KNIGHT'S CORNER

This Month's Challenge

The Lord said to her in reply, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." (Gospel for July 21, Lk 10:41-42)

Imagine yourself in Martha's shoes. While your seemingly lazy sister Mary sits at the feet of Jesus, *you* are the one preparing and serving the food, setting the table and making things happen. And then, all of a sudden, Jesus chides *you* and compares you unfavorably to your sister. Jesus' words can strike us as harsh. Wasn't Martha doing a good thing by serving our Lord? Yet if we are honest, we recognize that it's all too easy to get caught up in busyness doing good things and all the while miss the opportunity to encounter Christ. By God's grace, may we hear these tough words from Jesus, resist this tendency to busyness and strive to choose "the better part."

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:
This month, I challenge you to spend five extra minutes sitting before the Lord before or after Sunday Mass. Second, I challenge you to participate in the Faith in Action Sacramental Gifts program or pray for those receiving the sacraments, that they might choose "the better part."

Questions for Reflection:

If it were you with Jesus that evening, would you have been more likely to be a "Martha" or a "Mary"? What does it mean to choose "the better part"? How did spending a few extra moments with the Lord before or after Mass affect your encounter with Christ in the Eucharist?

PRAYER IS EVEN BETTER

"**Mary has chosen the better portion and she shall not be deprived of it.**" —Luke 10:42

Hospitality was a responsibility and privilege highly valued by the Jewish people. In offering hospitality, we may be entertaining angels (Heb 13:2) or even God Himself (Gn 18:17ff). Abraham and Sarah, for example, offered hospitality to God and two angels. As a result, God promised them they would miraculously have a son, although both were almost a hundred years old (see Gn 18:10). Hospitality is the breeding ground of promise, blessing, and miracles.

As awesome as hospitality is, Jesus claimed that prayer is even better (Lk 10:42). This was a surprising revelation. Jesus even maintained the necessity of praying always (Lk 18:1; cf 1 Thes 5:17). He did this Himself, praying early in the morning and late at night (Mk 1:35; Lk 22:39ff). Jesus prayed in such a new way that people who had prayed for years asked Him to teach them to pray (Lk 11:1).

After Jesus ascended into heaven, His disciples caught onto Jesus' message on prayer and devoted themselves to constant prayer for nine days (Acts 1:14). The Church was born after this nine-day gestation period of prayer. From that point on, the Spirit has empowered the followers of Jesus to devote themselves to prayer (see Acts 2:42).

Prayer: *Jesus, teach me to pray (Lk 11:1). Holy Spirit, help me overcome my weakness in prayer (Rm 8:26).*

Promise: *"Even now I find my joy in the suffering I endure for you. In my own flesh I fill up what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ for the sake of His body, the church."* — Col 1:24

Praise: *Praise Jesus, Who opened wide the doors to His Father's house! "Praise the name of the Lord, for His name alone is exalted; His majesty is above earth and heaven" (Ps 148:13).*

REFLECTIONS

WHAT'S THE SMOKE FOR?

Dear Johan,

Last week I hosted some out of town guests. They asked why we did not have holy water "bowls" near the doors. I did not know.

Do you?

Gentle Reader,

I would have been so tempted to ask them about the meaning of this gesture. Would they have made the connection with their baptism?

The act of blessing ourselves with holy water upon entering and leaving the church is intended as a reminder of our baptism and of the rights and obligations that come with that. Sadly, the small holy water stoops that serve this purpose are so far removed from the baptismal font in both size and amount of water that the connection is not readily made. On the contrary, dipping our fingers in those minuscule amounts of water and blessing ourselves is often done purely out of habit without much thought or impact. It is one of the things we do on our way from the profane into the sacred. Sometimes this reflexive action is questionably laden with a hint of pagan baggage.

The reason why we have these small stoops is due to the fact that previous to the Second Vatican Council, baptismal fonts were inaccessible. They were locked away in baptismal chapels and the water in them was hidden by metal covers. Thus, in lieu of the font, small holy water stoops were located at every door of the church, for easy access to holy water.

New and remodeled churches have large baptismal fonts at the entrance of the church. Their size and location make it clear that baptism is the first among the sacraments. In those churches, the font also functions as the place where people go to bless themselves upon entering and leaving the church. The only imaginable reason for preferring the stoops over the font must be habit and comfort, neither of which are acceptable.

Maybe you can invite your guests on their next visit to pass by the font when entering the church so they might remind themselves more effectively of their baptism. Would they not rather go to the source rather than to a minor tributary?

BUILDING OUR FUTURE FUNDRAISER


Dear Family of Saint Theresa,

LA ESCUELA DE SUFRIMIENTO

"Ahora me alegro de poder sufrir por ustedes, y completo en mi carne lo que falta a los padecimientos de Cristo, para bien de Su Cuerpo, que es la Iglesia" (Colosenses 1:24).

Antes de comprometernos con el Señor, naturalmente elegimos vivir una vida de máximo placer y dolor mínimo. Debido a que el amor verdadero con frecuencia implica dolor, la vida de máximo placer y dolor mínimo equivale a una vida de máximo egoísmo y amor mínimo.

Si nos arrepentimos, elegimos el amor y comprometemos nuestras vidas totalmente con el Señor, elegimos una vida de máximo amor, sin importar el dolor. En efecto, elegimos tomar la cruz diariamente y seguir a Jesús (Lc 9:23). Elegimos sufrir redentoramente en el patrón de la muerte de Jesús (Fil 3:10).

A medida que crecemos en santidad, no solo aceptamos el sufrimiento en Jesús, sino que nos regocijamos en este (Col 1:24, ver también 1 Pe 4:13). Nos regocijamos por sufrir con Cristo porque amamos a Cristo y queremos ser como Él. Además, nos regocijamos por sufrir en Cristo porque amamos a los demás y queremos que todos se salven (ver 1 Tim 2:4). Cuando nos damos cuenta de que "el sufrimiento, más que cualquier otra cosa ... despeja el camino a la gracia que transforma las almas" (El Significado Cristiano del Sufrimiento Humano, Papa san Juan Pablo II, 27), nos regocijamos de que la gracia salvadora del Señor está siendo aceptada por medio de compartir el sufrimiento de Cristo.

¿Estás comprometido con Jesús? ¿Estás creciendo en santidad? Para responder a estas preguntas, mira tu actitud hacia el sufrimiento en Cristo.

Oración: Padre, envía al Espíritu Santo para transformar mi actitud hacia el sufrimiento.

Promesa: "Una sola cosa es necesaria, María eligió la mejor parte, que no le será quitada" (Lc 10:42).

Alabanza: Alabado sea el Jesús resucitado, Quien libremente eligió dejar la gloria del cielo para sufrir en la tierra por nuestra salvación.
