OUR CAPACITY FOR SELF-DECEPTION | "Do you still not understand?" —Mark 8:21

Jesus multiplied five loaves to feed five thousand men and several thousand women and children (Mk 6:38-44). He repeated this miracle on another occasion using seven loaves (Mk 8:5-9). Both times there were more leftovers than the food Jesus started with (Mk 8:19-20). After these two amazing miracles, the Pharisees blindly asked Jesus for a sign (Mk 8:11). Jesus sighed "from the depths of His spirit" (Mk 8:12). Jesus' disciples were also blind to reality. He questioned them: "Do you still not see or comprehend? Are your minds completely blinded? Have you eyes but no sight? Ears but no hearing?" (Mk 8:17-18)

The obtuseness (see Mk 7:22) and self-deception of the human person is alarming. We can see a miracle right before our eyes and yet miss it completely. We can kill millions of babies in the womb and just pretend, contrary to all biological and scientific data, that they are not really human beings. We can bomb our enemies and say we are really loving them because we are fighting a "just war." We can stare at pornographic garbage on prime-time TV or our handheld electronic device and call it entertainment. The human capacity for self-deception is terrifying.

We would deceive ourselves all the way to hell but for the grace and light of Jesus. We need Jesus desperately. He alone is the Truth (Jn 14:6).

REFLECTIONS

Dear Johan,

My mom requested to be cremated. I was surprised. She is very Catholic. And though I know the Catholic Church allows for cremation, I am not entirely comfortable with it. Any advice?

Gentle reader,

Though explicit legislation forbidding cremation is relatively new, it has been the ancient custom for Catholics not to be cremated. Early Christians followed the Jewish custom of burying the bodies of the deceased. Jesus himself was laid in a tomb. And even when Christianity spread through the Roman Empire, where cremation was quite common, they retained the custom of burying their dead. Cremation more or less disappeared together with the Roman Empire, except maybe at times of overwhelming death by disease such as during epidemics of the plague.

Around the turn of the twentieth century cremation started to be practiced again in Europe. The Catholic Church interpreted this as a denial of the resurrection and ruled against the practice in the 1917 Code of Canon Law, even forbidding a funeral Mass for those who had been cremated. In 1963 this ban was lifted and the new Code of Canon Law of 1983 was adapted accordingly. In a 1997 appendix to the Order of Christian Funerals, the Congregation for Divine Worship approved cremation as an acceptable practice for Catholics.

However, though cremation is now permitted in the Catholic Church, there are a couple conditions. One, the preference is to have the body present for the funeral and that cremation takes place following the service. Nevertheless, the rite also makes provision for the possibility of cremation before the funeral service. In this case the cremated remains should be present at the funeral liturgy.

Two, the cremated remains are to be treated in the same way as the body would be treated. This means that the cremated remains should be buried properly. This precludes the scattering of remains in oceans and over mountaintops. It also precludes the keeping of cremated remains on one's mantle or in one's dresser.

As long as you observe the above you can feel completely comfortable fulfilling your mom's wishes.

The ashes are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration of the previous year. The ashes are christened with Holy Water and are scented by exposure to incense. While the ashes symbolize penance and contrition, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts. His Divine mercy is of utmost importance during the season of Lent, and the Church calls on us to seek that mercy during the entire Lenten season with reflection, prayer and penance.

- 5.2.5. La consulta en las Iglesias particulares se desarrollará a través de los órganos de participación previstos en el derecho, sin excluir otras modalidades que se juzguen oportunas para que la consulta sea real y eficaz (cf. *Episcopalis Communio*, 6).
- 5.2.6. La consulta al Pueblo de Dios en cada Iglesia particular se clausurará con una reunión pre-sinodal, que será el momento culminante del discernimiento diocesano.
- 5.2.7. Tras la clausura de la fase diocesana, cada Iglesia particular enviará sus aportaciones a la Conferencia Episcopal en una fecha fijada por la propia Conferencia Episcopal. En las Iglesias orientales se enviarán a los organismos correspondientes.

CONFERENCIAS EPISCOPALES U ORGANISMOS CORRESPONDIENTES:

- 5.2.8. Se abrirá un período de discernimiento de los pastores reunidos en asamblea (Conferencia Episcopal), a los que se pide escuchar lo que el Espíritu ha suscitado en las Iglesias a ellos confiadas.
- 5.2.9. En el proceso de redacción de la síntesis participarán también el responsable de la Conferencia Episcopal en lo que se refiere al proceso sinodal y su equipo, así como los representantes elegidos para participar en la Asamblea General Ordinaria del Sínodo en Roma, una vez ratificados por el Santo Padre.

PROFUNDA ALEGRÍA

“Antes de ser afligido, estaba descariado; pero ahora cumplo Tu palabra” (Salmos 119:67).

Lunes, 14 de febrero de 2022; San Cirilo y San Metodio | Sant 1:1-11; Sal 119:67-68, 71-72, 75-76; Mar 8:11-13
La Biblia nos dice que no solo nos regocijemos en cualquier clase de pruebas, sino que nos “alegremos profundamente” (Stg 1:2). Estamos muy felices porque la fe al ser probada “produce la paciencia” (Stg 1:3). Esta paciencia eventualmente los conducirá “a la perfección y a la madurez, sin que les falte nada” (Stg 1:4). Nos regocijamos en “cualquier clase de pruebas” (Stg 1:2) porque deseamos la madurez más que la comodidad y el placer. Deseamos servir a Dios y a Su pueblo de manera poderosa y eficaz más de lo que deseamos sentirnos bien. En última instancia, queremos ser maduros porque estamos enamorados del Señor. El amor es más fuerte que uno mismo, el miedo, el dolor, el sufrimiento o la muerte. El amor eclipsa incluso nuestras pruebas más severas.

Por tanto, regocijense para “que puedan compartir los sufrimientos de Cristo. Así, cuando se manifieste su gloria, ustedes también desbordarán de gozo y de alegría” (1 Pe 4:13). Toma tu cruz diaria con gratitud (Lc 9:23). Encuentra tu gozo en el sufrimiento que soportas por el Cuerpo de Cristo, que es la Iglesia (Col 1:24). “Esto procede de Dios, que les ha concedido a ustedes la gracia, no solamente de creer en Cristo, sino también de sufrir por Él” (Fil 1:29). “Por eso, ustedes se regocijan a pesar de las diversas pruebas que deben sufrir momentáneamente: así, la fe de ustedes”, una vez puesta a prueba, será mucho más valiosa (1 Pe 1:6-7). Regocijate en el amor del Señor siempre. “¡Vuelvo a insistir, alégrese!” (Fil 4:4).

Oración: Señor, Tu amor es mejor que la vida (Sal 63:4). Te amo.

Promesa: “Si a alguno de ustedes le falta sabiduría, que la pida a Dios, y la recibirá, porque Él la da a todos generosamente, sin exigir nada en cambio” (Stg 1:5).

Alabanza: Los santos Cirilo y Metodio nacieron en Grecia. Cirilo tenía una gran educación y Metodio ocupó brevemente un cargo gubernamental. Los piadosos hermanos respondieron más tarde a un llamado a evangelizar a los pueblos eslavos.

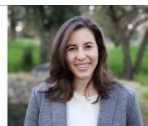
