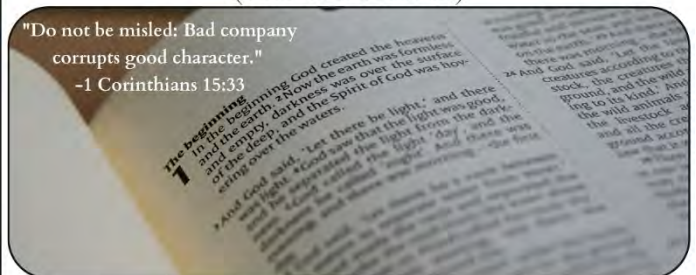

REFLECTIONS

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME | “HE ALONE IS LORD

In the scriptures, being anointed usually meant you were a prophet or king of Israel. So why is Cyrus given that title? Cyrus was king of Persia when the Babylonians held the people of Israel captive. God used him to defeat the Babylonians and eventually bring the Israelites back to their homes.

One thing this tells us is that God can work through anyone, not just saints and religious. Any time someone does a good deed, God is behind it. Just as God used Cyrus to free the Israelites from their Babylonian captivity, God can use governments to protect the poor, to help rebuild after disasters, or to defend freedom.

In that sense, we can understand what Jesus says about payment to Caesar and to God. Since everything belongs to God, that should be our first allegiance. But when God works through governments, we can give some support to them, by such activities as voting or paying taxes. Let us ask God to work through us also, helping us to proclaim that God alone is Lord.

LABOURÉ TO THE RESCUE STUDENT DEBT? NO PROBLEM

What if a young Catholic feels called, but has too much student debt to enter the seminary or convent? It's a serious problem that has put the brakes on many vocations. A young woman with \$50k in student loans simply can't expect a religious order to assume her debt.

Fortunately, there's a solution. The Labouré Society is responsible for rescuing hundreds of vocations, helping young men and women who otherwise could not have pursued God's call.

Labouré doesn't simply pay off student loans. Instead, they organize young people into "classes" and train them how to fundraise as a group. Depending on the level of debt, it can take six months to a couple of years of fundraising. Graduates of the program say it didn't just help them enter formation; it solidified their call and taught valuable lessons about working within the Church with all kinds of people.

If a young man gives seminary a try and later decides to "discern out," the donations he received go to other candidates, which satisfies both the donors and the IRS. To learn more or make a donation, visit rescuevocations.org.



180-DAY DISCERNMENT CHALLENGE

"As I worked with young men, I began to see that they needed more structure in their lives, especially while they're seeking to know their vocations," said Fr. Greg Gerhart, the Vocation Director for the Diocese of Austin. To help men on their journey, Fr. Greg created Discernment 180, a "rule of life" for six months of deep discernment, with daily readings and specific spiritual practices. "It's already borne incredible fruit in our diocese," he said. "Three of our new seminarians completed D180 before entering." Now the program is free for anyone to use at discernment180.com



U.S. SEMINARIES

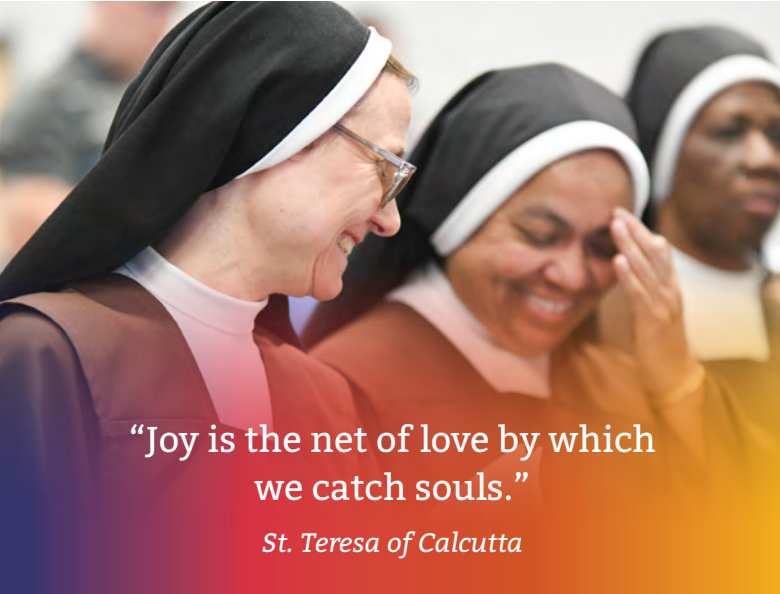
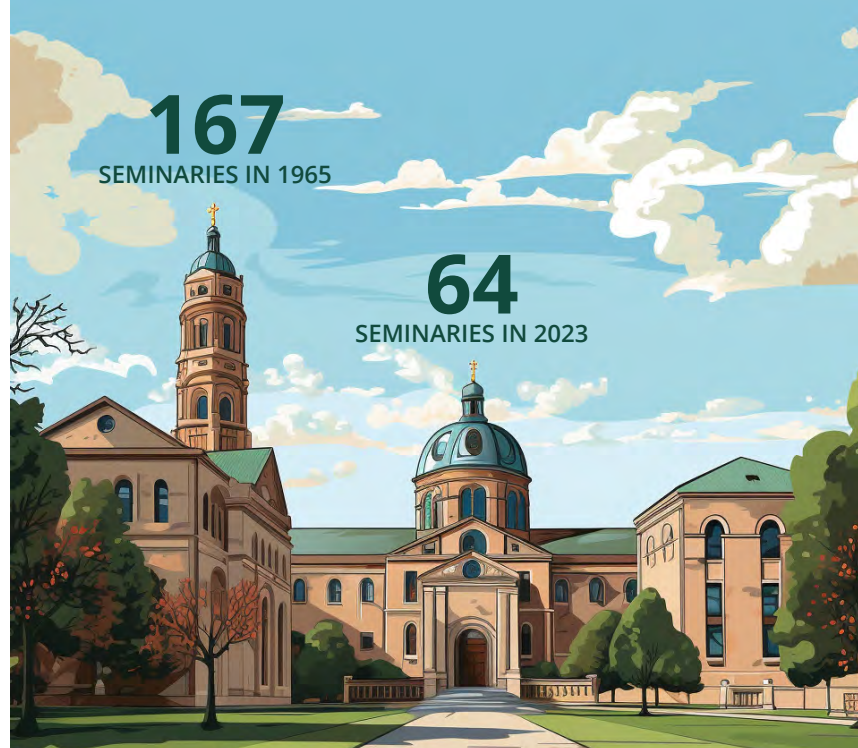
FEWER BUT STRONGER

We sometimes hear that seminaries in the U.S. are nearly full, which is true of many—but mainly because we have a hundred fewer seminaries than sixty years ago.

The Church envisions that in ideal circumstances, every diocese would have its own seminary. But fewer men in formation and scarce resources mean that most seminaries operate as regional institutions.

Ask any seminary rector, and he'll tell you that the scarcest resource is not money, but *personnel*—in particular, diocesan priests who are released by their bishops to leave parish ministry and serve in the seminary as spiritual directors.

Please pray for our men in formation and for the generous priests who serve as their mentors.

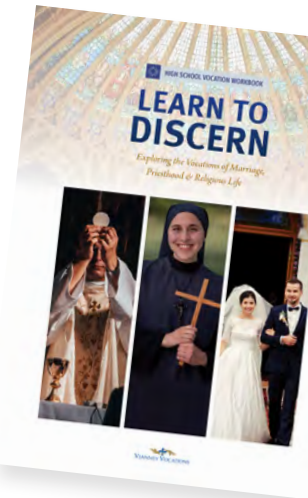

REFLEXIONES

EL IMPACTO DE OBEDECER A DIOS

“Pero me diste un oído atento...” (Salmos 40:7).

El pecado es rebelión contra un Dios todo santo. Debido a que Dios es tan grande, el pecado es muy malo, tan malo que penetró y torció la naturaleza humana. “Por un solo hombre entró el pecado en el mundo, y por el pecado la muerte” (Rom 5:12). Los efectos del pecado fueron tan catastróficos que Dios se hizo hombre, murió en la cruz y nos dio la oportunidad de nacer de nuevo a una nueva naturaleza (ver Jn 3:3).

Tan poderoso como es el pecado, la obediencia de Jesús es mucho más poderosa. “Y de la misma manera que por la desobediencia de un solo hombre, todos se convirtieron en pecadores, también por la obediencia de uno solo, todos se convertirán en justos. Es verdad que la Ley entró para que se multiplicaran las transgresiones, pero donde abundó el pecado, sobreabundó la gracia” (Rom 5:19-20). La obediencia de Jesús hasta la muerte en la cruz (Filipenses 2:8) es el acto de amor más grande jamás realizado en esta tierra. Por lo tanto, obedecer al Padre como lo hizo Jesús es un privilegio impresionante en el que entramos en el corazón del poder y el amor de Dios. Debería sorprendernos que el Señor nos haya elegido para obedecerle y ser sus servidores (ver Col 3:24). ¿Por qué Dios debería incluirnos? ¿Por qué Dios alguna vez nos ordenaría hacer algo? ¿Por qué elegiría obrar por medio de nosotros? Además, el Señor en Su amor por nosotros nos da oportunidades constantes para obedecerle. Si tuviéramos una sola oportunidad de obedecer al Señor, planearíamos y centraríamos nuestras vidas en torno a este precioso momento de obediencia. Podemos vivir constantemente en obediencia. Que nos demos cuenta del privilegio de obedecer a Dios. Que estemos constantemente asombrados de que Dios alguna vez nos ordene hacer algo.

Sorpréndete de que seamos libres para pecar y hayamos pecado. Sorpréndete aún más de que podamos obedecer a Dios Todopoderoso.

En las Escrituras, ser ungido generalmente significaba que eras un profeta o rey de Israel. Entonces, ¿por qué se le da a Ciro ese título? Ciro era rey de Persia cuando los babilonios tenían cautivo al pueblo de Israel. Dios lo usó para derrotar a los babilonios y finalmente traer a los israelitas de regreso a sus hogares.

Una cosa que esto nos dice es que Dios puede obrar a través de cualquier persona, no solo de los santos y los religiosos. Cada vez que alguien hace una buena obra, Dios está detrás de ella. Así como Dios usó a Ciro para liberar a los israelitas de su cautiverio en Babilonia, Dios puede usar a los gobiernos para proteger a los pobres, ayudar a reconstruir después de los desastres o defender la libertad.

En ese sentido, podemos entender lo que dice Jesús sobre el pago al César y a Dios. Dado que todo pertenece a Dios, esa debe ser nuestra primera lealtad. Pero cuando Dios obra a través de los gobiernos, podemos brindarles un apoyo mediante actividades como votar o pagar impuestos. Pidámosle a Dios que actúe también a través de nosotros, ayudándonos a proclamar que sólo Dios es Señor.

REFLEXIONES

LO QUE ES DE DIOS

Hay un versículo bíblico en mi calendario para el mes actual que dice: "Donde esté tu tesoro, allí estará también tu corazón" (Mateo 6:21). Los "tesoros" de la tierra eventualmente se desvanecen y desaparecen.

En el Evangelio de hoy, encontramos a los herodianos y fariseos unidos contra Cristo. El tesoro en este caso era una moneda y tenía la imagen de César. Aunque notoriamente estaban en desacuerdo, en este caso los herodianos y los fariseos tienen mucho en común: el amor por las cosas de este mundo. Sus prioridades son sus leyes y tradiciones, y dejan a un lado el amor por los que viven diferente a sus formas de ser.

Debo admitir que yo también muchas veces me distraigo. Tengo que preguntarme una y otra vez, ¿soy de este mundo o del Reino? ¿Pertenece a nuestro orgullo egoísta, o nos dedicamos hasta el último respiro únicamente a Dios? El centavo que en un momento parecía tener tanto valor rápidamente se volvió inútil. Así también con todo el estatus y la fama que uno deriva de la fortuna y la reputación.

Sorprendentemente, Cristo nos enseña a dar a César lo que es de César - el dinero, las posesiones mundanas - y a Dios, lo que es de Dios. Dar a Dios lo que es de Dios. Nosotros mismos hemos sido creados a imagen y semejanza de Dios. No ha cambiado mucho en el mundo de hoy, donde nuestras prioridades a menudo se confunden. Como padres, nos concentramos en nuestra reputación en el lugar de trabajo o en el estado financiero, en lugar de pasar el tiempo con aquellos que Dios nos ha confiado. Cristo nos recuerda que los verdaderos discípulos no se encuentran pertenecientes a las cadenas del dinero y las posesiones, sino sólo a Dios.

Celebramos este día recordando nuestra llamada bautismal: ¡llevar el Evangelio a todas las personas!
