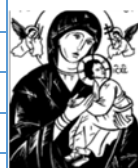

DYING WITH GRATEFUL HEARTS | Henri Nouwen Society

We often wonder how death will occur for us. Through illness, accident, war, or a natural disaster? Will our deaths happen suddenly or gradually? There are no answers for these questions, so we really should not spend time worrying about them. We don't know how our lives will end, and this is a blessed ignorance! But there is an important question that we should consider: When our time to die comes, will we die in such a way that those we leave behind are not devastated by grief or left with feelings of shame or guilt?

How we leave others depends largely on how we prepare ourselves for death. When we can die with grateful hearts, grateful to God and our families and friends, our deaths can become sources of life for others.

ARSONIST

Peter and John "upon arriving imposed hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit." —Acts 8:17

Near the end of Jesus' public ministry, Samaritans would not allow Jesus and His disciples to pass through their town because they were headed toward Jerusalem. St. John the Apostle was indignant. He asked Jesus for permission to call down fire from heaven to destroy those Samaritans (Lk 9:52-54). Jesus refused him, rebuking John on the spot (Lk 9:55).

Jesus did eventually allow John to call down fire from heaven onto the Samaritans. The deacon Philip had taken the gospel in power to the unbelieving Samaritans, and they received the Word of God (Acts 8:5ff).

"When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two...prayed that they might receive the Holy Spirit" (Acts 8:14, 15). John laid his hands on those whom he had earlier wished to incinerate, and the fire of God, the Holy Spirit, did fall upon them to consume them with the love of God (Acts 8:17). Jesus gave John his wish, but not in the way John had expected. John had to undergo a bigger conversion than the Samaritans did.

Are there any people you wouldn't mind having God remove from earth? Can you imagine Jesus eventually using you as His agent to bring these people into new life in the Spirit? If we are to love our enemies, we need that same gut-wrenching conversion John experienced. Repent! Forgive and love your enemies (Lk 6:35). "Receive the Holy Spirit" (Jn 20:22).

Prayer: Jesus, send the fire of the Holy Spirit to burn away the hardness in my heart. May I lead thousands to receive the Spirit.

Promise: "He who loves Me will be loved by My Father. I too will love him and reveal Myself to him." —Jn 14:21

Praise: Praise the risen Jesus, baptizing us in the Holy Spirit! (Mk 1:8)

Emptiness and fullness at first seem complete opposites. But in the spiritual life they are not. In the spiritual life we find the fulfillment of our deepest desires by becoming empty for God.

We must empty the cups of our lives completely to be able to receive the fullness of life from God. Jesus lived this on the cross. The moment of complete emptiness and complete fullness become the same. When he had given all away to his Abba, his dear Father, he cried out, "It is fulfilled" (John 19:30). He who was lifted up on the cross was also lifted into the resurrection. He who had emptied and humbled himself was raised up and "given the name above all other names" (see Philippians 2:7-9). Let us keep listening to Jesus' question: "Can you drink the cup that I am going to drink?" (Matthew 20:22).

Many people say, "I am not afraid of death, but I am afraid of dying." This is quite understandable, since dying often means illness, pain, dependency, and loneliness.

The fear of dying is nothing to be ashamed of. It is the most human of all human fears. Jesus himself entered into that fear. In his anguish "sweat fell to the ground like great drops of blood" (Luke 22:44). How must we deal with our fear of dying? Like Jesus we must pray that we may receive special strength to make the great passage to new life. Then we can trust that God will send us an angel to comfort us, as he sent an angel to

Jesus.

LA PRESENCIA REAL DE JESUCRISTO EN EL SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCARISTÍA PREGUNTAS BÁSICAS Y RESPUESTAS

Introducción

Jesús Nuestro Señor, la víspera de su pasión en la cruz, tomó una última cena con sus discípulos. Durante esta comida, nuestro Salvador instituyó el sacramento de su Cuerpo y su Sangre. Lo hizo a fin de perpetuar el sacrificio de la Cruz a través de los siglos y para encomendar a la Iglesia su Esposa el memorial de su muerte y resurrección. Como nos dice el Evangelio según S. Mateo:

Durante la cena, Jesús tomó un pan, y pronunciada la bendición, lo partió y lo dio a sus discípulos, diciendo: "Tomen y coman. Este es mi Cuerpo". Luego tomó en sus manos una copa de vino, y pronunciada la acción de gracias, la pasó a sus discípulos, diciendo: "Beban todos de ella, porque ésta es mi Sangre, Sangre de la nueva alianza, que será derramada por todos, para el perdón de los pecados". (Mt 26, 26-28; cf. Mc 14, 22-24, Lc 22, 17-20, 1 Co 11, 23-25).

Recordando estas palabras de Jesús, la Iglesia Católica profesa que en la celebración de la Eucaristía, el pan y el vino se convierten en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesucristo por el poder del Espíritu Santo y mediante el ministerio del sacerdote. Jesús dijo: "Yo soy el pan vivo que ha bajado del cielo; el que coma de este pan vivirá para siempre, y el pan que yo les voy a dar es mi carne para que el mundo tenga vida. . . . Mi carne es verdadera comida y mi sangre es verdadera bebida" (Jn 6, 51-55). Cristo entero está verdaderamente presente, cuerpo, sangre, alma y divinidad, bajo la apariencia de pan y vino: el Cristo glorificado que se levantó de entre los muertos después de morir por nuestros pecados. Esto es lo que quiere decir la Iglesia cuando habla de la "presencia real" de Cristo en la Eucaristía. Esta presencia de Cristo en la Eucaristía se denomina "real" sin excluir otros tipos de presencia como si no pudieran entenderse como reales (cf. Catecismo, no. 1374). Cristo resucitado está presente en su Iglesia de muchas maneras, pero muy especialmente a través del sacramento de su Cuerpo y su Sangre.

¿Qué significa que Jesucristo esté presente en la Eucaristía bajo la apariencia de pan y vino? ¿Cómo sucede esto? La presencia de Cristo resucitado en la Eucaristía es un misterio inagotable que la Iglesia nunca puede explicar cabalmente con palabras. Debemos recordar que el Dios trino es el creador de todo lo que existe y tiene el poder de hacer más de lo que nos es posible imaginar. Como dijo S. Ambrosio: "*Si la palabra del Señor Jesús es tan poderosa como para crear cosas que no existían, entonces con mayor razón las cosas que ya existen pueden ser convertidas en otras*" (De Sacramentis, IV, 5-16). Dios creó el mundo para compartir su vida con personas que no son Dios. Este gran plan de salvación revela una sabiduría que rebasa nuestro entendimiento. Pero no se nos

INCENDIARIO

Pedro y Juan "entonces les impusieron las manos y recibieron el Espíritu Santo" (Hechos 8, 17).

Cerca del final del ministerio público de Jesús, los samaritanos no permitían que Jesús y Sus discípulos pasaran a través de su ciudad, ya que se dirigían hacia Jerusalén. San Juan el Apóstol se indignó. Él le preguntó a Jesús si quería que mandara a caer fuego del cielo para consumirlos (Lc 9, 52-54). Jesús lo rechazó, reprendiendo a Juan inmediatamente (Lc 9, 55).

Jesús finalmente permitió que Juan bajara fuego del cielo sobre los samaritanos. El diácono Felipe había tomado el evangelio en poder de los samaritanos incrédulos, pues recibieron la palabra de Dios (Hch 8, 5ss). "Cuando los Apóstoles estaban en Jerusalén oyeron que los samaritanos habían recibido la Palabra de Dios, les enviaron a Pedro y a Juan. Estos, al llegar, oraron por ellos para que recibieran el Espíritu Santo" (Hch 8, 14,15). Juan puso sus manos sobre los que antes había deseado incinerar, y el fuego de Dios, el Espíritu Santo, descendió sobre ellos para consumirlos con el amor de Dios (Hch 8, 17). Jesús dio a Juan su deseo, pero no de la manera que esperaba Juan. Juan tuvo que someterse a una mayor conversión que los samaritanos.
