BAPTISM, A CALL TO COMMITMENT

Henri Nouwen Society

Baptism as a way to the freedom of the children of God and as a way to a life in community calls for a personal commitment. There is nothing magical or automatic about this sacrament. Having water poured over us while someone says, "I baptize you in the Name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit," has lasting significance when we are willing to claim and reclaim in all possible ways the spiritual truth of who we are as baptized people. In this sense baptism is a call to parents of baptized children and to the baptized themselves to choose constantly for the light in the midst of a dark world and for life in the midst of a death-harboring society.

EUCHARIST, THE SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION

Baptism opens the door to the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the sacrament through which Jesus enters into an intimate, permanent communion with us. It is the sacrament of the table. It is the sacrament of food and drink. It is the sacrament of daily nurture. While baptism is a once-in-a-lifetime event, the Eucharist can be a monthly, weekly, or even daily occurrence. Jesus gave us the Eucharist as a constant memory of his life and death. Not a memory that simply makes us think of him but a memory that makes us members of his body. That is why Jesus on the evening before he died took bread saying, "This is my Body," and took the cup saying, "This is my Blood." By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ, we become one with him.

BAPTISM, A RITE OF PASSAGE | *Henri Nouwen Society*

Baptism is a rite of passage. The Jewish people passed through the Red Sea to the Promised Land in the great exodus. Jesus himself wanted to make this exodus by passing through suffering and death into the house of his heavenly Father. This was his baptism. He asked his disciples and now asks us: "Can you ... be baptized with the baptism with which I shall be baptized?" (Mark 10:38). When the apostle Paul, therefore, speaks about our baptism, he calls it a baptism into Jesus' death (Romans 6:4). To be baptized means to make the passage with the people of Israel and with Jesus from slavery to freedom and from death to new life. It is a commitment to a life in and through Jesus.

BAPTISM, THE WAY TO FREEDOM

When parents have their children baptized they indicate their desire to have their children grow up and live as children of God and brothers or sisters of Jesus, and be guided by the Holy Spirit.

Through birth a child is given to parents; through baptism a child is given to God. At baptism the parents acknowledge that their parenthood is a participation in God's parenthood, that all fatherhood and motherhood comes from God. Thus baptism frees the parents from a sense of owning their children. Children belong to God and are given to the parents to love and care for in God's name. It is the parents' vocation to welcome their children as honored guests in their home and bring them to the physical, emotional, and spiritual freedom that enables them to leave the home and become parents themselves. Baptism reminds parents of this vocation and sets children on the path of freedom.

BAPTISM, THE WAY TO COMMUNITY

Baptism is more than a way to spiritual freedom. It also is the way to community. Baptizing a person, whether child or adult, is receiving that person into the community of faith. Those who are reborn from above through baptism, and are called to live the life of sons and daughters of God, belong together as members of one spiritual family, the living body of Christ. When we baptize people, we welcome them into this family of God and offer them guidance, support, and formation, as they grow to the full maturity of the Christ-like life.

"COME TO THE FEAST" (Mt 22:4)

"He will destroy death forever." —Isaiah 25:8

Fifteen years ago this week, I received a phone call informing me that Father Al Lauer, founder and long-time author of *One Bread, One Body*, died. Father Al had been suffering from cancer of the liver. That same morning, Mass was celebrated in Father's bedroom. The Word of God came to life in that Mass as today's Scripture readings, which were also proclaimed in 2002 in the repeating Sunday liturgical cycle, proclaimed the glorious future that would lie in store for this dying, saintly man of faith. On his last day on earth, Father heard the Word of God promise him:

"I shall dwell in the house of the Lord" (Ps 23:6).

"On that day it will be said: 'Behold our God, to Whom we looked to save us! This is the Lord for Whom we looked; let us rejoice and be glad that He has saved us!' " (Is 25:9)

"Tell those who were invited, See, I have My dinner prepared!... Everything is ready. Come to the feast" (Mt 22:4).

"My God in turn will supply your needs fully, in a way worthy of His magnificent riches in Christ Jesus. All glory to our God and Father for unending ages!" (Phil 4:19-20)

"Happy now are the dead who die in the Lord! The Spirit added, 'Yes, they shall find rest from their labors, for their good works accompany them' " (Rv 14:13). Father's motto in his parish ministry was: "Fix your eyes on Jesus" (Heb 3:1). We rejoice to know that Father Al's eyes are forever fixed on Jesus!

Prayer: Father, grant eternal rest to the soul of Father Al Lauer and to all the souls of the faithful departed.

"VENGAN A LAS BODAS" (MT 22:4)

"Destruirá la Muerte para siempre" (Isaías 25:8).

Esta semana, hace quince años, recibí una llamada telefónica informándome que el padre Al Lauer, fundador y autor por muchos años de Un Pan, Un Cuerpo, había fallecido. El padre Al había estado padeciendo de cáncer de hígado. Esa misma mañana, la Misa fue celebrada en su habitación. Durante la Misa, la Palabra de Dios se transformó en vida como ocurre con la lectura de hoy, proclamada también en el ciclo litúrgico del domingo del 2002, la cual anunciaba el futuro glorioso reservado para este moribundo y santo hombre de fe. En su último día en la tierra, padre Al escuchó que la palabra de Dios le prometía:

- ◆ "...Habitaré en la Casa del Señor" (Sal 23:6).
- ◆ "Y se dirá en aquel día: 'Ahí está nuestro Dios, de quien esperábamos la salvación: es el Señor, en quien nosotros esperábamos; ¡alegrémonos y regocijémonos de su salvación!' " (Is 25:9)
- ◆ "...envió a otros servidores con el encargo de decir a los invitados: 'Mi banquete está preparado; ya han sido matados mis terneros y mis mejores animales, y todo está a punto: Vengan a las bodas' " (Mt 22:4).
