"THE LAND OF THE FREE?"

"You have been called to live in freedom."

—Galatians 5:13

"It was for liberty that Christ freed us. So stand firm, and do not take on yourselves the yoke of slavery a second time!" — Galatians 5:1

After we make the ultimate decision to convert, we spend all our time with the Lord and all our lives for Him. Then we get to know the Lord personally, and it doesn't take us long to realize that the Lord is preoccupied with our freedom. We should expect this because Jesus' mission is to set the captives free (Lk 4:18). He died on the cross to free us from our sins, and He rose from the dead to free us from Satan, the prince of death (see Heb 2:14). Only if Jesus frees us are we truly free (Jn 8:36). Jesus is our Redeemer, Who has done everything necessary to free us.

Therefore, Jesus insists that we be free from unforgiveness, fear, self-hatred, and addictions to everything from alcohol to TV, electronic devices, types of food, gambling, pornography, cigarettes, caffeine, drugs, etc.

God the Father through Jesus has sent the Holy Spirit to give us desires in opposition to our fallen, addicted nature (Gal 5:17). By living our baptisms, that is, our lives in the Spirit, we will be free.

WHAT'S THE SMOKE FOR?

Dear Johan,

Growing up I was told that it was a sin not to attend Mass on Sunday. And what about holy days of obligation? Do we still believe in all this?

Gentle Reader,

Let me ask you this: When you love someone, do you see it as an obligation to spend time with him or her? Or, would the person who has been saved from drowning ever think it a burden to thank his or her savior?

Although yours is a fair question, it also bespeaks a legalistic and minimalist approach to the celebration of the mysteries of our faith, which is rather regrettable and supremely sad. Would that there were no need for an obligation, at least not the kind that is imposed on us by the church, today.

Our current understanding of Sunday and holy days of obligation is that it has been imposed on us by the church, and rightfully so. By contrast, the early church had no such law because there simply was no need for it. The sense of "obligation" early Christians felt to celebrate Sunday Eucharist flowed from a deep personal and communal desire. Theirs was an inner obligation to the celebration of the Eucharist. They were so moved by the mystery of God's love for us that they simply could not but celebrate. Saint John Paul II in his apostolic letter Dies Domini, On Keeping the Lord's Day Holy, from 1998 calls it the "obligation of conscience."

As this "obligation of conscience" or inner desire started to wane, individual bishops found it necessary to remind the faithful that the Sunday assembly was not simply an option but rather a sacred duty. This kind of language can be found in local church documents dating back to the fourth century. Though the number and intensity of these documents increases over the centuries, it was not until 1917 when the Code of Canon Law defined the obligation to celebrate Eucharist on Sundays and holy days of obligation as universal law. This law was upheld by the 1983 Code of Canon Law. And the current Catechism of the Catholic Church identifies the deliberate failure to follow this obligation as a grave sin. So, yes, we still abide by Sunday and holy day obligations. Both your question and my answer make me sad, though. On the one hand, I am saddened that we have punishing legislation in an attempt to encourage people to celebrate Sunday Eucharist. On the other hand, I am saddened by the fact that we have lost this sense of inner obligation. We might be better off if we were less legalistic and more spiritual when it comes to the celebration of the Eucharist. But maybe that is merely a liturgical reverie or fantasy?

WHY DO WE NEED A FUNDRAISER?

We are currently planning to raise funds for a remodel project at Saint Theresa parish for our **sign and main office**. These need upgrades to provide better direction to our parish and safety and comfort for our parish staff and visitors.

New Sign. The current sign is not readily visible or readable from Lake Tahoe Boulevard and visitors have difficulty finding us. The font on the sign is too small and there is too much copy making it impossible to be read from cars driving down Highway 50 / Lake Tahoe Boulevard at the current 40 mile per hour speed limit.

The parish office is not accessible to persons with disabilities. It currently has steps outside leading to the front door and does not have a ramp making it difficult if not impossible for those with disabilities. There is one entry door and the only other door is from the customer side of the front counter. This is not only a fire hazard but unsafe for staff sitting behind the counter if someone looking to harm were to enter. The remodel would provide a safe exit for staff. The office is cramped and small and the remodel would provide additional working space. Moreover, the current restroom by the office is also small and is not accessible to persons with disabilities.

"LA MISERICORDIA NO ES PENOSA"

"El Señor es bondadoso y compasivo, lento para enojarse y de gran misericordia" (Salmos 103:8).

Abraham le pidió al Señor que perdonara a las ciudades malvadas de Sodoma y Gomorra si solo hubieran diez personas inocentes en esas ciudades (Gn 18:32). Sin embargo, las ciudades fueron destruidas por fuego y piedra de azufre porque no hallaron ni diez personas inocentes en ellas, y posiblemente porque Abraham dejó de interceder por los habitantes de estas ciudades.

Abraham posiblemente dejó de interceder porque:

Pensó que él había alcanzado los límites de la misericordia de Dios. Esto fue incorrecto porque a la luz del nuevo pacto sabemos que la misericordia del Señor no tiene límites.

Pensó que seguramente habrían al menos diez personas inocentes en estas ciudades perversas, pero estaba equivocado. Nuestros pecados a menudo son peores de lo que pensamos. Necesitamos la misericordia de Dios mucho más de lo que nos damos cuenta.

Él había alcanzado los límites de su propia misericordia. Abraham pudo haber pensado que si ellos eran tan malvados, merecían morir. Vivamos según los estándares de la misericordia de Dios.

Abraham probablemente subestimó la misericordia de Dios y la necesidad de la humanidad de esta. Aprendamos de esto.

"Felices los misericordiosos, porque obtendrán misericordia" (Mt 5:7).

Oración: Padre, hazme mensajero de Tu misericordia ilimitada.

Promesa: "Entonces se aproximó un escriba y le dijo: 'Maestro, te seguiré adonde vayas'. Jesús le respondió: 'Los zorros tienen sus cuevas y las aves del cielo sus nidos; pero el Hijo del hombre no tiene dónde reclinar la cabeza'" (Mt 8:19-20).

Alabanza: San Junípero Serra fue misionero franciscano español que viajó desde México a California y fundó doce misiones. Su lema era "Siempre adelante, nunca atrás".

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"¿LA TIERRA DE LA LIBERTAD?"

"Ustedes, hermanos han sido llamados para vivir en libertad" (Gálatas 5:13). "Esta es la libertad que nos ha dado Cristo. Manténganse firmes para no caer de nuevo bajo el yugo de la esclavitud" (Gálatas 5:1).

Después de tomar la decisión final de convertirnos, pasamos todo nuestro tiempo con el Señor y toda nuestra vida para Él. Entonces conoceremos personalmente al Señor, y no nos llevará mucho tiempo darnos cuenta de que el Señor está preocupado por nuestra libertad. Deberíamos esperar esto porque la misión de Jesús es liberar a los cautivos (Lc 4:18). Él murió en la cruz para liberarnos de nuestros pecados y resucitó de entre los muertos para liberarnos de Satanás, el príncipe de la muerte (ver Heb 2:14). Solo si Jesús nos libera seremos verdaderamente libres (Jn 8:36). Jesús es nuestro Redentor, que ha hecho todo lo necesario para liberarnos.

Por lo tanto, Jesús insiste en que debemos liberarnos de la falta de perdón, del miedo, del odio a nosotros mismos y de las adicciones a todo, desde el alcohol hasta la televisión, los dispositivos electrónicos, los tipos de alimentos, los juegos de azar, la pornografía, los cigarrillos, la cafeína y las drogas. Dios Padre por medio de Jesús ha enviado al Espíritu Santo para darnos deseos en oposición a nuestra naturaleza caída y adicta (Gál 5:17). Al vivir nuestros bautismos, es decir, nuestras vidas en el Espíritu, seremos libres.

Oración: Padre, líbrame de la cultura de la muerte. Que pueda ser siempre libre en Tí.

Promesa: "Jesús le respondió: 'El que ha puesto la mano en el arado y mira hacia atrás, no sirve para el Reino de Dios'" (Lc 9:62).

Alabanza: Alabado sea Jesús resucitado, "el primero que resucitó de entre los muertos" (Col 1:18).
