TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

It is often heard that today's observance is an "idea feast," and that it is somewhat difficult to grasp its meaning. Other great solemnities, such as Christmas and Easter, have an easily grasped core. Yet, even though the Trinity is at the heart of our faith, firmly declared in the Creed since the Council of Nicea in 325, we are used to having people shrug and say, "Well, it's a mystery."

Perhaps it is more helpful to think of this as a "relationship feast," since it unveils our deepest identity. Dorothy Day was a great social reformer, pacifist, and ardent lover of the Trinity. When people told her that she would certainly be canonized one day (the process is indeed underway), she protested dismissively by remarking that people were raising a fuss just because she was not afraid to talk about God. She loved the Trinity, and treasured the traditional icon for the feast, also known as "The Hospitality of Abraham," depicting the three angelic beings seated at a table tilted toward the viewer and laden with bread and wine. For her, the Trinity revealed the heart of the Catholic life, three C's if you will: community, communication, and communion. That was not an "idea" for her, but what it means to be created in the image of the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

TRIPLE PLAY | "Moses at once bowed down to the ground in worship." —Exodus 34:

A bishop was examining the candidates for Confirmation at a certain parish. He asked the young people to tell him what the Holy Trinity was. A boy answered: "It's one-in-three, and three-in-one." The bishop, gently probing to determine if the boy truly prepared for the sacrament, said: "That's good, but I don't understand." The youth immediately responded: "You're not supposed to!"

We can't ever grasp the how of the Holy Trinity, but we can know the Who. This is because God continually reveals Himself to us. "Yes, God so loved the world that He gave His only Son" (Jn 3:16) "to reveal" Himself more fully to us (Lk 10:22). The Father and the Son pour out Their love into our hearts through the Holy Spirit (Rm 5:5), Who constantly reminds us that we are now adopted children of God (Rm 8:15). Then the Holy Spirit helps us to know the Father so deeply that we can't help but "cry out, 'Abba!' (that is, 'Father')" (Rm 8:15; Gal 4:6).

When our heads start spinning in this cross-fire of Trinitarian love, we can respond as did Moses, bowing to the ground in worship (Ex 34:8). Rejoice exultantly with all the saints and angels, praising God "in the name 'of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit'" (Mt 28:19).

Prayer: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, grant that I may be caught up into the mystery of Your Triune love each day

Promise: "God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him." —Jn 3:17

Praise: "Praise the Holy Trinity, undivided Unity, holy God, mighty God, God immortal, be adored!"

GOD'S BREATH GIVEN TO US

Being the living Christ today means being filled with the same Spirit that filled Jesus. Jesus and his Father are breathing the same breath, the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the intimate communion that makes Jesus and his Father one. Jesus says: "I am in the Father and the Father is in me" (John 14:10) and "The Father and I are one" (John 10:30). It is this unity that Jesus wants to give us. That is the gift of his Holy Spirit.

Living a spiritual life, therefore, means living in the same communion with the Father as Jesus did, and thus making God present in the world. **Source: Henri Nouwen Society**

BEING CLOTHED IN CHRIST

Being a believer means being clothed in Christ. Paul says: "Every one of you that has been baptized has been clothed in Christ" (Galatians 3:26) and "Let your armor be the Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 13:14). This being "clothed in Christ" is much more than wearing a cloak that covers our misery. It refers to a total transformation that allows us to say with Paul: "I have been crucified with Christ and yet I am alive; yet it is no longer I, but Christ living in me" (Galatians 2:20).

Thus, we are the living Christ in the world. Jesus, who is God-made-flesh, continues to reveal himself in our own flesh. Indeed, true salvation is becoming Christ. **Source: Henri Nouwen Society**

JOINT HEIRS WITH CHRIST

We continue to put ourselves down as less than Christ. Thus, we avoid the full honor as well as the full pain of the Christian life. But the Spirit that guided Jesus guides us. Paul says: "The Spirit himself joins with our spirit to bear witness that we are children of God. And if we are children, then we are heirs, heirs of God and joint-heirs with Christ" (Romans 8:16-17).

When we start living according to this truth, our lives will be radically transformed. We will not only come to know the full freedom of the children of God but also the full rejection of the world. It is understandable that we hesitate to claim the honor so as to avoid the pain. But, provided we are willing to share in Christ's suffering, we also will share in his glory (see Romans 8:17). **Henri Nouwen Society**



LA PRESENCIA REAL DE JESUCRISTO EN EL SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCHARISTÍA PREGUNTAS BÁSICAS Y RESPUESTAS

CONTINUACIÓN...

2. ¿Por qué la Eucaristía no es sólo una comida sino también un sacrificio?

Aunque nuestros pecados hacían imposible que tuviéramos parte en la vida de Dios, Jesucristo fue enviado a quitar este obstáculo. Su muerte fue un sacrificio por nuestros pecados. Cristo es "el Cordero de Dios, el que quita el pecado del mundo" (Jn 1, 29). Mediante su muerte y resurrección, venció al pecado y la muerte, y nos reconcilió con Dios. La Eucaristía es el memorial de este sacrificio. La Iglesia se congrega para recordar y reactualizar el sacrificio de Cristo, en el cual participamos por la acción del sacerdote y el poder del Espíritu Santo. Mediante la celebración de la Eucaristía, nos unimos al sacrificio de Cristo y recibimos sus inagotables beneficios.

Como dice la Carta a los Hebreos, Jesús es el eterno y sumo sacerdote que vive para siempre e intercede por el pueblo ante el Padre. De esta manera, supera a todos los sumos sacerdotes que a lo largo de los siglos ofrecían sacrificios por el pecado en el templo de Jerusalén. El eterno y sumo sacerdote Jesús ofrece el sacrificio perfecto, que es su persona y no alguna otra cosa. "[Cristo] penetró una sola vez y para siempre en el 'lugar santísimo'. . No llevó consigo sangre de animales, sino su propia sangre, con la cual nos obtuvo una redención eterna" (Heb 9,11-12).

El acto de Jesús pertenece a la historia humana, pues él es verdaderamente humano y ha entrado a la historia. Pero al mismo tiempo Jesucristo es la Segunda Persona de la Santísima Trinidad; es el Hijo eterno, que no está limitado al tiempo o a la historia. Sus actos trascienden el tiempo, que es parte de lo creado. Entrando "a través de una tienda, que no estaba hecha por mano de hombre, ni pertenecía a esta creación" (Heb 9,11), Jesús el Hijo eterno de Dios realizó su sacrificio en presencia de su Padre, que vive en la eternidad. El sacrificio perfecto de Jesús está así eternamente presente ante el Padre, que eternamente lo acepta. Esto significa que, en la Eucaristía, Jesús no se sacrifica una y otra vez, sino que, por el poder del Espíritu Santo, su eterno sacrificio se hace presente una vez más, se reactualiza, a fin de que podamos tomar parte en él.

TRIPLE ALIANZA

"Moisés cayó de rodillas y se postró" (Éxodo 34, 8).

Un obispo estaba examinando los candidatos para la confirmación en una parroquia. Él les preguntó a los jóvenes qué es la Santa Trinidad. Un muchacho respondió: "Es uno en tres, y tres en uno". El obispo, cuidadosamente en su investigación para determinar si el joven realmente estaba preparado para el sacramento, le dijo: "Eso es bueno, pero yo no lo entiendo". El joven respondió de inmediato: "¡no se supone que lo entienda!"

Nunca podremos comprender la forma de la Santa Trinidad, pero podemos conocer el Quien. Esto se debe a que Dios continuamente se nos revela. "Sí, Dios amó tanto al mundo, que entregó a su Hijo único" (Jn 3, 16) para "revelarse" más plenamente a nosotros (Lc 10, 22). El Padre y el Hijo derraman Su amor en nuestros corazones por el Espíritu Santo (Romanos 5, 5), Quien nos recuerda constantemente que ahora somos niños adoptados por Dios (Rom 8, 15). Entonces, el Espíritu Santo nos ayuda a conocer al Padre tan profundamente que no podemos dejar de "clamar, '¡Abba!', (es decir, 'Padre')" (Rom 8, 15; Gal 4, 6).
