THE “10 MYTHS OF ANNULMENTS”

Annulment Myth #4: “Annulments are expensive. If you don’t have the money, you cannot get one.”

Truth: A formal case fee is \$600. However, no one is turned away due to lack of ability to pay.

Annulment Myth #5: “Once you submit the paperwork, it’s a slam dunk!”

Truth: There are no guarantees about an annulment. Each case is looked at individually because each situation is different. Not all cases are created equal. Some cases are much more complicated than others. Not all cases submitted are granted annulments.

Annulment Myth #6: “If you are a big donor to the Church, an annulment is always granted.”

Truth: Annulments cannot be bought. Donations, long-term participation in a parish, or being a “good Catholic” have no bearing on an annulment. One cannot “shop around” for an annulment; all tribunals follow the same procedures.

THE WOUNDED HEALER | *Henri Nouwen Society*

Nobody escapes being wounded. We all are wounded people, whether physically, emotionally, mentally, or spiritually. The main question is not "How can we hide our wounds?" so we don't have to be embarrassed, but "How can we put our woundedness in the service of others?" When our wounds cease to be a source of shame, and become a source of healing, we have become wounded healers.

Jesus is God's wounded healer: through his wounds we are healed. Jesus' suffering and death brought joy and life. His humiliation brought glory; his rejection brought a community of love. As followers of Jesus we can also allow our wounds to bring healing to others.

SOW THE WORD CONSTANTLY

"A farmer went out sowing." —Matthew 13:4

How often have you heard a Scripture passage twenty times and on the twenty-first time you hear it, the Holy Spirit makes the passage finally "jump off the page"? You receive a profound new insight into the meaning of the passage. The Word of God comes alive for you.

The Holy Spirit does this work in us. The Spirit is also working the same way in the hearts of others. That's why we must constantly sow the Word of God (Mt 13:4). The Word that we sow might be that twenty-first time the Holy Spirit requires to touch a person's heart. Our sowing might be that juicy bait the Lord uses to finally catch a hungry soul He has been working on for years (see Lk 5:4). Our evangelizing might be the seed that next year will produce a harvest thirty-, sixty-, or a hundredfold (Mt 13:8).

A farmer sowing seed can't see what's under the surface of the soil. A fisherman usually can't see what's under the surface of the water, though sometimes he might get a glimpse. When we evangelize for Jesus, if we go only by what we see on the surface, we might make a wrong judgment and decide not to drop a line or plant a seed. We might miss a good catch or a fruitful harvest, even in an unlikely place, if we don't try to evangelize.

God spreads the seed and the water everywhere in today's readings. God never stops sowing, and He always gets results (Is 55:11). The Lord doesn't go by what is on the surface (see 1 Sm 16:7). We must do the same, and sow the Word of God in all places, even those that seem unlikely for success.

Prayer: Father, I will spread Your Word at all times, whether convenient or inconvenient (2 Tm 4:2).

Promise: "I consider the sufferings of the present to be as nothing compared to the glory to be revealed in us." —Rm 8:18

Praise: Praise You, risen Jesus! You are "the Way, and the Truth, and the Life" (Jn 14:6). Alleluia!

THE REAL PRESENCE OF JESUS CHRIST IN THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST: BASIC QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Does the bread cease to be bread and the wine cease to be wine?

Yes. In order for the whole Christ to be present—body, blood, soul, and divinity—the bread and wine cannot remain, but must give way so that his glorified Body and Blood may be present. Thus in the Eucharist the bread ceases to be bread in substance, and becomes the Body of Christ, while the wine ceases to be wine in substance, and becomes the Blood of Christ. As St. Thomas Aquinas observed, Christ is not quoted as saying, " This bread is my body," but " This is my body" (Summa Theologiae, III q. 78, a. 5).

Is it fitting that Christ's Body and Blood become present in the Eucharist under the appearances of bread and wine?

Yes, for this way of being present corresponds perfectly to the sacramental celebration of the Eucharist. Jesus Christ gives himself to us in a form that employs the symbolism inherent in eating bread and drinking wine. Furthermore, being present under the appearances of bread and wine, Christ gives himself to us in a form that is appropriate for human eating and drinking. Also, this kind of presence corresponds to the virtue of faith, for the presence of the Body and Blood of Christ cannot be detected or discerned by any way other than faith. That is why St. Bonaventure affirmed: "There is no difficulty over Christ's being present in the sacrament as in a sign; the great difficulty is in the fact that He is really in the sacrament, as He is in heaven. And so believing this is especially meritorious" (In IV Sent., dist. X, P. I, art. un., qu. I). On the authority of God who reveals himself to us, by faith we believe that which cannot be grasped by our human faculties (cf. Catechism, no. 1381).



LA PRESENCIA REAL DE JESUCRISTO EN EL SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCHARISTÍA PREGUNTAS BÁSICAS Y RESPUESTAS CONTINUACIÓN...

El pan y el vino Consagrados, ¿son "simplemente símbolos"?

En el lenguaje cotidiano, llamamos "símbolo" a algo que señala alguna otra cosa que está más allá de sí, a menudo a otras diferentes realidades a la vez. El pan y el vino transformados que constituyen el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo no son simplemente símbolos, porque son verdaderamente el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Como escribió S. Juan Damasceno: "El pan y el vino no son una prefiguración del cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo, ¡de ninguna manera!, sino el verdadero cuerpo deificado del Señor, porque el Señor mismo dijo: 'Esto es mi cuerpo'; no 'una prefiguración de mi cuerpo', sino 'mi cuerpo', y no 'una prefiguración de mi sangre' sino 'mi sangre'" (De la fe ortodoxa, IV [PG 94, 1148-49]).

Al mismo tiempo, sin embargo, es importante reconocer que el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo llegan a nosotros en la Eucaristía en una forma sacramental. En otras palabras, Cristo está presente bajo la apariencia de pan y vino, no en su propia y verdadera forma. No podemos presumir que sabemos todas las razones subyacentes a los actos de Dios. Sin embargo, Dios emplea el simbolismo inherente a comer pan y beber vino en el ámbito de lo natural para iluminar el significado de lo que se está realizando en la Eucaristía por medio de Jesucristo.

SIEMBRA LA PALABRA CONSTANTEMENTE

"El sembrador salió a sembrar" (Mateo 13, 3).

¿Con qué frecuencia has oído un pasaje de la Escritura veinte veces y en la veintiuna vez lo oyes, el Espíritu Santo hace que el pasaje finalmente "salte de la página"? Recibes una profunda y nueva comprensión del significado del pasaje. La Palabra de Dios cobra vida para ti.

El Espíritu Santo hace este trabajo en nosotros. El Espíritu también está trabajando de igual manera en el corazón de otros. Por eso, debemos sembrar constantemente la Palabra de Dios (Mt 13, 4). La Palabra que sembramos podría ser la veintiuna vez que el Espíritu Santo requiere para tocar el corazón de una persona. Nuestra siembra podría ser esa jugosa carnada que el Señor utiliza para finalmente atrapar un alma hambrienta en la que ha estado trabajando por años (ver Lc 5, 4). Nuestra evangelización podría ser la semilla que el año próximo produzca una cosecha de treinta, sesenta o cien veces (Mt 13, 8).

Un granjero sembrando semilla no puede ver qué hay debajo del suelo. Un pescador no puede ver usualmente lo que está debajo de la superficie del agua, aunque algunas veces pueda tener una visión. Cuando evangelizamos para Jesús, si nos dejamos llevar por lo que vemos en la superficie, podríamos juzgar mal y decidir no lanzar el anzuelo o plantar una semilla. Podríamos perder una buena pesca o una cosecha fructífera, incluso en un lugar improbable, si no tratamos de evangelizar.

Dios esparce la semilla y el agua por todas partes en las lecturas de hoy. Dios nunca deja de sembrar y Él siempre obtiene resultados (Is 55, 11). El Señor no se deja llevar por lo que está en la superficie (ver 1 Sm 16, 7).

Nosotros debemos hacer lo mismo, y sembrar la Palabra de Dios en todos los lugares, aún en aquellos en los que el éxito parece improbable.

Oración: Padre, sembraré tu Palabra en todo tiempo, sea conveniente o inconveniente (2 Tim 4, 2).

Promesa: "Yo considero que los sufrimientos del tiempo presente no pueden compararse con la gloria futura que se revelará en nosotros" (Rom 8, 18).
