

A NONJUDGMENTAL PRESENCE | *Henri Nouwen Society*

To the degree that we accept that through Christ we ourselves have been reconciled with God we can be messengers of reconciliation for others. Essential to the work of reconciliation is a nonjudgmental presence. We are not sent to the world to judge, to condemn, to evaluate, to classify, or to label. When we walk around as if we have to make up our mind about people and tell them what is wrong with them and how they should change, we will only create more division. Jesus says it clearly: "Be compassionate just as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge; ... do not condemn; ... forgive" (Luke 6:36-37).

In a world that constantly asks us to make up our minds about other people, a nonjudgmental presence seems nearly impossible. But it is one of the most beautiful fruits of a deep spiritual life and will be easily recognized by those who long for reconciliation.

BEING SAFE PLACES FOR OTHERS |

Henri Nouwen Society

When we are free from the need to judge or condemn, we can become safe places for people to meet in vulnerability and take down the walls that separate them. Being deeply rooted in the love of God, we cannot help but invite people to love one another. When people realize that we have no hidden agendas or unspoken intentions, that we are not trying to gain any profit for ourselves, and that our only desire is for peace and reconciliation, they may find the inner freedom and courage to leave their guns at the door and enter into conversation with their enemies. Many times, this happens even without our planning. Our ministry of reconciliation most often takes place when we ourselves are least aware of it. Our simple, nonjudgmental presence does it.

HOLDING ON TO THE CHRIST | *Henri Nouwen Society*

Life is unpredictable. We can be happy one day and sad the next, healthy one day and sick the next, rich one day and poor the next, alive one day and dead the next. So who is there to hold on to? Who is there to feel secure with? Who is there to trust at all times?

Only Jesus, the Christ. He is our Lord, our shepherd, our rock, our stronghold, our refuge, our brother, our guide, and our friend. He came from God to be with us. He died for us, he was raised from the dead to open for us the way to God, and he is seated at God's right hand to welcome us home. With Paul, we must be certain that "neither death nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nothing already in existence and nothing still to come, nor any power, nor the heights nor the depths, nor any created thing whatever, will be able to come between us and the love of God, known to us in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39).

THE TASK OF RECONCILIATION | *Henri Nouwen Society*

What is our task in this world as children of God and brothers and sisters of Jesus? Our task is reconciliation. Wherever we go we see divisions among people - in families, communities, cities, countries, and continents. All these divisions are tragic reflections of our separation from God. The truth that all people belong together as members of one family under God is seldom visible. Our sacred task is to reveal that truth in the reality of everyday life.

Why is that our task? Because God sent Christ to reconcile us with God and to give us the task of reconciling people with one another. As people reconcile with God through Christ we have been given the ministry of reconciliation" (see: 2 Corinthians 5:18). So whatever we do the main question is, Does it lead to reconciliation among people?

CLAIMING OUR RECONCILIATION | *Henri Nouwen Society*

How do we work for reconciliation? First and foremost by claiming for ourselves that God through Christ has reconciled us to God. It is not enough to believe this with our heads. We have to let the truth of this reconciliation permeate every part of our beings. As long as we are not fully and thoroughly convinced that we have been reconciled with God, that we are forgiven, that we have received new hearts, new spirits, new eyes to see, and new ears to hear, we continue to create divisions among people because we expect from them a healing power they do not possess.

Only when we fully trust that we belong to God and can find in our relationship with God all that we need for our minds, hearts, and souls, can we be truly free in this world and be ministers of reconciliation. This is not easy; we readily fall back into self-doubt and self-rejection. We need to be constantly reminded through God's Word, the sacraments, and the love of our neighbors that we are indeed reconciled.

HEROD UNDERSTOOD

The wise men "from the east arrived one day in Jerusalem inquiring, 'Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We observed His star at its rising and have come to pay Him homage.' At this news King Herod became greatly disturbed, and with him all Jerusalem." —Matthew 2:1-3

Herod understood the significance of Jesus' birth. He knew that he had to join the wise men and "go and offer [Jesus] homage too" (Mt 2:8). Jesus' birth means we must either surrender our lives to Jesus or declare war on Him. We either live no longer for ourselves but for Him (2 Cor 5:15), or we make a violent, pathetic attempt to keep Jesus from living any longer. We die to self (see Jn 12:24) or try to make Him die. Herod understood that the consequences of Jesus' birth would be Calvary. There is a competition for allegiance to "the newborn King of the Jews" (Mt 2:2) and of the world. We will either decide to be crucified to the world (Gal 6:14) or decide to crucify the King of the world. There's not enough room in this world for your ego and the incarnate Son of God. One or the other has got to go.

Dethrone yourself and enthrone Jesus as your King, Savior, and Lord. Be a wise man or woman. Otherwise you will have no choice other than to be a Herod. Be one of the wise men and women. Prostrate yourself and humble yourself before Jesus (Mt 2:11; 23:12). Happy Epiphany!

Prayer: "Lord, every nation on earth will adore You" (today's Psalm response).

Promise: "Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the Lord shines, and over you appears His glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance." —Is 60:1-3

Praise: Jesus still reveals Himself to wise men and wise women. Praise You, Jesus, Wisdom incarnate (1 Cor 1:30). Alleluia!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Where on earth would you go to honor the magi? Iran or Saudi Arabia, Tarshish or the Isles come to mind, but Cologne, Germany would be a good choice. There the Shrine of the Three Kings has been the centerpiece of the city's cathedral since the fourth century. Today it is the largest reliquary in the world: a gilded and ornamented triple casket gleaming high above the altar. In the fourth century, the supposed relics of the wise men were taken from Constantinople to Milan, where they remained until the German Emperor with the unlikely name Frederick Barbarossa (Red Beard) gave them to the Archbishop of Cologne. Ever since, pilgrims have streamed into the city to honor the magi, the first of all pilgrims, and thus the heavenly patrons of all who have some holy wanderlust.

This largest Gothic cathedral in Europe today was begun in the mid-1200s to house the relics. In medieval times, the relics in a city's possession were often the key to a sound international economy. The reliquary was last opened in 1864, and the remains of three men were indeed discovered. The cathedral is well worth a visit, with enormous twin spires forming the largest façade of any church in the world (it is the model for St. Patrick's in New York). Construction began in 1248 and ended in 1880, a six-hundred-year project. Today, it is a World Heritage Site, described by the U.N. as "an exceptional work of human creative genius." This great treasure of our tradition suffered fourteen direct bomb hits in World War II but did not collapse. It survived while the city burned around it, preserved, the townspeople say, by three heavenly patrons.

MISERIA NAVIDEÑA

"Dios nos dio la Vida eterna, y esa Vida está en su Hijo"
(1 Juan 5:11).

A todos les preguntamos si han tenido buenas vacaciones y Navidad, y todos dicen "bien". Pero, detrás de esas sonrisas tristes y entre las líneas de nuestra "charla", detectamos un dolor profundo, depresión grave, pecado impenitente y una esclavitud devastadora. Los matrimonios están destruidos; amargura y resentimiento envenenan la vida familiar; corazones quebrados por el rechazo. Algunos lamentan la muerte y la pérdida de seres queridos. Otros han perdido contacto con Dios a causa del pecado y del egoísmo. Muchos han pasado una Navidad terrible.

Tú no tienes que poner una sonrisa falsa y contarle a Jesús sobre tu "feliz" Navidad. Él ve tu pecado, tu dolor y tu "lepra". Haz una reverencia profunda ante el niño Jesús y dile: "Señor, si quieres, puedes purificarme" (Lc 5:12). Jesús extenderá Su mano, Te tocará y dirá: "Lo quiero, queda purificado" (Lc 5:13). Jesús quiere una Feliz Navidad para nosotros. Él quiere vida, arrepentimiento y sanación. Él quiere salvación para nosotros. Recuerda los obreros de la viña que reciben pago de día completo a pesar de que se contrataron a última hora (Mt 20:9). Jesús quiere darte la plenitud de la Navidad, no importa lo que haya sucedido y cuan tarde sea. "Les he escrito estas cosas, a ustedes que creen en el nombre del Hijo de Dios, para que sepan que tienen la Vida eterna" (1 Jn 5:13).

Oración: Padre, no por mis fuerzas, no por mi poder, sino por Tu Espíritu, voy a tener Navidad (Zac 4:6).

HERODES COMPRENDIÓ

Unos magos "de Oriente se presentaron en Jerusalén y preguntaron: '¿Dónde está el rey de los judíos que acaba de nacer? Porque vimos su estrella en Oriente y hemos venido a adorarlo'. Al enterarse, el rey Herodes quedó desconcertado y con él toda Jerusalén" (Mateo 2:1-3).

Herodes comprendió el significado del nacimiento de Jesús. Él sabía que tenía que unirse con los magos y "también ir a rendirle homenaje [a Jesús]" (Mt 2:8). El nacimiento de Jesús significa que tenemos que rendir nuestra vida a Jesús, o declararle la guerra a Él. O nosotros no vivimos más para nosotros mismos sino para Él (2 Co 5:15), o hacemos un esfuerzo violento y patético intento de evitar que Jesús siga viviendo. O morimos a sí mismos (ver Jn 12:24) o tratamos de hacer que Él muera.

Herodes comprendió que la consecuencia del nacimiento de Jesús sería el Calvario. Hay una competencia entre la lealtad "al recién nacido rey de los judíos" (Mt 2:2) y al mundo. O decidimos ser crucificados al mundo (Gal 6:14) o decidimos crucificar al rey del mundo. No hay bastante lugar en este mundo para tu egoísmo y el hijo de Dios encarnado. Uno o el otro tiene que irse. Destróntate y entrona a Jesús como tu Rey, Salvador y Señor. Sé un hombre sabio o una mujer sabia. O si no, no tendrás otra escogencia que ser un Herodes. Sé uno de los magos. Póstrate y humíllate ante Jesús (Mt 2:11; 23:12). ¡Feliz Epifanía!
