THE ULTIMATE RESURRECTION

"If the Spirit of Him Who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, then He Who raised Christ from the dead will bring your mortal bodies to life also, through His Spirit dwelling in you." —Romans 8:11

Ezekiel prophesied that God's people would have a spiritual resurrection, that is, repentance and conversion (Ez 37:12ff). Jesus gave Lazarus a physical resurrection (Jn 11:44). The Father and the Holy Spirit raised Jesus from the dead not only in spirit but also in body. Jesus' Resurrection was not for the resumption of His earthly life. In His Resurrection, He was lifted up and glorified (see Jn 12:32), sitting enthroned at the right hand of the Father forever (Heb 10:12). We who live and die in Christ will rise in Christ. Our resurrection will not be like that of Lazarus but like Jesus' Resurrection. "If the Spirit of Him Who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, then He Who raised Christ from the dead will bring your mortal bodies to life also" (Rm 8:11). Jesus "will give a new form to this lowly body of ours and remake it according to the pattern of His glorified body, by His power to subject everything to Himself" (Phil 3:21). If we open the door of our lives and let Jesus enter, Jesus promises us: "I will give the victor the right to sit with Me on My throne, as I Myself won the victory and took My seat beside My Father on His throne" (Rv 3:21). loving God, our brothers and sisters in Christ, our neighbors, and even our enemies, for "the man who hates his brother is in darkness. He walks in shadows, not knowing where he is going, since the dark has blinded his eyes" (1 Jn 2:11), In two weeks, we will celebrate the first day of the fifty-day Easter season. We will celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus and of those baptized into Him and living that Baptism. How glorious and amazing is our resurrection in the risen Christ!

Prayer: Father, give me an awe of You as I enter more deeply into the mystery of the Resurrection.

Promise: "Did I not assure you that if you believed you would see the glory of God displayed?" —Jn 11:40

Praise: Praise You, risen Jesus, glorified and reigning in glory. May Your name be praised forevermore!

THE VIRTUE OF FLEXIBILITY

Trees look strong compared with the wild reeds in the field. But when the storm comes the trees are uprooted, whereas the wild reeds, while moved back and forth by the wind, remain rooted and are standing up again when the storm has calmed down.

Flexibility is a great virtue. When we cling to our own positions and are not willing to let our hearts be moved back and forth a little by the ideas or actions of others, we may easily be broken. Being like wild reeds does not mean being wishy-washy. It means moving a little with the winds of the time while remaining solidly anchored in the ground. 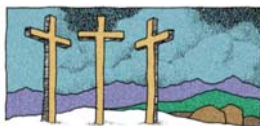

Greetings!

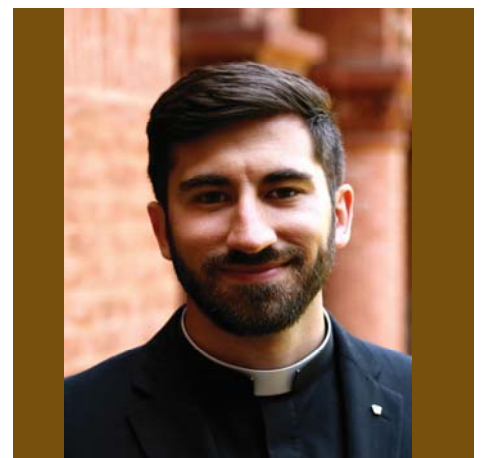

RESUMEN DEL MINISTERIO DE JESÚS — El relato de cómo Lázaro revivió de entre los muertos es el relato más largo (además de la Pasión) en el Evangelio según san Juan. En él encontramos un resumen de la mayor parte del ministerio de Jesús. Vemos su naturaleza humana cuando se conmueve con la tristeza de Marta y de María y cuando él mismo llora frente a la tumba de Lázaro. Es la sabiduría de la Palabra de Dios hecha carne cuando le explica a sus seguidores que la muerte de Lázaro servirá como una señal de la gloria de Dios. Corona los milagros que obra en el Evangelio según san Juan (que comenzó con el milagro más “humano” de hacer más vino en la boda de Caná) reviviendo a Lázaro de entre los muertos; un “avance”, por así decirlo, de su propia muerte y resurrección por venir. Este retrato de Jesús nos recuerda, mientras estamos cerca del fin de nuestro viaje de Cuaresma, que él está con nosotros, nos conoce, nos comprende en cada momento de nuestra vida. Conoce la alegría de nuestras celebraciones humanas, conoce la tristeza de nuestro llanto. Mientras nos preparamos para caminar con él en los días de Semana Santa, tenemos fe de que —por Cristo— la gloria de Dios estará con nosotros a cada momento de nuestra vida y —con Cristo— en nuestra vida eterna. *Copyright © J. LA ÚLTIMA RESURRECCIÓN

"Y si el Espíritu de aquel que resucitó a Jesús habita en ustedes, el que resucitó a Cristo Jesús también dará vida a sus cuerpos mortales, por medio del mismo Espíritu que habita en ustedes" (Romanos 8, 11).

Ezequiel profetizó que el pueblo de Dios viviría una resurrección espiritual, manifiesta por el arrepentimiento y la conversión (Ez 37, 12ss). Jesús restauró a Lázaro por medio de la resurrección física (Jn 11, 44). El Padre y el Espíritu Santo levantaron a Jesús de la muerte no solo espiritual sino también corporal. La Resurrección de Jesús no fue exclusivamente la renovación de Su vida terrenal. Al resucitar, Jesús fue levantado, glorificado (ver Jn 12, 32) y está sentado a la derecha del Padre Eterno (Heb 10, 12). Los que vivimos y morimos en Cristo seremos resucitados en Cristo. Pero nuestra resurrección no será como la de Lázaro sino como la Resurrección de Jesús. "Y si el Espíritu de Aquel que resucitó a Jesús habita en ustedes, el que resucitó a Cristo Jesús también dará vida a sus cuerpos mortales, por medio del mismo Espíritu que habita en ustedes" (Rom 8, 11). Jesús "transformará nuestro pobre cuerpo mortal, haciéndolo semejante a su cuerpo glorioso, con el poder que tiene para poner todas las cosas bajo su dominio" (Fil 3, 21). Si abrimos la puerta de nuestras vidas y dejamos que Jesús entre, Jesús nos promete que "al vencedor lo haré sentar conmigo en mi trono, así como yo he vencido y me he sentado con mi Padre en su trono" (Ap 3, 21).

Dentro de dos semanas, celebraremos el inicio de los cincuenta días de Pascua. Celebraremos la Resurrección de Jesús y de aquellos que fueron bautizados en Él y que viven el Bautismo. ¡Qué gloriosa y maravillosa es nuestra resurrección en Cristo resucitado!

Oración: Padre, me postro reverentemente ante Ti para profundizar en el misterio de la Resurrección.

Promesa: "¿No te he dicho que si crees, verás la gloria de Dios?" (Jn 11, 40)

Alabanza: Alabado seas, Jesús resucitado, glorificado y lleno de gloria. ¡Sea tu Nombre alabado por siempre!
