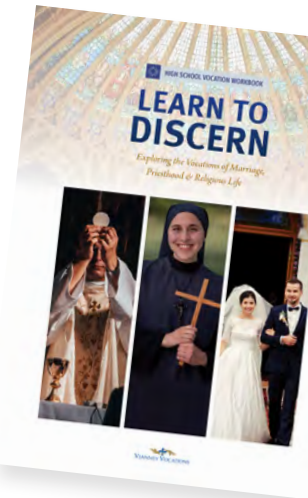

REFLEXIONES

AMAR EL AMOR | “Yo te amo, Señor, mi fuerza (Salmos 18:2).

Dios es Amor (1 Jn 4:8, 16). Porque Él es Amor, somos imagen del Amor, porque fuimos creados a Su imagen (Gn 1:27). Porque Él es Amor, nuestros pecados contra Él son muy graves, tan graves que la naturaleza de todos los seres humanos fue herida por el primer pecado. Porque Él es Amor, Dios nos dio la oportunidad de convertirnos en nuevas criaturas (ver Jn 3:3, 5; Gál 6:15) al darnos a Su Hijo (Jn 3:16). Porque Dios es Amor, se hizo hombre para morir en la cruz y resucitar de entre los muertos por nuestra salvación. El Amor se hizo carne (ver Jn 1:14). El Amor tenía clavos clavados a Él y espinas clavadas en Él. El Amor se convirtió en un desastre sangriento, brutalmente rechazado y sin aliento. El Amor fue enterrado; el Amor resucitó; y el Amor está entronizado en el cielo para siempre.

Porque el Amor nos amó primero, amamos al Amor (1 Jn 4:19). Por Su gracia, amamos el Amor con todo nuestro corazón, alma, mente y fuerzas (Lc 10:27; Mt 22:37). Amamos el Amor amándonos a nosotros mismos, a nuestro prójimo (Mt 22: 37-39), e incluso a nuestros enemigos (Mt 5:44). Vivimos en el Amor (Jn 15:10). Amar el AMOR.

Oración: Señor y Amor, que yo viva en Ti y Tú en mí (1 Jn 4:16).

Promesa: “Ellos mismos cuentan cómo ustedes me han recibido y cómo se convirtieron a Dios, abandonando los ídolos para servir al Dios vivo y verdadero, y esperar a Su Hijo, que vendrá desde el cielo: Jesús, a Quien él resucitó y que nos libra de la ira venidera” (1 Tes 1:9-10).

Alabanza: Alabado seas, Jesús resucitado. ¡Vives y reinas para siempre! Toda la Gloria te pertenece.

TRIGÉSIMO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

La regla del diamante

Lo que la primera lectura llama extranjeros son inmigrantes o recién llegados. Vivían entre los hebreos, pero ellos mismos no eran judíos. El Señor le recuerda a la gente que una vez ellos mismos fueron extranjeros.

No deberían cometer el mismo error que cometieron los egipcios cuando maltrataron a los israelitas. Dios usa la misma lógica al ordenarles que cuiden de las viudas y los huérfanos. Trátales como familia, o sus propias esposas e hijos estarán en la misma situación.

La razón de tal compasión debería ser más profunda que el miedo al castigo. Jesús dijo: “Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo” (Mateo 22,39). Llamó a esto el segundo mandamiento. La primera es amar a Dios total y completamente, corazón, mente y alma. Si el segundo mandamiento es la Regla de Oro, el primero podría llamarse la Regla del Diamante. Si lo piensas bien, para guardar el primer mandamiento, también tienes que guardar el segundo.

Jesús dijo que cualquier cosa que hagas por los pobres, los desamparados, los enfermos o los presos, lo haces por él (Mateo 25,31-46). Realmente no podemos decir que amamos a Dios si no amamos a las personas que Dios creó.

Eso nos da dos razones para amar al prójimo. Primero, porque Dios vive en otras personas, amar A Dios significa amarlo dondequiera que se encuentre. Segundo, Dios los ama, así que si vamos a ser santos, debemos ser como Dios. ¿Qué significa eso? ¿Te acuerdas del dicho “la caridad comienza en casa”? No termina ahí. Si verdaderamente amamos a Dios, extenderemos nuestra caridad a quienes están fuera de nuestros hogares. Es probable que la gente todavía esté reconstruyendo después de terremotos, tornados, inundaciones y otros desastres naturales, y cada ciudad tiene algún tipo de refugio para personas sin hogar. ¿Dices que amas a Dios? Veamos que amas al prójimo.

REFLEXIONES

LO QUE ES DE DIOS

Hay un versículo bíblico en mi calendario para el mes actual que dice: "Donde esté tu tesoro, allí estará también tu corazón" (Mateo 6:21). Los "tesoros" de la tierra eventualmente se desvanecen y desaparecen.

En el Evangelio de hoy, encontramos a los herodianos y fariseos unidos contra Cristo. El tesoro en este caso era una moneda y tenía la imagen de César. Aunque notoriamente estaban en desacuerdo, en este caso los herodianos y los fariseos tienen mucho en común: el amor por las cosas de este mundo. Sus prioridades son sus leyes y tradiciones, y dejan a un lado el amor por los que viven diferente a sus formas de ser.

Debo admitir que yo también muchas veces me distraigo. Nosotros mismos hemos sido creados a imagen y semejanza de Dios. No ha cambiado mucho en el mundo de hoy, donde nuestras prioridades a menudo se confunden. Como padres, nos concentramos en nuestra reputación en el lugar de trabajo o en el estado financiero, en lugar de pasar el tiempo con aquellos que Dios nos ha confiado. Cristo nos recuerda que los verdaderos discípulos no se encuentran pertenecientes a las cadenas del dinero y las posesiones, sino sólo a Dios.
