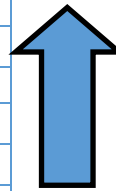

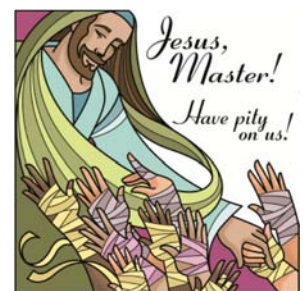
### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

This month, parishes around the country will conduct the “October count,” a measure of attendance at Sunday Mass. The measure has been taken for many centuries, and in some European dioceses it is possible to measure the level of engagement in worship by the population over the course of many centuries. Long ago, it was also the custom to track “Easter duty” by a statistical report. Penitents would receive a kind of chit at confession, which they would then turn in at their parish church when they received Holy Communion during Easter time.

Long ago, of course, Communion was fairly rare in the life of a Catholic Christian, perhaps only once a year. The chits would be tallied by parish priests and reported to the chancery, which in turn would hold on to the records and include the statistics in a report to the Vatican every five years. Nowadays, the October count has proved especially critical in the life of our Church as bishops use the figures to measure the vitality of church life, to sketch parish boundaries, and even to decide when to close, merge, or form new parishes.

### JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY | OCTOBER 9, 2016 | JUBILEE OF MARIAN DEVOTION



This weekend, the Jubilee honors Mary under the title Pope Francis suggests, "Mother of Mercy." Recall the Good Samaritan Gospel. Priest and Levite saw suffering but showed no mercy. Recall the rich man, who never saw Lazarus right before his eyes, and showed no mercy. Today, Jesus sees ten lepers from afar and shows extraordinary mercy. Mary's entire life, declares Francis, was modeled on Jesus, "Mercy-Made-Flesh." Indeed, standing at the cross, Mary saw Jesus' mercy take flesh when Jesus showed mercy to the executioners. So Pope Francis recommends we frequently pray the Salve Regina, Hail, Holy Queen, asking her to ever look upon us with mercy, so that we might be worthy to gaze upon the face of her merciful Son Jesus. May we do so not only in eternity, but here and now, opening our eyes to see Jesus in others, and our hearts to serve Jesus in others by loving deeds of unconditional mercy. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. ### QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK | TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

*Theme: We are Eucharistic people. We live in praise and thanksgiving.*

**Breaking Open the Word** - Suggested text for faith sharing: Today's Gospel

**Step One: Listen to the Word:** Listen carefully to the Gospel of this week. What image in this story strikes you most forcefully? What word or phrase caught your ear?

**Step Two: Look into Your Life:** QUESTION FOR CHILDREN: Make up a prayer which tells God you are thankful for everything you have, even if it's not all you want. QUESTION FOR YOUTH: Only one of the lepers returned to give thanks. This past week, when have you stopped to thank someone for something good they have done for you? When have you thanked God this week? QUESTION FOR ADULTS: What are some ways you can think of to show gratitude to God? Make them concrete and real.

#### THE 90% CONGREGATION

**"Where are the other nine?" —Luke 17:17**

The Samaritan leper ignores Jesus' command to go show himself to the priest. He follows his heart and not Jesus' order. In so doing, he commits an act of "religious disobedience." Presumably, when told to go his way by Jesus (Lk 17:19), he does follow Jesus' command and shows himself to the priests. This was the prescription given for healed lepers in the law of Moses (Lv 13:9-13). Jesus approves of a grateful heart, telling the healed man that his faith, expressed by praise and thanksgiving (Lk 17:15, 18), has been his salvation (Lk 17:19).

Jesus also asks the whereabouts of the other nine men (Lk 17:17). Could He be asking the same question of the congregation in our Mass today? Are most people in your congregation simply fulfilling their Sunday obligation to obey the Church? Are ninety-percent of the people in your parish attending Mass on "auto-pilot" to mechanically "pray, pay, and obey"? Jesus works many healings through reception of the Eucharist, so attending Mass is always a worthy act, even if done mechanically.

The word Eucharist means "thanksgiving." Therefore, praise, glorify, and thank the Lord today. "Dedicate yourselves to thankfulness" (Col 3:15). Continue to obey the Lord and His Church, but do so with gladness (Ps 100:2), praise (Ps 98:4), and thanksgiving (Col 3:17). Prostrate yourself before the Lord and thank Him.

**Prayer:** Father, let there be an epidemic of praise and thanksgiving in Your Church, "and let it begin with me."

**Promise:** "There is no chaining the word of God!" —2 Tm 2:9

### TO BE A CHRISTIAN STEWARD

**A Summary of the U.S. Bishops' Pastoral Letter on Stewardship**

**"As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace" (1 Pt 4:10).**

What identifies a steward? Safeguarding material and human resources and using them responsibly are one answer; so is generous giving of time, talent, and treasure. But being a Christian steward means more. As Christian stewards, we receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord.

### DISCIPLES AS STEWARDS

Let us begin with being a disciple—a follower of our Lord Jesus Christ. As members of the Church, Jesus calls us to be disciples. This has astonishing implications:

- Mature disciples make a conscious decision to follow Jesus, no matter what the cost.
- Christian disciples experience conversion—lifeshaping changes of mind and heart—and commit their very selves to the Lord.
- Christian stewards respond in a particular way to the call to be a disciple. Stewardship has the power to shape and mold our understanding of our lives
- and the way in which we live.

Jesus' disciples and Christian stewards recognize God as the origin of life, giver of freedom, and source of all things. We are grateful for the gifts we have received and are eager to use them to show our love for God and for one another. We look to the life and teaching of Jesus for guidance in living as Christian stewards.

## ASENTANDO LAS BASES DEL AMOR

**"Tu servidor no ofrecerá holocaustos ni sacrificios a otros dioses, fuera del Señor"**  
(2 Reyes 5, 17).

Cuando Naamán, el general y leproso sirio, llevó consigo dos cargas de mula de tierra judía cuando regresó a casa (2 Re 5, 17), él literalmente estaba asentando las bases de su relación con el Señor. Nosotros también debemos guardarnos del peligro de encontrarnos atrapados en una rutina en nuestro amor al Señor. Tenemos que buscar siempre la profundización de nuestro amor a Él, o nos ponemos en riesgo de alejarnos fuera del amor total de Él, con un corazón totalmente seco, y en grave peligro de tibiaza (ver Ap 3,16). Óseas profetizó: "Roturen un campo nuevo: es tiempo de buscar al Señor, hasta que él venga y haga llover para ustedes la justicia" (Os 10, 12).

"Nuestro Dios es un fuego devorador" (Heb 12, 29), y nosotros que estamos enamorados de Él queremos que Él nos consuma más y más. El Señor nos manda: "Creczan en la gracia y en el conocimiento de nuestro Señor y Salvador Jesucristo" (2 Pe 3, 18). El Señor nos enseñó a orar para "conocer el amor de Cristo, que supera todo conocimiento, para ser colmados por la plenitud de Dios" (Ef 3, 19).

La naturaleza del amor es siempre buscar un amor más profundo. Para ser un administrador Cristiano

Un Resumen de la Carta Pastoral de los Obispos de Estados Unidos sobre la Corresponsabilidad

**"Cada uno según el don que ha recibido, lo utilizan para servir como buenos administradores de la multiforme gracia de Dios"** (1 Pe 4,10).

¿Qué identifica a un administrador? Salvaguarda de los recursos materiales y humanos y utilizarlos de manera responsable son una respuesta; por lo que es generosa donación de tiempo, talento y dinero. Pero ser un mayordomo cristiano significa más. Como administradores cristianos, recibimos los dones de Dios con gratitud, cultivarlas de manera responsable, compartirlos con amor en la justicia con los demás, y devolverlos con el aumento al Señor.

### DISCÍPULOS COMO ADMINISTRADORES

Comencemos por ser discípulo-un seguidor de nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Como miembros de la Iglesia, Jesús nos llama a ser discípulos. Esto tiene consecuencias sorprendentes:
