BEING READY TO DIE | *Henri Nouwen Society*

Death often happens suddenly. A car accident, a plane crash, a fatal fight, a war, a flood, and so on. When we feel healthy and full of energy, we do not think much about our deaths. Still, death might come very unexpectedly.

How can we be prepared to die? By not having any unfinished relational business. The question is: Have I forgiven those who have hurt me and asked forgiveness from those I have hurt? When I feel at peace with all the people I live with, my death might cause great grief, but it will not cause guilt or anger. When we are ready to die at any moment, we also are ready to live at any moment.

A GRATEFUL DEATH | *Henri Nouwen Society*

When we think about death, we often think about what will happen to us after we have died. But it is more important to think about what will happen to those we leave behind. The way we die has a deep and lasting effect on those who stay alive. It will be easier for our family and friends to remember us with joy and peace if we have said a grateful good-bye than if we die with bitter and disillusioned hearts. The greatest gift we can offer our families and friends is the gift of gratitude. Gratitude sets them free to continue their lives without bitterness or self-recrimination.

THE COMPANIONSHIP OF THE DEAD | *Henri Nouwen Society*

As we grow older we have more and more people to remember, people who have died before us. It is very important to remember those who have loved us and those we have loved. Remembering them means letting their spirits inspire us in our daily lives. They can become part of our spiritual communities and gently help us as we make decisions on our journeys. Parents, spouses, children, and friends can become true spiritual companions after they have died. Sometimes they can become even more intimate to us after death than when they were with us in life. Remembering the dead is choosing their ongoing companionship.

CHOOSING LIFE | *Henri Nouwen Society*

God says, "I am offering you life or death, blessing or curse. Choose life, then, so that you and your descendants may live" (Deuteronomy 30:19). "Choose life." That's God's call for us, and there is not a moment in which we do not have to make that choice. Life and death are always before us. In our imaginations, our thoughts, our words, our gestures, our actions ... even in our nonactions. This choice for life starts in a deep interior place. Underneath very life-affirming behavior I can still harbor death-thoughts and death-feelings. The most important question is not "Do I kill?" but "Do I carry a blessing in my heart or a curse?" The bullet that kills is only the final instrument of the hatred that began being nurtured in the heart long before the gun was picked up.

JESUS

"But now Christ has achieved reconciliation for you." —Colossians 1:22

Without Jesus, we would die doomed to alienation from God, other people, the world, and ourselves (Col 1:21). Without Jesus, we would nourish hostility in our hearts (Col 1:21). "We went our way in malice and envy, hateful ourselves and hating one another" (Ti 3:3). We were dead because of our sins (Eph 2:1). We "gave allegiance to the present age and to the prince of the air, that spirit who is even now at work among the rebellious. All of us were once of their company; we lived at the level of the flesh, following every whim and fancy, and so by nature deserved God's wrath like the rest. But God is rich in mercy; because of His great love for us He brought us to life with Christ" (Eph 2:5). "There is no condemnation now for those who are in Christ Jesus" (Rm 8:1).

Jesus makes all the difference in the world and after the world. Jesus is the only Way to the Father (Jn 14:6). He is the Truth and the Life Itself (Jn 14:6). Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life (Jn 11:25). Jesus is the "King of kings and Lord of lords" (see Rv 19:16). Jesus is God (see Jn 20:28).

Therefore:

- give your whole life to Jesus,
- worship Jesus,
- renew your Baptism,
- pray always for all people to live for Jesus,
- tell everyone about Jesus,
- make disciples of all nations (Mt 28:19), and
- love Jesus.

Conclusion

By his Real Presence in the Eucharist Christ fulfills his promise to be with us "always, until the end of the age" (Mt 28:20). As St. Thomas Aquinas wrote, "It is the law of friendship that friends should live together... Christ has not left us without his bodily presence in this our pilgrimage, but he joins us to himself in this sacrament in the reality of his body and blood" (Summa Theologiae, III q. 75, a. 1). With this gift of Christ's presence in our midst, the Church is truly blessed. As Jesus told his disciples, referring to his presence among them, "Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it" (Mt 13:17). In the Eucharist, the Church both receives the gift of Jesus Christ and gives grateful thanks to God for such a blessing. This thanksgiving is the only proper response, for through this gift of himself in the celebration of the Eucharist under the appearances of bread and wine Christ gives us the gift of eternal life.

Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. . . Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. (Jn 6:53-57)

LA PRESENCIA REAL DE JESUCRISTO EN EL SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCHARISTÍA PREGUNTAS BÁSICAS Y RESPUESTAS

CONTINUACIÓN...

¿Por qué hablamos del "Cuerpo de Cristo" en más de un sentido?

... La obra del Espíritu Santo en la celebración de la Eucaristía es de dos aspectos, de un modo que corresponde al doble significado de "Cuerpo de Cristo". Por un lado, mediante el poder del Espíritu Santo, el Cristo resucitado y su acto de sacrificio se hacen presentes. En la oración eucarística, el sacerdote pide al Padre que envíe el Espíritu Santo sobre los dones del pan y el vino para transformarlos en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo (oración conocida como la epiclesis o invocación). Por otro lado, al mismo tiempo el sacerdote pide al Padre que envíe el Espíritu Santo sobre toda la asamblea para que "quienes toman parte en la Eucaristía sean un solo cuerpo y un solo espíritu" (Catecismo, no. 1353). Es mediante el Espíritu Santo que el don del Cuerpo de Cristo eucarístico viene a nosotros y mediante el Espíritu Santo nos unimos a Cristo y nos unimos entre nosotros para formar el Cuerpo Místico de Cristo.

Por lo tanto, podemos ver que la celebración de la Eucaristía no solamente nos une a Dios como individuos aislados entre sí. Por el contrario, somos unidos a Cristo junto con todos los demás miembros del Cuerpo Místico. La celebración de la Eucaristía debe acrecentar así nuestro amor recíproco y hacernos recordar nuestros compromisos mutuos. Asimismo, como miembros del Cuerpo Místico, tenemos el deber de hacer presente a Cristo y de traerlo al mundo. Tenemos la responsabilidad de compartir la Buenas Noticias de Cristo no sólo con nuestras palabras sino también con el modo en que vivimos nuestras vidas. Tenemos también la responsabilidad de trabajar contra todas las fuerzas que en nuestro mundo se oponen al Evangelio, incluyendo todas las formas de injusticia. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica nos enseña: "La Eucaristía entraña un compromiso en favor de los pobres. Para recibir en la verdad el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo entregados por nosotros, debemos reconocer a Cristo en los más pobres, sus hermanos" (no. 1397).

JESÚS

"Él los ha reconciliado en el cuerpo carnal de su Hijo" (Colosenses 1, 22).
