DRINK AND TELL

"The woman then left her water jar and went off into the town." —John 4:28

A Samaritan woman brought her water jar to the town well to fill it with water (Jn 4:7). Jesus, sitting by the well, offered her living water instead (Jn 4:10). Jesus told her: "Whoever drinks the water I give him will never be thirsty; no, the water I give shall become a fountain within him, leaping up to provide eternal life" (Jn 4:14). The woman, filled with the flowing water of the Spirit, forgot all about well water, and simply left her water jar sitting by the well. Her only concern was to tell others about Jesus (Jn 4:28).

God created human beings to be physically and spiritually thirsty. We need to physically drink every day, and need to spiritually drink even more frequently. Even the most hard-hearted are thirsty for Jesus' living water, whether or not they recognize it. Once the Samaritan woman drank of Jesus' living water, she couldn't help but bring that water to others. Likewise, it's up to us to give God's thirsty people a drink of Jesus' living water.

The Samaritan woman teaches us that when we drink fully of the water Jesus offers, we will start evangelizing. We'll be so filled with living water that we won't be able to help it. If we're not evangelizing, it's likely a symptom that we're getting spiritually dehydrated. Jesus says: "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me; let him drink who believes in Me. Scripture has it: 'From within him rivers of living water shall flow' " (Jn 7:37-38). Come to Jesus; drink deeply; tell the world about Him.

Prayer: Jesus, immerse me in Your living waters. "Water from the side of Christ, wash me."

Promise: "Doing the will of Him Who sent Me and bringing His work to completion is My food." —Jn 4:34

Praise: Praise You, Jesus, the crucified Resurrection and the Life! (Jn 11:25). You are "the Author of Life" (Acts 3:15).

AN HONEST BEING~WITH

Being with a friend in great pain is not easy. It makes us uncomfortable. We do not know what to do or what to say, and we worry about how to respond to what we hear. Our temptation is to say things that come more out of our own fear than out of our care for the person in pain. Sometimes we say things like "Well, you're doing a lot better than yesterday," or "You will soon be your old self again," or "I'm sure you will get over this." But often we know that what we're saying is not true, and our friends know it too.

We do not have to play games with each other. We can simply say: "I am your friend, I am happy to be with you." We can say that in words or with touch or with loving silence. Sometimes it is good to say: "You don't have to talk. Just close your eyes. I am here with you, thinking of you, praying for you, loving you." **Henri**

SEDIENTOS DE LAS AGUAS QUE DAN VIDA— Especialmente durante la Cuaresma, la Semana Santa y el tiempo de Pascua, los textos de oración de la Iglesia Occidental se deleitan con imágenes paradójicas de Cristo: la vida eterna que muere, el anfitrión de la cena que es también alimento, el crucificado sediento del que mana agua de vida de su costado. Estas imágenes fluyen de las representaciones de Jesús por parte de los evangelistas y de su mismísimo ministerio, durante el cual muchas veces cambió o invirtió las expectativas que las personas tenían sobre él o sobre los designios de Dios. Esta “inversión” está en juego en el Evangelio de hoy, cuando Jesús habla con una extranjera enemiga que está por debajo de su condición social. Además él, el que tiene sed, demuestra que la mujer es la única que tiene sed verdadera. Él —cuyos labios secos dirán “Tengo sed” antes de morir— es la fuente de vida y del agua que da vida. La Cuaresma nos llama a reflexionar sobre cómo cada uno de nosotros tiene sed de Cristo y nos lleva, en última instancia, de vuelta a las aguas dadoras de vida de nuestro bautismo en su Cuerpo. *Copyright © J. BEBA Y CUENTE

"Comparte conmigo los sufrimientos que es necesario padecer por Evangelio" (2 Timoteo 1, 8).

Como hijo bautizado de Dios, tienes una parte de las bendiciones del evangelio (1 Co 9, 23; Ef 1, 3). Asimismo, tienes una parte de las dificultades que el evangelio de Cristo requiere (Una mujer samaritana trajo su cántaro al pozo de la ciudad para llenarlo con agua (Jn 4, 7). Jesús, sentado junto al pozo, en cambio le ofreció agua viva (Jn 4,10). Jesús le dijo: "el que beba del agua que yo le daré, nunca más volverá a tener sed. El agua que yo le daré se convertirá en él en manantial que brotará hasta la Vida eterna" (Jn 4,14). La mujer, llena con el agua que fluye del Espíritu, se olvidó del agua del pozo, y simplemente dejó su cántaro al lado del pozo. Su única preocupación era contarles a los demás sobre Jesús (Jn 4, 28).

Dios creó a los seres humanos para ser física y espiritualmente sedientos. Necesitamos beber físicamente todos los días, y necesitamos incluso beber espiritualmente con mayor frecuencia. Aun los más duros de corazón están sedientos del agua viva de Jesús, sea que lo reconozcan o no. Una vez que la mujer samaritana bebió del agua viva de Jesús, ella no pudo evitar llevar esa agua a los demás. De igual manera, está en nosotros llevar a las personas sedientas de Dios un trago de agua viva de Jesús.

La samaritana nos enseña que cuando bebemos completamente del agua que Jesús nos ofrece, empezaremos a evangelizar. Vamos a estar tan llenos de agua viva que no vamos a poder ser capaces de evitarlo. Si no estamos evangelizando, lo más probable es un síntoma de que nos estamos deshidratando espiritualmente. "Jesús dice: 'El que tenga sed, venga a mí; y beba el que cree en mí'. Como dice la Escritura: "De su seno brotarán manantiales de agua viva" (Jn 7, 37-38). Ven a Jesús; bebe a fondo; hable de Él al mundo.

Oración: Jesús, sumérgeme en Tus aguas vivas. "Agua del costado de Cristo, lávame".
