TELLING THE STORY OF JESUS

The Church is called to announce the Good News of Jesus to all people and all nations. Besides the many works of mercy by which the Church must make Jesus' love visible, it must also joyfully announce the great mystery of God's salvation through the life, suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. The story of Jesus is to be proclaimed and celebrated. Some will hear and rejoice, some will remain indifferent, some will become hostile. The story of Jesus will not always be accepted, but it must be told.

We who know the story and try to live it out, have the joyful task of telling it to others. When our words rise from hearts full of love and gratitude, they will bear fruit, whether we can see this or not.

WHO ARE THE POOR? | *Henri Nouwen Society*

The poor are the center of the Church. But who are the poor? At first we might think of people who are not like us: people who live in slums, people who go to soup kitchens, people who sleep on the streets, people in prisons, mental hospitals, and nursing homes. But the poor can be very close. They can be in our own families, churches or workplaces. Even closer, the poor can be ourselves, who feel unloved, rejected, ignored, or abused.

It is precisely when we see and experience poverty - whether far away, close by, or in our own hearts - that we need to become the Church; that is, hold hands as brothers and sisters, confess our own brokenness and need, forgive one another, heal one another's wounds, and gather around the table of Jesus for the breaking of the bread. Thus, as the poor we recognize Jesus, who became poor for us.

BECOMING THE CHURCH OF THE POOR

When we claim our own poverty and connect our poverty with the poverty of our brothers and sisters, we become the Church of the poor, which is the Church of Jesus. Solidarity is essential for the Church of the poor. Both pain and joy must be shared. As one body we will experience deeply one another's agonies as well as one another's ecstasies. As Paul says: "If one part is hurt, all the parts share its pain. And if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy" (1 Corinthians 12:26). Often we might prefer not to be part of the body because it makes us feel the pain of others so intensely. Every time we love others deeply we feel their pain deeply. However, joy is hidden in the pain. When we share the pain we also will share the joy. | *Henri Nouwen Society*

THE POVERTY OF OUR LEADERS

There is a tendency to think about poverty, suffering, and pain as realities that happen primarily or even exclusively at the bottom of our Church. We seldom think of our leaders as poor. Still, there is great poverty, deep loneliness, painful isolation, real depression, and much emotional suffering at the top of our Church.

We need the courage to acknowledge the suffering of the leaders of our Church - its ministers, priests, bishops, and popes - and include them in this fellowship of the weak. When we are not distracted by the power, wealth, and success of those who offer leadership, we will soon discover their powerlessness, poverty, and failures and feel free to reach out to them with the same compassion we want to give to those at the bottom. In God's eyes there is no distance between bottom and top. There shouldn't be in our eyes either. | *Henri Nouwen Society*

A MINISTRY OF HEALING AND RECONCILIATION

How does the Church witness to Christ in the world? First and foremost by giving visibility to Jesus' love for the poor and the weak. In a world so hungry for healing, forgiveness, reconciliation, and most of all unconditional love, the Church must alleviate that hunger through its ministry. Wherever we feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit the lonely, listen to those who are rejected, and bring unity and peace to those who are divided, we proclaim the living Christ, whether we speak about him or not.

It is important that whatever we do and wherever we go, we remain in the Name of Jesus, who sent us. Outside his Name our ministry will lose its divine energy. *Henri Nouwen Society*

REMUNERATION OF PRIESTS IN ACTIVE MINISTRY

Dear Parishioners,

After consultation and discussion, Bishop Soto has approved a revised Remuneration Policy for the Priests of the Diocese of Sacramento and promulgated it to be effective January 1, 2018. During the next few weeks, I will share with you some of the main points.

The Remuneration of Priests in active ministry is broken into four categories:

1. Compensation
2. **Benefits**—are non-taxable
3. Reimbursements
4. Entitlements

A. Health, Vision, Dental and Prescription Insurance.

Source of income pays the premium. The parish should pay the annual premium for religious order priests, but no more than the premium otherwise payable for diocesan priests.

B. Defined Benefit Pension Plan.

Source of income pays the required annual contribution to the Diocese of Sacramento Priests Pension Trust. The parish should pay an equivalent amount directly to the Order for any religious Order priest if they have a priest pension plan, but no more than the premium otherwise payable for diocesan priests.

C. Annual Vacation Time.

Priests 60 and under: 4 weeks (to include 4 Sundays)

Priests 61 and over: 6 weeks (to include 6 Sundays)

Priests 70 and over: 8 weeks

(Note: A priest may not accrue the Christmas and Easter break time and add it to their vacation period.)

D. Day Off.

One day per week is understood as 24 hours. The priest is authorized to take a few days off (up to a maximum of five days) after Easter and Christmas, but not to extend over a weekend.

HACIENDO CRISTIANOS | Continuación...

En las dos semanas previas hablábamos de dos [el Credo y los sacramentos] de los cuatro pilares en que se sostienen nuestra fe. En esta ocasión leeremos sobre el tercer pilar: la moralidad.

La moralidad (vivir la fe)

“Las canciones de la música tradicional suelen estar llenas de corazones rotos; hablan de amores que se han convertido en desamores. Dos personas que se aman deben de tratarse mutuamente de una manera que así lo muestre, porque cuando eso no se hace, se pierde la fe en la relación. Al igual que unas maneras de comportarnos expresan amor, otras muestran rechazo a ese amor.

Dios nos ama y por ello nos invita a que, a nuestra vez, le amemos a él y a los demás. Si decimos que amamos a Dios debemos de actuar de una manera que manifieste ese amor y no de una manera que muestre rechazo a ese amor. Así de simple. Entonces ¿Por qué es tan difícil?

Vivir con una moralidad cristiana no debería ser tan difícil. Solo hay diez mandamientos a seguir, y Dios es tan bueno y nos ama tanto que ¿quién podría siquiera pensar en hacer algo que no debiera por él? Aunque nos duela admitirlo, la verdad es que los seres humanos nunca estamos satisfechos con lo que tenemos. Siempre queremos más. Nuestros corazones insaciables buscan satisfacción en otras cosas y lugares y no en Dios. Al igual que una persona casada que parece ‘tenerlo todo’ pero aun así comete adulterio, también nosotros podemos fácilmente olvidar lo bueno que Dios es con nosotros e ir a buscar la satisfacción en otro lado.

Vivir la vida desde la moralidad cristiana nos es solo cuestión de simplemente evitar las cosas malas. Se trata de ser conscientes de lo mucho que somos amados y de responder a ese amor de la manera en que nuestro Dios del amor nos pide que lo hagamos: buscando la saciedad solo en él y amando a nuestro prójimo. Dios nos es fiel y no le podemos hacer daño con nuestros actos inmorales. Los únicos corazones que corren el riesgo de ‘romperse’ son los nuestros. Continua...

ERES LLAMADO A LA GRANDEZA "Se cerró la puerta" (Mateo 25:10).

Algunos de ustedes están ardiendo de amor por Dios y, también, con amor para todas las personas. Usted quiere que todos se salven (1 Tim 2:4), la santidad en las familias, el amor para los niños abandonados, la paz para el mundo, la justicia para los pobres y los bebés en el útero que sean rescatados de aborto. Quieres hacer grandes cosas por el amor de Dios y el hombre.

El Señor quiere encargarnos con grandes cosas, pero primero tenemos que ser fieles en las cosas pequeñas. Por ejemplo, hay que diezmar y dar limosna antes de que se nos de mayores cosas para hacer, como por ejemplo salvar vidas y salvar almas (ver Lc 16:10-12). Si no oramos todos los días, ¿por qué debería el Señor hacernos conciliadores?
