forever, has a priesthood that does not pass away. Therefore, he is always able to save those who approach God through him, since he lives forever to make intercession for them. It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints men subject to weakness to be high priests, but the word of the oath, which was taken after the law, appoints a son, who has been made perfect forever.

REFLECTIONS

THE BIBLE ON PRAYING FOR THE DEAD

“God tried them and found them worthy of Himself.”—Wisdom 3:5

According to the Bible, what happens to us when we die? The Bible seems to imply that some people immediately go to heaven after death. Jesus told the good thief: “This day you will be with Me in paradise” (Lk 23:43). It seems logical that some people also immediately go to hell, although nowhere in the Bible is this stated explicitly. The Bible does say: “It is appointed that men die once, and after death be judged” (Heb 9:27).

The Bible does indicate that some of the dead do not go immediately to heaven or hell. Judas Maccabeus provided “an expiatory sacrifice” for the soldiers who had died for the Jewish faith (2 Mc 12:43). It would be useless to make offerings for people in heaven or hell (see Lk 16:26), so these people must be on the way to heaven. We should pray for the dead as the Spirit leads.

Prayer: Father, may I pray for the dead as did the Christians of the New Testament.

“ALL IN THE FAMILY” | “But you, how can you sit in judgment on your brother? Or you, how can you look down on your brother?” —Romans 14:10

Have you heard the old joke: “When is a door not a door?” Answer: “When it is ‘ajar.’ ” All over the world today, people will ask a similar question: “When is a person not a person?” In many cases, the answer will be: “When they are a rapist, a murderer, a bum, a fetus, a nursing home patient, a homeless person, a prostitute, etc.”

In today’s Gospel parables, Jesus talks about a lost sheep and a lost silver piece. In both situations, it is obvious to all that the lost article still has worth and value. Moreover, the sheep and the coin are consistently referred to as “sheep” and “silver piece,” whether they are in a state of being lost or in their rightful place.

Luke follows today’s parables with the parable of the prodigal son (Lk 15:11-32). This time, a person is lost. Now that people are involved, there is suddenly a colossal identity crisis. It’s no longer obvious that the lost person has any worth. The younger son no longer sees himself as son, but as slave (Lk 15:18-19). The elder brother calls the lost person “his father’s son” (see Lk 15:30) rather than “my brother”; he also forgets his own identity and calls himself a slave rather than a son (Lk 15:29). Only the father sees the true relationships. He calls both boys “sons” (Lk 15:24, 31) and tells them that they are “brothers” (see Lk 15:32).

Jesus is telling us that just as a coin and a sheep do not cease being coins and sheep, so people are still God’s precious children no matter what their status. “Dearly beloved, we are God’s children now” (1 Jn 3:2).

Prayer: Abba, thank You for adopting me. I love being Your child, and I will love all of Your children (1 Jn 5:1).

Promise: “Both in life and in death we are the Lord’s.” —Rm 14:8

Praise: St. Charles was born into luxury and received a “trust fund.” But Charles heard God and asked his father to give most of the money to the poor.

GUNG-HO

“The owner then gave his devious employee credit for being enterprising! Why? Because the worldly take more initiative than the other-worldly when it comes to dealing with their own kind.” —Luke 16:8

The people of the world are usually charged up. They are in overdrive to make money and satisfy their carnal desires. It is nothing to work fifty, sixty, or more hours a week. They’ll stay up all night just to get a buzz.

Almost no sacrifice seems too great to get ahead or feel high.

Jesus says that we Christians should have that kind of initiative and drive — not motivated by carnal desires but by God’s love. If we spread the Good News with the fervor in which the world markets the bad news, what an evangelism-explosion would result! If we stayed up all night praying while the world was preying, what victory we would see! The Good News doesn’t look so good if not proclaimed with abandon.

Jesus said: “I have come to light a fire on the earth. How I wish the blaze were ignited! I have a baptism to receive. What anguish I feel till it is over!” (Lk 12:49-50) Let’s run out of the upper room. May our walk match our talk. We need a new Pentecost to conquer the world (1 Jn 5:5).

Prayer: Jesus, I’m sorry for not running down the street telling of You, Your crucified love, and Resurrection-power.

Promise: “I will not dare to speak of anything except what Christ has done through me to win the Gentiles to obedience by word and deed, with mighty signs and marvels, by the power of God’s Spirit.” —Rm 15:18-19

Praise: Sarah understood the meaning of unconditional love after her husband’s stroke.

SEGUNDA LECTURA | HEB 7, 23-28
