GOD BROKEN-HEARTED AGAIN

"The Lord Jesus on the night in which He was betrayed took bread, and after He had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is My body, which is for you.' " —1 Corinthians 11:23-24

At the Last Supper, Jesus first gave us His Body and Blood on the night He was betrayed. This was a harbinger of Masses to come. Jesus' greatest gift, the gift of His own Body and Blood, is often rejected when we refuse to believe in the Eucharist or when we have attitudes of selfishness at Mass. How heartbreaking to Jesus when He sees us trying to make the Mass fit conveniently into our lives rather than radically transforming our lives to center them on our Eucharistic Lord!

Jesus is the most rejected, divorced, and abused Person Who has ever lived. Yet He keeps coming back for more. He makes Himself so vulnerable when He faithfully and constantly changes bread and wine into His Body and Blood. However, Jesus exposes His broken heart to further brokenness because He is God, Who is Love (1 Jn 4:8, 16). Love loves unconditionally. Love loves even if hated and crucified in return.

On this solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, decide to accept the grace to love our Eucharistic Jesus. Offer your body as a living sacrifice (Rm 12:1) so that His Body and Blood will no longer be disbelieved, ignored, and pushed even further into the margins of so many people's lives. Make reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Prayer: *Jesus, give me the grace to be willing to suffer anything so as to never reject You.*

Promise: "Then, taking the five loaves and the two fish, Jesus raised His eyes to heaven, pronounced a blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to His disciples for distribution to the crowd. They all ate until they had enough." —Lk 9:16-17

Praise: *Praise the risen Jesus, who shed His last drop of blood that we may be set free.*

THIS SACRED MEAL

Today we celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Each of the readings includes a blessing and a sharing of food. They remind us of the central place of meals in our lives. Each meal brings to mind other meals: the sharing of cookies and milk, pizza and beer, loaves and fishes, bread and wine. When we prepare a meal for our family, our friends, even strangers, we always put something of ourselves into the preparation and the meal itself. The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ reminds us of what God put into the preparation for this meal that we celebrate today. We share this sacred meal and are transformed as we remember the death of Jesus and the sacrifice that nurtures our faith, sustains our lives, and supports our work.

REFLECTIONS SB 360 SUNDAY: KEEP THE SEAL OF CONFESSION

The State Legislature is considering a bill, SB 360, to regulate the Sacrament of Penance and force priests to break the Seal of Confession. In light of this proposed bill, Bishop Soto is encouraging all parishes from the Diocese of Sacramento to take action on the weekend of June 22-23 to oppose Senate Bill 360.

“The recent California state senate bill, SB 360, has been proposed as an aid to prevent child sexual abuse. While this is an admirable aim, the bill misses the mark. Specifically, this bill attempts to do so by way of removing the legal protections surrounding the sacramental seal of confession, a legal protection which has been in place throughout the history of Church & State relations.

There is nothing intrinsic to this bill which creates a greater assurance or guarantees that future abuse will not happen. Instead, it mounts an assault on the fundamental liberties of Catholics in the state of California under the guise of greater protection. For this reason, all Catholics, religious people of any affiliation, and indeed all people of good will, should vigorously oppose SB 360” – Bishop Jaime Soto

FREE TO BE COMPASSIONATE

If you would ask the Desert Fathers why solitude gives birth to compassion, they would say, “Because it makes us die to our neighbor.” At first this answer seems quite disturbing to a modern mind. But when we give it a closer look we can see that in order to be of service to others we have to die to them; that is, we have to give up measuring our meaning and value with the yardstick of others. To die to our neighbors means to stop judging them, to stop evaluating them, and thus to become free to be compassionate.

Compassion can never coexist with judgment because judgment creates the distance, the distinction, that prevents us from really being with the other.

This new freedom in Christ allows us to move in the world uninhibited by our compulsions and to act creatively even when we are laughed at and rejected, even when our words and actions lead us to death.

DIOS DEL CORAZÓN HERIDO DE NUEVO

"El Señor Jesús, la noche en que fue entregado, tomó el pan, dio gracias, lo partió y dijo: 'Esto es Mi Cuerpo, que se entrega por ustedes'" (1 Corintios 11:23-24).

En la Última Cena, Jesús nos dio Su Cuerpo y Sangre la noche en que fue traicionado. Esto fue un anuncio de las Misas por vendrían. El mayor regalo de Jesús, el don de Su propio Cuerpo y Sangre, es a menudo rechazado cuando nos rehusamos a creer en la Eucaristía o cuando tenemos actitudes de egoísmo en la Misa. ¡Qué desgarrador para Jesús cuando nos ve tratando de hacer que la Misa encaje adecuadamente en nuestras vidas en lugar de transformar radicalmente nuestras vidas para centrarlas en nuestro Señor Eucarístico!

Jesús es la persona más rechazada, separada y maltratada que jamás haya vivido. Sin embargo, Él sigue regresando por más. Se hace tan vulnerable cuando cambia fiel y constantemente el pan y el vino en Su Cuerpo y Sangre. Aún más, Jesús expone Su corazón quebrantado a un mayor quebrantamiento porque Él es Dios, Quien es Amor (1 Jn 4:8, 16). El Amor ama incondicionalmente. El Amor ama, aunque sea odiado y crucificado.

En esta solemnidad del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo, decídate aceptar la gracia de amar a nuestro Jesús Eucarístico. Ofrécete "como una víctima viva, santa y agradable a Dios" (Rom 12:1) para que Su Cuerpo y Su Sangre no sean más descreídos, ignorados y relegados más allá de los márgenes de vida de tanta gente. Haz reparación al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús.

Oración: Jesús, dame la gracia de estar dispuesto a sufrir cualquier cosa para nunca rechazarte.

Promesa: "Ustedes han oído que se dijo: 'Ojo por ojo y diente por diente'. Jesús tomó los cinco panes y los dos pescados y, levantando los ojos al cielo, pronunció sobre ellos la bendición, los partió y los fue entregando a sus discípulos para que se los sirviera a la multitud. Todos comieron hasta saciarse" (Lc 9:16-17).

Alabanza: Alaba a Jesús resucitado, que derramó su sangre para que podamos ser liberados.

— 1 Corintios 11:26

GENEROSIDAD DE POR VIDA

"Sepan que el que siembra mezquinamente, tendrá una cosecha muy pobre; en cambio, el que siembra con generosidad, cosechará abundantemente" (2 Corintios 9:6).

Nuestro dar en respuesta a la llamada de Dios implica mucho más que ser generoso en el día de dar. Podemos escribir un cheque generoso a una organización benéfica sin pensar en ellos ni antes ni después de la donación. Alternativamente, podemos orar por discernimiento de antemano y orar por ese ministerio caritativo después. Esto hace que nuestra donación sea aún más fructífera.

"El perezoso no ara en otoño, en la cosecha busca, y no hay nada" (Prov 20:4). El perezoso no era totalmente holgazán, ya que salió y sembró semilla en el campo. Sabemos esto porque se tomó el esfuerzo de salir y buscar una cosecha. Sin embargo, él no puso el esfuerzo de hacer el arado. Tal vez había arado el año anterior y esperaba todavía obtener una cosecha, a pesar de no haberlo hecho este año. Posiblemente esperó hasta el último minuto para arar, pero el mal tiempo lo impidió. O tal vez simplemente le dio pereza y no lo hizo, esperando obtener una buena cosecha de todos modos. El mensaje es que sencillamente sembrar semilla no es tan efectivo como hacer la plena diligencia con "generosidad de por vida".
