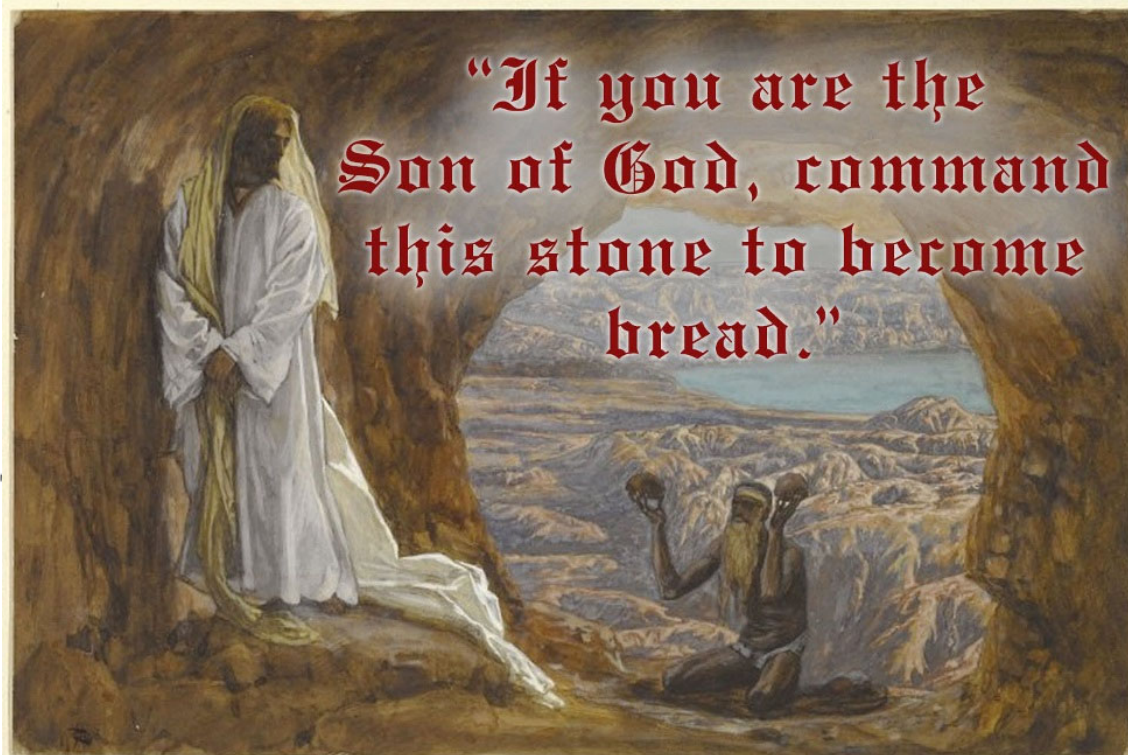

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REFLECTIONS

FORGIVE FOR YOUR ETERNITY

“The above Scripture passage from today’s Gospel reading is blunt and clear. “The measure with which you measure will be used to measure you” (Mt 7:2). Our eternal forgiveness and salvation depend upon whether or not we have forgiven those who have wronged us. Yet we are only human, and our sinful nature inherited from original sin makes forgiveness impossible from a human standpoint. Apart from Jesus, we can do nothing, particularly when choosing to forgive (Jn 15:5). Therefore, we must constantly beg the Lord for the grace to forgive “seventy times seven times” those who have harmed us (Mt 18:22).

So let us:

- 1) gaze on the crucified Jesus, Who says: “Father, forgive them; they do not know what they are doing” (Lk 23:34),
- 2) pray the Our Father daily, asking the Father to “forgive us the wrong we have done as we forgive those who wrong us” (Mt 6:12),
- 3) attend Mass as often as possible, even daily, for there we hear that Jesus forgave even on the night He was betrayed,
- 4) immerse ourselves in the Word of God, which speaks constantly of forgiveness and always achieves God’s will (see Is 55:10-11), and
- 5) make a Lenten Confession and be immersed in forgiveness.

Prayer: *Father, this Lent give me the grace to forgive from the heart all who have hurt me.*

Promise: *“The Lord is close to the brokenhearted; and those who are crushed in spirit He saves.” —Ps 34:19*

Praise: *When St. John’s hospital burned, he carried out all the patients through the flames, but no one was burned (see Is 43:2).*

Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division", "hatred" and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother", and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam!

WHAT IS LENT?

Wednesday, March 2, 2022 - Thursday, April 14, 2022

Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. Contemplate the meaning and origins of the Lenten fasting tradition in this reflection. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.

FAST & ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, **Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.**

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Members of the Eastern Catholic Churches are to observe the particular law of their own sui iuris Church. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

LENT IN THE SPIRIT | “Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, then returned from the Jordan and was conducted by the Spirit into the desert for forty days.” —Luke 4:1-2

Lent is imitating Jesus’ forty days in the desert. Jesus began His “Lent” filled with and led by the Holy Spirit (see Lk 4:1). He also came out of the Lenten desert “in the power of the Spirit” (Lk 4:14). The Holy Spirit directed Jesus every step of the way through the “first Lent.”

Are we letting the Spirit direct us this Lent? (Gal 5:25) Are we fasting, praying, giving alms, and evangelizing in the Spirit? (Mt 6:3, 5, 16) The Spirit will call us to do things this Lent we’d never thought of before. If these things seem impossible, the Spirit will help us in our weakness (Rm 8:26). By the Spirit, we will be able to fast in some way for each of the forty days of Lent. By praying in the Spirit, we will pray this Lent on a new level, with greater perseverance and depth. With the faith and love of the Spirit, we will give alms so much that we will have to make sacrifices and simplify our lives. Finally, this Lent, we will not only resist temptations but also make a frontal attack on the gates of hell (Mt 16:18-19), as we win the world for Christ through Spirit-filled evangelization.

A Spirit-led Lent is different from the Lents to which many of us have been accustomed. A Spirit-filled Lent is like Jesus’ Lent. Let us follow in His footsteps.

Prayer: Jesus, may this Lent be like the first one.

Promise: “If you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.” —Rm 10:9

Praise: Praise to You, Lord Jesus Christ, King of endless glory!

STARVED FOR ATTENTION | “You shall not go about spreading slander among your kinsmen; nor shall you stand by idly when your neighbor’s life is at stake.” —Leviticus 19:16

Lent prepares us to celebrate the Resurrection. But it’s hard for someone starving to death to celebrate Jesus’ Resurrection from the dead. It’s also hard for Christians to celebrate Jesus’ Resurrection victory when they are at the same time allowing people to starve. “How can God’s love survive in a man who has enough of this world’s goods yet closes his heart to his brother when he sees him in need?” (1 Jn 3:17) Jesus Himself is saying: “I was hungry and you gave Me no food” (Mt 25:42). “I assure you, as often as you neglected to do it to one of these least ones, you neglected to do it to Me” (Mt 25:45).

We must do something to feed Jesus. For years we have heard pleas to help the poor and starving, and things have only become worse. The poor have become poorer, and the rich richer. We’ve sent in our contributions, but we have not responded as if we really believe these people are our brothers and sisters in Christ. If our own relatives were starving, we would respond differently. If we really believed serving the poor was serving Jesus, we’d do anything for them. Our resignation to mass starvation is a scandal that casts doubt on the reality of the Resurrection. The risen Jesus is still saying: “If you love Me, feed My sheep” (see Jn 21:17).

Prayer: Jesus, so many need my help immediately or they will die. May I not “save for a rainy day,” but put my money where my faith is.

Promise: “These will go off to eternal punishment and the just to eternal life.” —Mt 25:46

Praise: St. Perpetua was a noblewoman of Carthage in North Africa. St. Felicity was her slave. Both were imprisoned for their Christian faith and bravely accepted martyrdom. Their happiness in the face of death has witnessed to millions for centuries.

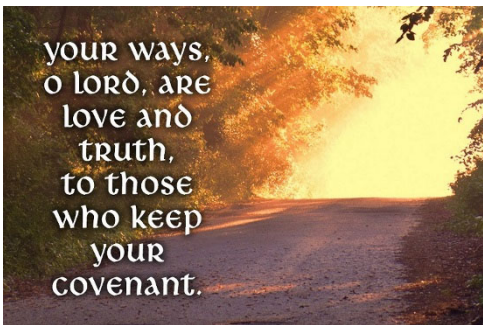

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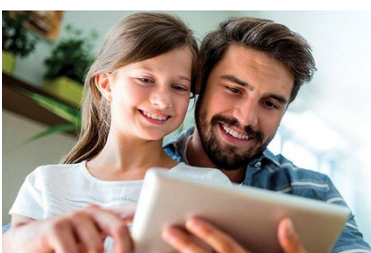

INVOCACIÓN POR LA PAZ DEL PAPA FRANCISCO

Señor, Dios de paz, escucha nuestra súplica.

Hemos intentado muchas veces y durante muchos años resolver nuestros conflictos con nuestras fuerzas, y también con nuestras armas; tantos momentos de hostilidad y de oscuridad; tanta sangre derramada; tantas vidas destruidas; tantas esperanzas abatidas... Pero nuestros esfuerzos han sido en vano.

Ahora, Señor, ayúdanos tú. Danos tú la paz, enséñanos tú la paz, guíanos tú hacia la paz. Abre nuestros ojos y nuestros corazones, y danos la valentía para decir: «¡Nunca más la guerra!»; «con la guerra, todo queda destruido». Infúndenos el valor de llevar a cabo gestos concretos para construir la paz.

Señor, Dios de Abraham y los Profetas, Dios amor que nos has creado y nos llamas a vivir como hermanos, danos la fuerza para ser cada día artesanos de la paz; danos la capacidad de mirar con benevolencia a todos los hermanos que encontramos en nuestro camino. Haznos disponibles para escuchar el clamor de nuestros ciudadanos que nos piden transformar nuestras armas en instrumentos de paz, nuestros temores en confianza y nuestras tensiones en perdón.

Mantén encendida en nosotros la llama de la esperanza para tomar con paciente perseverancia opciones de diálogo y reconciliación, para que finalmente triunfe la paz. Y que sean desterradas del corazón de todo hombre estas palabras: división, odio, guerra. Señor, desarma la lengua y las manos, renueva los corazones y las mentes, para que la palabra que nos lleva al encuentro sea siempre «hermano», y el estilo de nuestra vida se convierta en shalom, paz, salam. Amén.

AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA CUARESIMAL

El Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo son días obligatorios de ayuno y abstinencia para los católicos. Además, los viernes durante la Cuaresma son días obligatorios de abstinencia.

Para los miembros de la Iglesia de rito latino, las normas son obligatorias desde la edad de 18 años hasta los 59. Cuando se ayuna, se le permite a la persona comer una comida completa, así como dos comidas más pequeñas que juntas no equivalgan a una comida completa. Las normas sobre la abstinencia de carne son vinculantes para los miembros de la iglesia católica de rito latino desde los 14 años en adelante.

Los miembros de la iglesia católica de rito oriental deben observar la ley propia de su iglesia sui iuris.

Si es posible, el ayuno del Viernes Santo se continúa hasta la Vigilia Pascual (la noche del Sábado Santo) como el "ayuno pascual" para honrar el sufrimiento y la muerte del Señor Jesús y prepararnos para compartir más plenamente y celebrar más apropiadamente su Resurrección.

PERDÓN POR TU ETERNIDAD

“Si perdonan sus faltas a los demás, el Padre que está en el cielo también los perdonará a ustedes. Pero si no perdonan a los demás, tampoco el Padre los perdonará a ustedes” (Mateo 6:14-15).

Martes, 8 de marzo de 2022; San Juan de Dios | Isaías 55:10-11; Salmos 34:4-7, 16-19; Mateo 6:7-15

El pasaje bíblico anterior de la lectura del Evangelio de hoy es contundente y claro. “La medida con que midan, se usará para ustedes” (Mt 7:2). Nuestro perdón y salvación eternos dependen de si hemos perdonado o no a quienes nos han hecho daño. Sin embargo, somos solo humanos, y nuestra naturaleza pecaminosa heredada del pecado original hace que el perdón sea imposible desde un punto de vista humano. Aparte de Jesús, no podemos hacer nada, sobre todo al elegir perdonar (Jn 15:5). Por lo tanto, debemos rogar constantemente al Señor por la gracia de perdonar “setenta veces siete” a quienes nos han hecho daño (Mt 18:22).

Así que vamos a:

- 1) contemplar a Jesús crucificado, que dice: “Padre, perdónalos; porque no saben lo que hacen” (Lc 23:34),
- 2) rezar diariamente el Padre Nuestro, pidiendo al Padre que “persona nuestras ofensas, como nosotros perdonamos a los que nos han ofendido” (Mt 6:12),
- 3) asistir a Misa con la mayor frecuencia posible, incluso todos los días, porque allí escuchamos que Jesús perdonó aun la noche en que fue traicionado,
- 4) sumergirnos en la Palabra de Dios, que habla constantemente del perdón y siempre cumple la voluntad de Dios (ver Is 55:10-11), y
- 5) 5) hacer una confesión cuaresmal y sumergirnos en el perdón.

Oración: Padre, esta Cuaresma dame la gracia de perdonar de corazón a todos los que me han ofendido.

Promesa: “El Señor está cerca del que sufre y salva a los que están abatidos” (Sal 34:19).

Alabanza: Cuando el hospital de san Juan ardía, él sacó a todos los pacientes a través de las llamas y nadie se quemó (ver Is 43:2).

MUERTO DE HAMBRE POR FALTA DE ATENCIÓN | “No difamarás a tus compatriotas, ni pondrás en peligro la vida de tu prójimo. Yo soy el Señor” (Levítico 19:16).

Lunes, 7 de marzo de 2022; Santas Perpetua y Felicidad | Levítico 19:1-2, 11-18; Salmos 19:8-10, 15; Mateo 25:31-46

La Cuaresma nos prepara para celebrar la Resurrección. Pero es difícil para alguien que se muere de hambre celebrar la resurrección de Jesús de entre los muertos. También es difícil para los cristianos celebrar la victoria de la resurrección de Jesús cuando al mismo tiempo permiten que las personas se mueran de hambre. “Si alguien vive en la abundancia, y viendo a su hermano en la necesidad, le cierra su corazón, ¿cómo permanecerá en él el amor de Dios?” (1 Jn 3:17) Jesús mismo está diciendo: “porque tuve hambre, y ustedes no me dieron de comer” (Mt 25:42). “Les aseguro que cada vez que no lo hicieron con el más pequeño de mis hermanos, tampoco lo hicieron conmigo” (Mt 25:45).

Tenemos que hacer algo para alimentar a Jesús. Durante años hemos escuchado súplicas para ayudar a los pobres y hambrientos, y las cosas solo han empeorado. Los pobres se han hecho más pobres y los ricos más ricos. Hemos enviado nuestras contribuciones, pero no hemos respondido como si realmente creyéramos que estas personas son nuestros hermanos y hermanas en Cristo. Si nuestros propios parientes se murieran de hambre, responderíamos de manera diferente. Si realmente creyéramos que servir a los pobres es servir a Jesús, haríamos cualquier cosa por ellos. Nuestra conformidad al hambre masiva es un escándalo que pone en duda la realidad de la Resurrección. Jesús resucitado sigue diciendo: “Apacienta mis ovejas” (ver Jn 21:17).

Oración: Jesús, muchos necesitan mi ayuda inmediatamente o morirán. Que yo no “ahorre para un día lluvioso”, sino ponga mi dinero donde está mi fe.

Promesa: “Estos irán al castigo eterno, y los justos a la Vida eterna (Mt 25:46).

Alabanza: Santa Perpetua fue una mujer noble de Cartago en el norte de África. Santa Felicidad fue su esclava. Fueron encarceladas por su fe cristiana, y aceptaron valientemente el martirio. Su felicidad ante la muerte ha sido testimonio para millones de personas durante siglos
