THE CALL OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

The Twenty-third Psalm, today's responsorial psalm, is arguably the best known of all the psalms. The line that reads "Even though I walk in the dark valley / I fear no evil; for you are at my side / with your rod and your staff / that give me courage" (Psalm 23:4) connects this week's scriptures to the wonderful story of the road to Emmaus, which we heard last week. The Lord Jesus, our Good Shepherd, is constantly at our side. He calls us each by name, beckoning us into a deeper relationship with him. That call, issued to each of us at the moment of our baptism, carries with it the promise of the Good Shepherd: "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10).

WALKING THROUGH A MINED-FIELD

"The Lord is my Shepherd; I shall not want." —Psalm 23:1

Few of us have ever pastured, fleeced, or slaughtered a sheep. So we don't have the experience to understand the image of the Good Shepherd. Nevertheless, many people are fascinated with this image. Perhaps they instinctively know the deep and compelling need of the human person to be shepherded.

One of the main works of a shepherd is to guide the sheep. If we are on the road to eternal life, we are on a rough and narrow road (Mt 7:14). We are traveling through alien territory occupied by a "corrupt generation" (Acts 2:40, RNAB), a veritable "culture of death." As we walk through this "valley of the shadow of death" (Ps 23:4, KJV), we unjustly suffer insults and persecution (see 1 Pt 2:21, 23). We are in danger of being stolen, slaughtered, and destroyed (Jn 10:10).

It is as if we are walking through a mined-field. Our next step can detonate an explosion in our families, marriages, work, health, etc. We can't see the mines below the surface. We desperately need guidance. We need a shepherd, and a good one. Jesus says: "I am the Good Shepherd; the Good Shepherd lays down His life for the sheep" (Jn 10:11).

Prayer: Jesus, Good Shepherd, may I hear Your voice and follow You (Jn 10:3).

Promise: "By His wounds you were healed." —1 Pt 2:24

Praise: Glory be to You, Good Shepherd. We trust, adore, glorify, and worship You, our Savior and God.

SIGNPOSTS ON THE WAY TO GOD | Henri Nouwen Society

How do we know about God's love, God's generosity, God's kindness, God's forgiveness? Through our parents, our friends, our teachers, our pastors, our spouses, our children ... they all reveal God to us. But as we come to know them, we realize that each of them can reveal only a little bit of God. God's love is greater than theirs; God's goodness is greater than theirs; God's beauty is greater than theirs.

At first we may be disappointed in these people in our lives. For a while we thought that they would be able to give us all the love, goodness, and beauty we needed. But gradually we discover that they were all signposts on the way to God.

GOD'S GENEROSITY | Henri Nouwen Society

God is a god of abundance, not a god of scarcity. Jesus reveals to us God's abundance when he offers so much bread to the people that there are twelve large baskets with leftover scraps (see John 6:5-15), and when he makes his disciples catch so many fish that their boat nearly sinks (Luke 5:1-7). God doesn't give us just enough. God gives us more than enough: more bread and fish than we can eat, more love than we dared to ask for.

God is a generous giver, but we can only see and enjoy God's generosity when we love God with all of our hearts, minds, and strength. As long as we say, "I will love you, God, but first show me your generosity," we will remain distant from God and unable to experience what God truly wants to give us, which is life and life in abundance.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

The Vatican has set the 54th World Day for Vocations for May 7, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, commonly known as Good Shepherd Sunday.

The purpose of World Day of Prayer for Vocations is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the church, it affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and the consecrated life.

While appreciating all vocations, the church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries (priesthood and diaconate), to religious life in all its forms (male and female, contemplative and apostolic), to societies of apostolic life, to secular institutes in their diversity of services and membership, and to the missionary life, in the particular sense of mission "ad gentes."

POPE FRANCIS TO CANONIZE FATIMA VISIONARIES DURING MAY VISIT

During his trip to Portugal for the centenary of the Fatima Marian apparitions next month, Pope Francis will canonize visionaries Francisco and Jacinta Marto, making them the youngest non-martyrs to ever be declared saints.

The children will be canonized during Pope Francis' May 13 Mass in Fatima. The decision for the date was made during the April 20 consistory of cardinals, which also voted on the dates of four other canonizations, in addition to that of Francisco and Jacinta, that will take place this year.

CAMINANDO POR TERRITORIO DESCONOCIDO "El Señor es mi pastor, nada me puede faltar" (Salmos 23, 1).

Pocos de nosotros hemos pastoreado, esquilado, o sacrificado una oveja. Así que no tenemos la experiencia para entender la imagen del Buen Pastor. Sin embargo, muchas personas se sienten fascinadas con esta imagen. Tal vez sepan instintivamente la necesidad profunda y convincente de la persona de ser pastoreada. Una de las principales tareas de un pastor es guiar a las ovejas. Si estamos en el camino a la vida eterna, estamos en un camino áspero y estrecho (Mt 7, 14). Estamos viajando a través de territorio desconocido ocupado por una "generación perversa" (Hch 2, 40), una verdadera "cultura de muerte". Mientras caminamos a través de "oscuras quebradas" (Sal 23, 4), sufrimos injustamente insultos y persecuciones (ver 1 Pe 2, 21, 23). Estamos en peligro de ser robados, sacrificados y destruidos (Jn 10, 10). Es como si estuviéramos caminando a través de un campo minado. Nuestro próximo paso puede detonar una explosión en nuestras familias, matrimonios, trabajo, salud, etc. No podemos ver las minas debajo de la superficie. Necesitamos orientación desesperadamente. Necesitamos un pastor; y que sea bueno. Jesús dice: "Yo soy el Buen Pastor. El Buen Pastor da Su vida por las ovejas" (Jn 10, 11).

Oración: Jesús, mi Buen Pastor, que pueda oír Tu voz y seguirte a Ti (Jn 10, 3).

Promesa: "Gracias a sus llagas, ustedes fueron curados" (1 Pe 2, 24).

Alabanza: Gloria a Ti, Buen Pastor. Confiamos, adoramos, glorificamos, y te veneramos, nuestro Salvador y Dios.
