THE GOD OF LIFESTYLE

**"You cannot give yourself to God and money. I warn you, then: do not worry about your livelihood." —
Matthew 6:24-25**

It often seems that much of Western Christianity has sold its birthright for petty pleasures (see Gn 25:34) and has blinded itself by bowing down before the god of the present age, the god of lifestyle (2 Cor 4:4). Many of us who call ourselves Christians think we can seek the most comfortable lifestyle possible and still serve God. However, the Lord says that's impossible (Mt 6:24).

If we're set upon the things of the world, we're enemies of the cross (Phil 3:18-19). If we love what the world affords, the Father's love finds no place in us (1 Jn 2:15). The unbelievers are always concerned about what they are to eat, drink, or wear (Mt 6:31-32). Yet we have been chosen out of the world (Jn 15:19). We have been crucified to the world and the world to us (Gal 6:14). Because of our love for Jesus, we have come to rate all as loss and to consider it dung (Phil 3:8). We despise the world's petty pleasures and refuse to take Satan's bribes (see Lk 4:6-7). We have already devoted enough time to what the pagans enjoy (1 Pt 4:3). We must not spend what remains of our earthly lives "on human desires but on the will of God" (1 Pt 4:2).

Prayer: Father, may my lifestyle make no sense to someone who doesn't know You.

EL DIOS DEL ESTILO DE VIDA

"No se puede servir a Dios y al Dinero. Por eso les digo: No se inquieten por su vida" (Mateo 6, 24-25).

A menudo parece que gran parte del cristianismo occidental ha vendido su primogenitura por pequeños placeres (ver Gn 25, 34) y se ha cegado así mismo, al postrarse ante el dios de esta era, el dios del estilo de vida (2 Co 4, 4). Muchos de los que nos llamamos cristianos pensamos que podemos buscar la forma de vida más cómoda posible, y aún así servir a Dios. Sin embargo, el Señor dice que es imposible (Mt 6, 24).

Si nos ajustamos a las cosas del mundo, somos enemigos de la cruz (Fil 3, 18-19). Si amamos lo que ofrece el mundo, el amor del Padre no encuentra lugar en nosotros (1 Jn 2, 15). Los que no son creyentes siempre están preocupados por lo que van a comer, beber o vestir (Mt 6, 31-32). Sin embargo, hemos sido elegidos de entre el mundo (Jn 15, 19). Hemos sido crucificados al mundo y el mundo a nosotros (Gal 6, 14). Debido a nuestro amor por Jesús, hemos llegado a calificarlo todo como pérdida y a considerarlo como estiércol (Fil 3, 8). Nosotros despreciamos los pequeños placeres del mundo, y nos negamos a aceptar los sobornos de Satanás (ver Lc 4:6-7). Ya hemos dedicado bastante tiempo conforme al criterio de los paganos (1 Pe 4:3). No podemos dedicar lo que queda de nuestra vida terrenal "según los deseos humanos, sino según la voluntad de Dios" (1 Pe 4, 2).

Oración: Padre, que mi estilo de vida no solo tenga sentido para los que no Te conocen.

Promesa: "Mi salvación y mi gloria están en Dios: Él es mi Roca firme, en Dios está mi refugio" (Sal 62, 8).
