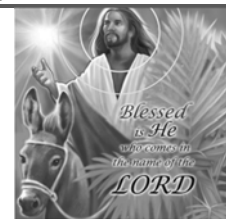

**PROPHETIC ANOINTING** The solemnity of today's readings invites us into silent contemplation of the mystery of our redemption. There are so many levels on which to understand the events of the Passion. The woman who anoints Jesus acts prophetically in a way that the other disciples do not yet grasp. Anointing is for priests, prophets, and kings, and also for the preparation of the dead. It is for healing and for holiness. Her action acknowledges the imminent events of the passion and death of the Lord, and points toward his resurrection and triumph over evil and death. 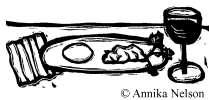

Observance of the Lenten Season is Kept Until Sunset of Holy Thursday

"Easter Triduum" is Celebrated from Sunset of Holy Thursday to Sunrise of Easter Sunday

**Good Friday** this week is a day of **both FAST & ABSTINENCE.**

You are encouraged to CONTINUE FASTING THROUGHOUT HOLY SATURDAY, for the intentions of those to be initiated into our Catholic faith.

**Fasting** means to have one normal meal without meat during the day, and two other meatless meals to maintain strength, health permitting. The two smaller meals combined should not equal or be more than the normal meal. Water or juice may be taken at any time. Adults who have attained their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday to the end of the 59<sup>th</sup> year are bound to keep the practice of fasting.

**Abstinence** means no meat (poultry, pork, beef, game) may be eaten, and binds everyone who has attained their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday, health permitting.

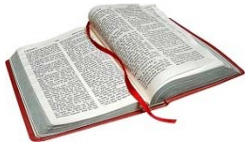

"Triduo de Pascua" se celebra desde la puesta del sol del Jueves Santo, a Salida del sol del domingo de Pascua. Santo viernes de esta semana es un día de tanto AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA.

Muchos continúan el ayuno TODO SÁBADO SANTO, por las intenciones de aquellos que se inició en nuestra fe católica.

El ayuno significa tener una comida normal sin carne durante el día, y otros dos comidas sin carne para mantener la fuerza, permitiendo la salud. Las dos comidas más pequeñas combinadas no debe ser igual o más que la comida normal. El agua o jugo se pueden tomar en cualquier momento. Los adultos que han alcanzado los 18 años hasta el final del año 59o están obligados a mantener la práctica del ayuno.

Abstinencia significa que no hay carne (aves de corral, carne de cerdo, carne de res) puede ser comido, por a todos los que han alcanzado los 14 años, lo que permite la salud.
