It is with an acceptance to do God's will and not mine, that I announce to you this weekend that Bishop Soto has transferred me to Tahoe's north shore, to become Pastor of Corpus Christi Parish in Tahoe City effective July 1, which includes Mass year-round at the mission chapel in Squaw Valley. I have been Pastor here at St Theresa for 5 Christmases and 5 Easters, and this move is not something I planned, requested or anticipated. I have thoroughly enjoyed my tenure here in South Lake Tahoe -- with the priests, seminarians, parishioners and the parish staff; and my hope is that I have been able to spread God's message and love in even just a small way to this portion of his vineyard the past few years.

The Bishop puts you in good hands, as Father Mauricio Hurtado, presently Parochial Vicar at St James Parish in Davis, will become your new Pastor. I think he is one of the finest young priests in our diocese, and I know you will accept him with openness and kindness. Please pray for me, in this new assignment, as I surely promise to keep all of you in my constant prayers.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

When we imagine the disciples cowering behind locked doors on the first Easter, it is a matter of the greatest urgency that the doors get opened. They are not locked in as if in prison; rather, they have chosen to marinate in fear. Both the lock and the key stand on their side of the door, in their control. Christ breaks through this significant barrier with a message of "Peace." The risen Lord's word propels them through the door and along the path leading to the consoling image of the community living in harmony in the first reading today. What do we pray for in our tradition? More than anything else, we pray for peace. Every Mass is an earnest prayer for peace with God, with self, with neighbor, and for peace in the world. Yet, curiously, the peace Christ offers is deeper than the mere absence of conflict. Our tradition treasures the memories of saints who were remarkably open to Christ's gift of peace even in the maelstroms of history. St. Edith Stein and St. Maximilian Kolbe, martyrs of the Holocaust, are but two examples. At the eye of a fearful storm, they stand as witnesses to the power of Christ's rising in our lives.

DIVINA MISERICORDIA Una devoción especial se comenzó a esparcir por el mundo entero a partir del diario de una joven monja polaca en 1930. El mensaje no es nada nuevo, pero nos recuerda lo que la Iglesia siempre ha enseñado por medio de las Sagradas Escrituras y la tradición: que Dios es misericordioso y que perdona y que nosotros también debemos ser misericordiosos y debemos perdonar. Pero en la devoción a la Divina Misericordia este mensaje toma un enfoque poderoso que llama a las personas a un entendimiento más profundo sobre el Amor ilimitado de Dios y la disponibilidad de este Amor a todos – especialmente a los más pecadores. El mensaje y la devoción a Jesús como la Divina Misericordia esta basada en los escritos de la Santa María Faustina Kowalska, una monja polaca sin educación básica que, en obediencia a su director espiritual, escribió un diario de alrededor de 600 páginas que relatan las revelaciones que ella recibió sobre la Misericordia de Dios.

El mensaje de Misericordia es que Dios nos Ama – a todos- no importa cuan grande sean nuestras faltas. Él quiere que reconozcamos que Su Misericordia es más grande que nuestros pecados, para que nos acerquemos a Él con confianza, para que recibamos su Misericordia y la dejemos derramar sobre otros. De tal manera de que todos participemos de Su Gozo. Es un mensaje que podemos recordar tan fácilmente como “un ABC.”

Es decir: A — Pide su Misericordia. Dios quiere que nos acerquemos a Él por medio de la oración constante, arrepentidos de nuestros pecados y pidiéndole que derrame Su Misericordia sobre nosotros y sobre el mundo entero.

B — Sé misericordioso – Dios quiere que recibamos Su Misericordia y que por medio de nosotros se derrame sobre los demás

C — Confía completamente en Jesús – Dios nos deja saber que las gracias de su Misericordia dependen de nuestra confianza. Mientras más confiemos en Jesús, más recibiremos.
