THE DYNAMICS OF THE SPIRITUAL LIFE *Henri Nouwen Society*

Our emotional lives and our spiritual lives have different dynamics. The ups and downs of our emotional life depend a great deal on our past or present surroundings. We are happy, sad, angry, bored, excited, depressed, loving, caring, hateful, or vengeful because of what happened long ago or what is happening now.

The ups and downs of our spiritual lives depend on our obedience - that is, our attentive listening - to the movements of the Spirit of God within us. Without this listening our spiritual life eventually becomes subject to the windswept waves of our emotions.

DIGGING INTO OUR SPIRITUAL RESOURCES *Henri Nouwen Society*

When someone hurts us, offends us, ignores us, or rejects us, a deep inner protest emerges. It can be rage or depression, desire to take revenge or an impulse to harm ourselves. We can feel a deep urge to wound those who have wounded us or to withdraw in a suicidal mood of self-rejection. Although these extreme reactions might seem exceptional, they are never far away from our hearts. During the long nights we often find ourselves brooding about words and actions we might have used in response to what others have said or done to us.

It is precisely here that we have to dig deep into our spiritual resources and find the center within us, the center that lies beyond our need to hurt others or ourselves, where we are free to forgive and love.

BRIDGING THE GAP BETWEEN PEOPLE *Henri Nouwen Society*

To become neighbors is to bridge the gap between people. As long as there is distance between us and we cannot look in each other's eyes, all sorts of false ideas and images arise. We give them names, make jokes about them, cover them with our prejudices, and avoid direct contact. We think of them as enemies. We forget that they love as we love, care for their children as we care for ours, become sick and die as we do. We forget that they are our brothers and sisters and treat them as objects that can be destroyed at will.

CLOSE IS NOT IN

"The reign of God is like a buried treasure which a man found in a field." —Matthew 13:44

Just because we're in the Lord's dragnet doesn't mean He will retain us at the end of the world (Mt 13:47ff). Just because we're in the Lord's field, it doesn't mean we are God's wheat. We may be weeds to be burned (Mt 13:40). Just because we go to church doesn't mean we are automatically living in God's kingdom. Doing Christian things and living in the midst of Christians doesn't make us Christians (see Lk 13:26-27).

We are Christians and followers of Jesus, the King of the kingdom, when we sell all that we have to buy God's kingdom (Mt 13:44, 46). We are living life in Christ when we, by faith, give our lives to Jesus, and are no longer living for ourselves but for Him Who died and rose from the dead for us (2 Cor 5:15; Gal 2:20). Being close to Christians doesn't make us Christians, but being close to and in Christ makes us Christians.

To those merely active in Christian activities but not living in Him, Jesus will say: "I never knew you. Out of My sight, you evildoers!" (Mt 7:23) To those living for Him alone, Jesus will say: "Come. You have My Father's blessing! Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the creation of the world" (Mt 25:34). Live in His kingdom.

Prayer: Father, may I seek first Your kingdom and Your way of righteousness (Mt 6:33).

Promise: "We know that God makes all things work together for the good of those who love" Him. —Rm 8:28

THE REAL PRESENCE OF JESUS CHRIST IN THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST: BASIC QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Do the consecrated bread and wine cease to be the Body and Blood of Christ when the Mass is over?

No. During the celebration of the Eucharist, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, and this they remain. They cannot turn back into bread and wine, for they are no longer bread and wine at all. There is thus no reason for them to change back to their "normal" state after the special circumstances of the Mass are past. Once the substance has really changed, the presence of the Body and Blood of Christ "endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist" (Catechism, no. 1377). Against those who maintained that the bread that is consecrated during the Eucharist has no sanctifying power if it is left over until the next day, St. Cyril of Alexandria replied, "Christ is not altered, nor is his holy body changed, but the power of the consecration and his life-giving grace is perpetual in it" (Letter 83, to Calosyrius, Bishop of Arsinoe [PG 76, 1076]). The Church teaches that Christ remains present under the appearances of bread and wine as long as the appearances of bread and wine remain (cf. Catechism, no. 1377).

Why are some of the consecrated hosts reserved after the Mass?

While it would be possible to eat all of the bread that is consecrated during the Mass, some is usually kept in the tabernacle. The Body of Christ under the appearance of bread that is kept or "reserved" after the Mass is commonly referred to as the "Blessed Sacrament." There are several pastoral reasons for reserving the Blessed Sacrament. First of all, it is used for distribution to the dying (Viaticum), the sick, and those who legitimately cannot be present for the celebration of the Eucharist. Secondly, the Body of Christ in the form of bread is to be adored when it is exposed, as in the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction, when it is carried in eucharistic processions, or when it is simply placed in the tabernacle, before which people pray privately. These devotions are based on the fact that Christ himself is present under the appearance of bread. Many holy people well known to American Catholics, such as St. John Neumann, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, St. Katharine Drexel, and Blessed Damien of Molokai, practiced great personal devotion to Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament. In the Eastern Catholic Churches, devotion to the reserved Blessed Sacrament is practiced most directly at the Divine Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts, offered on weekdays of Lent.

LA PRESENCIA REAL DE JESUCRISTO EN EL SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCARISTÍA PREGUNTAS BÁSICAS Y RESPUESTAS

CONTINUACIÓN...

¿Por qué se reservan después de la misa algunas de las hostias consagradas?

Si bien fuera posible comer todo el pan consagrado durante la misa, se suele reservar algo en el sagrario. El Cuerpo de Cristo bajo la apariencia de pan guardado o "reservado" después de la misa suele recibir el nombre de "Santísimo Sacramento". Hay varias razones pastorales para reservar el Santísimo Sacramento. Ante todo, es empleado para distribuirlo a los moribundos (viático), los enfermos y los que legítimamente no pueden estar presentes en la celebración de la Eucaristía. En segundo lugar, el Cuerpo de Cristo en la forma de pan debe ser adorado cuando es expuesto, como en el Rito de la Sagrada Comunión y del Culto Eucarístico fuera de la Misa, cuando es llevado en procesiones eucarísticas, o simplemente cuando es depositado en el sagrario, ante el cual los fieles puedan orar en privado. Estas devociones se basan en el hecho de que Cristo mismo está presente bajo la apariencia de pan. Muchas santas personas bien conocidas por los católicos estadounidenses, como S. John Neumann, S. Elizabeth Ann Seton, S. Katharine Drexel y el beato Damien de Molokai, practicaron gran devoción personal a Cristo presente en el Santísimo Sacramento. En las Iglesias Católicas Orientales, la devoción al Santísimo Sacramento reservado es practicada del modo más directo en la Divina Liturgia de los Dones Presantificados, ofrecida en los días de semana de Cuaresma.

CERCA NO ES ESTAR DENTRO "El Reino de los Cielos se parece a un tesoro escondido en un campo" (Mateo 13:44).

Solo porque somos redes de arrastre del Señor no quiere decir que El nos va a retener hasta el fin del mundo (Mt 13:47ss). Solo porque estamos en el campo del Señor, no significa que somos el trigo de Dios. Podemos ser cizañas que se deseen quemar (Mt 13:40). Solo porque vamos a la iglesia, no significa que estamos viviendo automáticamente en el reino de Dios. Haciendo cosas cristianas y viviendo en medio de los cristianos no nos hace cristianos (ver Lc 13:26-27).

Somos cristianos y seguidores de Jesús, el Rey del reino, cuando vendemos todo lo que tenemos para comprar el reino de Dios (Mt 13:44, 46). Estamos viviendo la vida en Cristo cuando, por fe, damos nuestra vida a Jesús, y ya no vivimos para nosotros, sino para Aquel que murió y resucitó de entre los muertos por nosotros (2 Co 5:15; Gal 2:20). El estar cerca de los cristianos no nos hace cristianos; pero el estar cerca y en Cristo nos hace cristianos.

Para aquellos que están simplemente en las actividades cristianas, pero no viviendo en Él, Jesús les dirá: "Jamás los conocí; apártense de mí, ustedes, los que hacen el mal" (Mt 7:23) Para los que viven solo para Él, Jesús les dirá: "Vengan, benditos de mi Padre, y reciban en herencia el Reino que les fue preparado desde el comienzo del mundo" (Mt 25:34). Viva en Su reino.

Oración: Padre, que pueda buscar primero Tu Reino y Tu justicia (Mt 6:33).

Promesa: "Sabemos, además, que Dios dispone, todas las cosas para el bien de los que lo aman, de aquellos que Él llamó según su designio" (Rom 8:28).
