LOOK UP AND GO OUT

"No sooner had He said this than He was lifted up before their eyes in a cloud which took Him from their sight." —Acts 1:9

The apostles asked Jesus: "Lord, are you going to restore the rule to Israel now?" (Acts 1:6) They were interested in knowing the time Jesus would restore the kingdom. Jesus responded: "The exact time it is not yours to know" (Acts 1:7). Then Jesus proceeded to bring up what He was interested in — not so much the time but the persons responsible for restoring the kingdom. The apostles had assumed Jesus would do the restoring. Jesus shocked them by asserting that they were to do the job. Before the apostles could try to shift the responsibility back onto Jesus, He ascended, leaving the apostles "holding the bag," that is, having the responsibility of making disciples of all the nations (see Mt 28:19). However, Jesus did not leave His Church responsible but powerless. He promised us the Spirit's power (Acts 1:8) and His presence "always, until the end of the world!" (Mt 28:20)

Jesus' Ascension means that we, the members of the Church, take up where Jesus has left off. The responsibility for evangelizing the world is ours; the power of the Holy Spirit is ours; and the privilege of living and dying for His kingdom is ours. Because He has gone up, we must go out. Go now.

Prayer: "God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory," grant us "a spirit of wisdom and insight to know" You clearly (Eph 1:17).

Promise: "He has put all things under Christ's feet and has made Him, thus exalted, Head of the Church, which is His body: the fullness of Him Who fills the universe in all its parts." —Eph 1:22-23

Praise: Praise the ascended Jesus, "seen by the angels; preached among the Gentiles, believed in throughout the world, taken up into glory" (1 Tm 3:16).

LOVE WILL REMAIN | Henri Nouwen Society

Hope and faith will both come to an end when we die. But love will remain. Love is eternal. Love comes from God and returns to God. When we die, we will lose everything that life gave us except love. JESUS' FREEDOM | Henri Nouwen Society

Jesus was truly free. His freedom was rooted in his spiritual awareness that he was the Beloved Child of God. He knew in the depth of his being that he belonged to God before he was born, that he was sent into the world to proclaim God's love, and that he would return to God after his mission was fulfilled. This knowledge gave him the freedom to speak and act without having to please the world and the power to respond to people's pains with the healing love of God.

That's why the Gospels say: "Everyone in the crowd was trying to touch him because power came out of him that cured them all" (Luke 6:19).

JESUS' COMPASSION | Henri Nouwen Society

Jesus is called Emmanuel which means "God-with-us" (see Matthew 1: 22-23). The great paradox of Jesus' life is that he, whose words and actions are in no way influenced by human blame or praise but are completely dependent on God's will, is more "with" us than any other human being.

Jesus' compassion, his deep feeling-with us, is possible because his life is guided not by human respect but only by the love of his heavenly Father. Indeed, Jesus is free to love us because he is not dependent on our love.

LA PRESENCIA REAL DE JESUCRISTO EN EL SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCARISTÍA PREGUNTAS BÁSICAS Y RESPUESTAS

CONTINUACIÓN...

1. ¿Por qué se da Jesús a nosotros como comida y bebida?

Jesús se da a nosotros como alimento espiritual en la Eucaristía porque nos ama. Todo el plan de Dios para nuestra salvación está dirigido a hacernos partícipes de la vida de la Trinidad, la comunión del Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo. Empezamos a participar en esta vida con nuestro Bautismo, cuando, por el poder del Espíritu Santo, nos unimos a Cristo, y nos convertimos así por adopción en hijos e hijas del Padre. Esta relación se fortalece y acrecienta en la Confirmación, y se nutre y profundiza mediante nuestra participación en la Eucaristía. Comiendo el Cuerpo y bebiendo la Sangre de Cristo en la Eucaristía llegamos a unirnos a la persona de Cristo a través de su humanidad.

"El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre, permanece en mí y yo en él" (Jn 6:56). Al estar unidos a la humanidad de Cristo estamos al mismo tiempo unidos a su divinidad. Nuestra naturaleza mortal y corruptible se transforma al unirse con la fuente de la vida. "Como el Padre, que me ha enviado, posee la vida y yo vivo por él, así también el que me come vivirá por mí" (Jn 6:57).

Al estar unidos a Cristo por el poder del Espíritu Santo que habita en nosotros, nos hacemos parte de la eterna relación de amor entre el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo. Como Jesús es por naturaleza el Hijo eterno de Dios, así nosotros nos hacemos hijos e hijas de Dios por adopción mediante el sacramento del Bautismo. Mediante los sacramentos del Bautismo y la Confirmación (Crismación), nos convertimos en templos del Espíritu Santo, que habita en nosotros, y al habitar en nosotros, somos ungidos con el don de la gracia santificante. La promesa última del Evangelio es que participaremos de la vida de la Santísima Trinidad. A esta participación en la vida divina los Padres de la Iglesia la llamaron "divinización" (theosis). En esto vemos que Dios no simplemente nos envía buenas cosas desde el cielo; por el contrario, somos introducidos también a la vida interior de Dios, a la comunión entre el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo. En la celebración de la Eucaristía (que significa "acción de gracias") damos alabanza y gloria a Dios por este sublime don.

MIRA HACIA ARRIBA Y SAL

"Dicho esto, los Apóstoles lo vieron elevarse y una nube lo ocultó de la vista de ellos" (Hechos 1, 9).

Los apóstoles le preguntaron a Jesús: "Señor, ¿es ahora cuando vas a restaurar el reino de Israel?" (Hch 1, 6) Ellos estaban interesados en saber el momento en que Jesús restauraría el reino. Jesús respondió: "No les corresponde a ustedes conocer el tiempo" (Hch 1, 7). Entonces Jesús procedió a comentar en lo que Él estaba interesado — no es tanto el tiempo, sino las personas responsables de la restauración del reino. Los apóstoles habían asumido que Jesús haría la reconstrucción. Jesús les sorprendió afirmando que ellos eran los que iban hacer el trabajo. Antes de que los apóstoles trataran de trasladar la responsabilidad a Jesús, Él ascendió, dejando a los apóstoles "estupefactos", es decir, teniendo la responsabilidad de hacer discípulos en todas las naciones (ver Mt 28, 19). Sin embargo, Jesús no dejó a su Iglesia responsable, pero sí sin poder. Él nos prometió la fuerza del Espíritu (Hch 1, 8) y su presencia "¡Yo estaré siempre con ustedes hasta el fin del mundo!" (Mt 28, 20).

La Ascensión de Jesús significa que nosotros, los miembros de la Iglesia, debemos continuar lo que Jesús nos dejó. Promesa: "Él puso todas las cosas bajo sus pies y lo constituyó, por encima de todo, Cabeza de la Iglesia, que es su Cuerpo y la Plenitud de Aquel que llena completamente todas las cosas" (Ef 1, 22-23).

Alabanza: Alabado Jesús ascendido "contemplado por los ángeles, proclamado a los paganos, creído en el mundo y elevado a la gloria" (1 Tim 3, 16).
