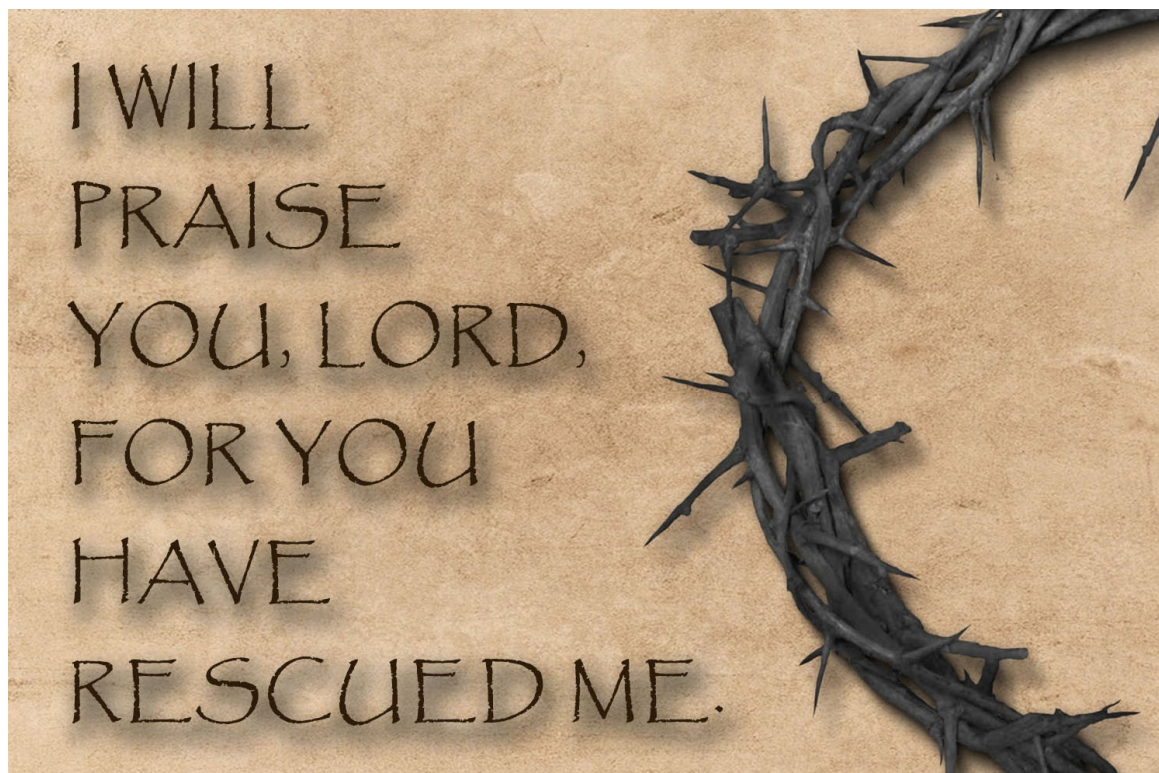

10 MYTHS OF ANNULMENTS

Annulment Myth #1: "An annulment will make my children illegitimate."

Truth: An annulment has no civil effect and does not change the status or "legitimacy" of children. For more information or direction for a possible annulment, contact the Tribunal by phone at (916) 733-0225 or e-mail TribunalDept@scd.org

Annulment Myth #2: "It's just a "Catholic divorce'."

Truth: The purpose of a civil divorce is to declare the end of a marriage. The purpose of an annulment is to determine the truth regarding the validity of a marriage at the time of the exchange of consent and thereby determine the status of the parties in the Catholic Church.

Annulment Myth #3: **Marriages held outside a Catholic church don't count; therefore, no annulment is needed.**

Truth: The Catholic Church presumes all marriages between a man and a woman are valid until proven otherwise. This includes marriages of Catholics, unbaptized persons, non-Christians, and atheists and includes marriages held at a church, winery, wedding chapel, backyard, beach, etc.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

World Day of Prayer will be observed on Sunday, May 8, 2022 also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday." The purpose of this day is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). TOOLS FOR BUILDING A DOMESTIC CHURCH

According to the Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church: "The family, is so to speak, the domestic church." (Lumen Gentium #11) This means that it is in the context of the family that we first learn who God is and to prayerfully seek His will for us. In the following bullet points you will find some suggestions on how to build your "domestic church" through a life of prayer that can help all the members of your family.

- ✚ Begin praying as a family and reading from Scripture daily, certainly before meals, but also first thing in the morning or before bed. Find a time that works for your family. Use the liturgy of the Church as a model for prayer, and try to include heartfelt unstructured prayer as well.
- ✚ Pray a Family Rosary (each member leads a decade, and everyone shares intentions).
- ✚ Have a crucifix in a prominent place in the home, and in every bedroom.
- ✚ Make the Sacraments a regular celebration – take the whole family to Confession and Mass!
- ✚ Begin family traditions based on the seasons celebrated in the liturgical calendar.
- ✚ Make your vacation a holy pilgrimage by visiting the shrines and saints of our land and the world.
- ✚ Make worshiping God a priority. Never miss Mass, even while traveling – go to: www.MassTimes.org to find a church near you!
- ✚ Teach stewardship and charity to your children, through word and example.
- ✚ Demonstrate love for your spouse, your children, your neighbors, and the world. Remind their children that they are loved by God and have been given gifts to serve others.
- ✚ Talk freely about the presence of God in the joys and sorrows of your life.
- ✚ Welcome into your home and support priests, brothers, sisters, deacons, and lay ministers in the Church.
- ✚ Participate in the lay ministries and activities of your parish community.
- ✚ Allow your children to witness you in private prayer. Encourage your children to pray daily on their own, to listen for God's call, and if heard, to respond.

TOP TEN THINGS TO PROMOTE VOCATIONS

For all Catholics:

1. *Pray* for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life. Jesus says in Matthew 9:38 "to beg the master of the harvest to send laborers into the vineyard." If we want more priests, sisters and brothers, we all need to ask.

2. *Teach young people how to pray.* Pope Benedict XVI said that unless we teach our youth how to pray, they will never hear God calling them into a deeper relationship with Him and into the discipleship of the Church.

3. *Invite* active young adults and teens to consider a vocation to the priesthood or consecrated life. A simple, sincere comment should not be underestimated. An easy way to do this can be remembered by four letters: ICNU. "John, I see in you (ICNU) the qualities that would make a good priest, and I want to encourage you to pray about it." It is a non-invasive way to encourage openness to a religious vocation.

4. *Make it attractive.* Show the priesthood for what it truly is – a call to be a spiritual father to the whole family of faith. Similarly, the consecrated life for a young woman is a call to be united to Christ in a unique way, and to be a spiritual mother to those she encounters in her life and service. The challenge for priests and religious is to be joyful models of their vocations.

5. *Preach it, brother!* Vocations must be talked about regularly if a "vocation culture" is to take root in parishes and homes. This means, first and foremost, the people need to hear about vocations from priests through homilies, prayers of the faithful, and discussions in the classroom. Vocations kept out of sight are out of mind.

For those considering a vocation:

6. *Practice the faith.* We all need to be reminded that the whole point of our lives is to grow in a deep, intimate and loving relationship with God. This is the first step for any young person desiring to discern any call in life.

7. *Enter into the Silence.* Silence is key to sanity and wholeness. We can only "hear" the voice of God if we are quiet. Take out the ear buds of your iPhone, iPod, and iTunes and listen to God, the great I AM. Young people should try to spend 15 minutes of quiet prayer each day – this is where you can begin to receive clear direction in your lives.

8. *Be a good disciple.* Some bishops say, "We do not have a vocation crisis; we have a discipleship crisis." Young people can become true followers of Jesus Christ by serving those around them. By discovering your call to discipleship, you also discover your particular call within the Church.

9. *Ask God.* Ask God what He wants for your life and know He only wants what is good for you. If, in fact, you are called to the priesthood or consecrated life, it will be the path to great joy and contentment.

10. *In the immortal words of a famous sneaker manufacturer: "Just do it!"* If you feel that God is inviting you to "try it out," apply to the seminary or religious order. Remember, the seminary or convent is a place of discernment. You will not be ordained or asked to profess vows for many years, providing ample opportunity to explore the possibility of a call to priesthood or religious life.

I BELIEVE | “These have been recorded to help you believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, so that through this faith you may have life in His name.” —John 20:31

Alluia! Jesus is risen! Has this last week been one of the greatest weeks in your life, not because of what you’ve done, but because of what the risen Lord has done? Or are you still locked in the upper room with all the doubting Thomases and fearful disciples? “Do not persist in your unbelief, but believe!” (Jn 20:27)

“There is nothing to fear” (Rv 1:17). Jesus is “the First and the Last and the One Who lives” (Rv 1:17-18). He once was dead but now He lives — “forever and ever” (Rv 1:18). He is “rich in mercy” (Eph 2:4).

Respond to Him: “My Lord and my God!” (Jn 20:28) Because you believe, “many signs and wonders” will occur “among the people” (Acts 5:12). Because you believe, “more and more believers, men and women in great numbers” will be “continually added to the Lord” (Acts 5:14). Because you believe, crowds will gather, “bringing their sick” and those “troubled by unclean spirits” (Acts 5:16), all of whom will be cured (Acts 5:16).

Jesus is out of the tomb forever. Yet many parts of His Body remain entombed. We must roll away the stone of doubt and come out into the glory of the risen Son. Easter is for believers. “Blest are they who have not seen and have believed” (Jn 20:29).

Prayer: *Father, change my heart and my lifestyle. Through my witness of faith, bring many people to new freedom in Your Son.*

Promise: “There is nothing to fear.” —Rv 1:17

Praise: “If we have died with Him we shall also live with Him” (2 Tm 2:11). Jesus, thank You for Your mercy.

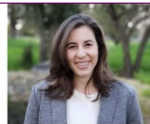

Paso dos: Evaluar tu vida

Pregunta para los niños: Jesús le pregunta a Pedro tres veces si Pedro lo ama. ¿Qué cosa pueden hacer esta semana para mostrar que aman a Jesús?

Pregunta para los jóvenes: Jesús le pidió tres veces a Pedro: "alimenta mis ovejas". ¿A quién se te llama a ayudar en estos momentos?

Pregunta para los adultos: Cristo sigue alimentándonos como sus discípulos, aún después de su muerte y resurrección. ¿Cómo alimenta su fe la Eucaristía?

20 MANERAS DE PROMOVER VOCACIONES EN SU PARROQUIA Y ESCUELA

1. Que los feligreses reciten públicamente la oración diocesana de las vocaciones durante las Misas del domingo y las Misas de todos los días.
2. Proporcionen oportunidades para que los feligreses puedan participar en la Adoración Eucarística durante ciertos días, pidiendo oraciones por las vocaciones.
3. Envíen tarjetas de felicitación a cada uno de los seminaristas de la diócesis al comienzo de un nuevo semestre, las vacaciones, épocas de exámenes, cumpleaños, y ordenaciones, etc.
4. Patrocinen concursos para diseñar carteles y escribir ensayos que se enfocan en temas relacionados con las vocaciones, exhiban los resultados.
5. Anime entrevistar a párrocos, sacerdotes, hermanas religiosas, hermanos religiosos, diáconos y personas consagradas para el periódico escolar o boletín de anuncios de la parroquia, enfocando especialmente como fue que discernieron su llamada vocacional.
6. Creen una página Web de su parroquia y /o escuela con información sobre las vocaciones.
7. Organicen una Noche de Apreciación para los monaguillos que sirven en el altar y que uno de los sacerdotes participe en el evento para que pueda hacer una presentación a los servidores.
8. Antes de comenzar las reuniones de cualquier ministerio o grupo, pónganse de acuerdo para reunirse un poco más temprano para rezar juntos una década del rosario por un sacerdote o seminarista específico.
9. Creen un collage de fotos de sacerdotes, hermanos religiosos y hermanas religiosas que han sido parte de su comunidad.
10. Incluyan en cada nivel y grado de la educación religiosa lecciones y programas para la educación sobre las vocaciones al sacerdocio y a la vida consagrada. Cada grado puede hacer un proyecto especial y los informes se pueden combinar como parte de un folleto de recursos.
11. Tengan la oración de las vocaciones impresas en imanes para el refrigerador y distribúyanlas entre los feligreses.
12. Averigüen cual es la fecha de ordenación de los sacerdotes de la parroquia y celebren dentro de la parroquia y la escuela.
13. Promuevan la vida de los Santos de diversas maneras, por ejemplo, en el boletín de anuncios de la parroquia, en carteles, en una bibliografía, etc.
14. Lleven a un grupo de la parroquia o la escuela para asistir a la ordenación de un sacerdote diocesano o de un diácono. En el calendario vocacional hay que verificar las fechas de las ordenaciones próximas.
15. Inviten a un sacerdote, diácono o hermana religiosa a cenar para conversar sobre las vocaciones en torno a la mesa familiar.
16. Promuevan un Desayuno en Comunidad después de la Misa, donde el orador hablará sobre el tema de las vocaciones.
17. Inviten al Director de Vocaciones a la parroquia por un fin de semana, para que pueda hablar sobre las vocaciones durante las Misas y pueda cenar con familias de la parroquia.
18. Soliciten a 31 voluntarios feligreses, en nombre de su parroquia y su comité, para rezar el rosario o asistir a la Misa uno de todos los 31 días del mes dedicado a las vocaciones.
19. Celebren las fiestas de los Santos, tales como asistiendo a la Misa en la Fiesta de Santa Teresa de Lisieux, patrona de los misioneros y patrona de muchas vocaciones.
20. Proporcione y distribuya oraciones de intercesión para las vocaciones durante la Oración de los Fieles en la Misa.

TRABAJANDO EN LA OBRA | “¿Qué debemos hacer para realizar las obras de Dios?” (Juan 6:28)

Ya que hemos resucitado con Cristo, debemos buscar los bienes que pertenecen al reino celestial (Col 3:1). “Lo antiguo ha desaparecido, un ser nuevo se ha hecho presente” (2 Co 5:17; ver Ap 21:5). Por ejemplo, ahora que hemos sido bautizados en la muerte y resurrección de Jesús, vemos el trabajo de una nueva manera. Ya no trabajamos “por el alimento perecedero sino por el que permanece hasta la vida eterna” (Jn 6:27). Nosotros hacemos “la obra de Dios”, que es, “que crean en Aquel que Él ha enviado” (Jn 6:29). Podemos seguir recibiendo salario y beneficios, pero estos ya no son la razón por las cuales trabajamos. Trabajamos solo por amor a Dios. Esto puede significar que cambiemos trabajos, como los santos Pedro, Andrés, Santiago, Juan y Mateo. Normalmente, trabajar por Dios significa no tanto cambiar nuestros trabajos, sino la manera en que hacemos las obras.

Cuando trabajamos por Dios también trabajamos con Dios. Esto significa que recibimos el poder de Dios por el cual trabajamos. Entonces, como san Esteban, haremos “grandes prodigios y signos” (Hch 6:8). Así también, como san Esteban, trabajaremos tan fuerte y fructíferamente por el reino de Dios que nos volvemos una amenaza al demonio. Entonces nos tienta más y trata de intimidarnos, y hasta de matarnos. Sin embargo, esto le es contraproducente, pues la persecución y el martirio hacen que nuestro trabajo sea todavía más fructífero (Jn 12:24).

Trabajemos por, con y en Dios.

Oración: Padre, trabaja en mis asuntos para que te complazca más.

Promesa: “El rostro de Esteban parecía el de un ángel” (Hch 6:15).

Alabanza: San Atanasio fue uno de los Padres de la Iglesia primitiva más importante y venerado. Él luchó valientemente contra la herejía ariana, la cual negaba que Cristo era totalmente Dios.
