HELL, NO!

"I am tortured in these flames." —Luke 16:24

Jesus told a parable about a rich man who was in the netherworld — an allusion to what we would call "hell." The rich man was in hell not because he was rich or because he refused to help the poor man, Lazarus. The rich man went to hell because he was insensitive to Lazarus. He didn't even notice the poor man at his door, although even dogs noticed Lazarus (see Lk 16:20-21). The rich man was not only insensitive to Lazarus but also to Moses and the prophets, that is, the Bible (Lk 16:31). The rich man and his five brothers had put themselves in such a state of spiritual stupor that they would not have been fazed "even if one should rise from the dead" (Lk 16:31).

The rich man deadened his spiritual sensitivity by a worldly lifestyle. He "dressed in purple and linen and feasted splendidly every day" (Lk 16:19). He was complacent, living for comfort, enjoyment, entertainment, and pleasure (see Am 6:4-6). A worldly lifestyle doesn't necessarily put a person in hell, but it puts a person in such a state of addiction to self that he chooses hell.

It is tempting to want to live a worldly lifestyle. However, Christians, who have been baptized into a supernatural new life, sometimes live a worldly, soul-numbing lifestyle. How can this be? These Christians are not living their Baptisms. Instead of rejecting Satan, all his works, and all his empty promises, we can fall into the temptation to reject "the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit" (2 Cor 13:13).

Jesus died so that we would all go to heaven. His will be done.

Prayer: Father, make me so secure in Your love that I will not become empty.

Promise: "Take firm hold on the everlasting life to which you were called when, in the presence of many witnesses, you made your noble profession of faith." —1 Tm 6:12

Praise: Majesty, might, and power be to Jesus now and for ages to come. Amen (Jude 25).

WHAT'S THE SMOKE FOR?

Dear Johan,

Why do we wash feet on Holy Thursday? I used to worship in a parish where we washed hands. That seems much more hygienic.

Gentle Reader,

Let me tell you a story. One Holy Thursday, long ago, I celebrated the Sacred Triduum at the motherhouse of a religious community. Before the service of the Lord's Supper, I watched several elderly sisters being brought into the chapel. Their wheelchairs were lined up around the altar. Others came in using their walkers. Still others walked on the arm of another sister or a nurse. The service was simple, yet very beautiful. At the time of the footwashing, the priest suggested that we were going to wash one another's feet. As a liturgical purist, I was simply mortified at the thought. What could this mean? Why were we straying from the custom of the priest washing the feet of twelve men, symbolizing Christ washing the feet of the apostles?

I swallowed my liturgical pride and tried to enter into the experience. As I was pondering all this, I noticed a sister being helped to the front of the chapel. When she arrived at the row of wheelchairs, she was helped to her knees in front of one of her sisters. Gently and with great difficulty, she took the slippers off her sister's feet. A bowl with water was brought to them. She placed her sister's feet in the water and tenderly washed them. Then she dried them and kissed them. I felt tears running down my cheeks. These feet, which had walked in the service of the church for more than seventy years, were tenderly washed by these hands, which had served the church for more than sixty years. In that moment I finally got why Jesus told us to wash one another's feet. It is all about bending down in humility to serve one another.

The washing of the feet is not a superfluous ritual gesture or a simple reenactment of what Jesus did two thousand years ago. Rather it is an efficacious ritual rehearsal of what all of us are called to do every day of our life. That's why we wash feet on Holy Thursday. You will not get this from washing hands. And by the way, there is nothing hygienic about the Gospel as it is all about getting dirty with those who are dirty.

WHY HAVE EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

If the Mass is the source and summit of the entire Christian life, then why have Eucharistic Adoration?

The celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist is, certainly, the "fount and apex" of the entire Christian Life. ¹Yet the "spiritual life . . . is not limited solely to participation in the liturgy." ²Pope John Paul II calls worship of the Most Holy Eucharist outside Mass "an important daily practice [that] becomes an inexhaustible source of holiness" and a practice of "inestimable value for the life of the Church," so much so that "it is the responsibility of Pastors to encourage, also by their personal witness, the practice of Eucharistic adoration, and exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in particular, as well as prayer of adoration before Christ present under the Eucharistic species."⁴

David is the paradigmatic king in the Old Testament. His kingship recalls that of Adam in the Garden of Eden, and yet it points toward the King par excellence, Jesus Christ. In David the King, Bishop Barron helps us to understand this pivotal figure in light of the first king and the King of kings.

Adam was the first king and steward of the rightly ordered Garden of Eden. He was called to govern the garden according to God's mind and purpose, but by allowing negative influences to wreak havoc on Eden, he did not fulfill his kingly responsibility. Long after Adam, David emerged as the definitive king who would restore order in the Garden and bring the world under the lordship of God. But like Adam, David fell, and his reign ushered in a succession of compromised kings and rejected prophets.

The New Testament, however, foretold a son of David who would realize the fullness of Israelite kingship...but whose actual reign defied expectation.

King David causes us to look back toward Adam's kingship and forward toward Christ the King, seeing Christ as the fulfillment of the Davidic line and the realization of the Kingdom of God on earth. https://www.wofdigital.org/david-the-king
