THE DOORS

"Open the door." —Matthew 25:11 | "The door was barred." —Matthew 25:10

Jesus knocks on the door of our lives. He says: "Here I stand, knocking at the door. If anyone hears Me calling and opens the door, I will enter his house and have supper with him, and he with Me" (Rv 3:20). Jesus wants us to allow Him to know us personally. He wants us even to let Him take over our lives so that we would truthfully and practically say: "It is no longer I that live but Christ Who lives in me" (Gal 2:20, our transl.).

There is another door. It is not the door of our lives but the door of eternal life. When Jesus comes for us at our death or at His final coming, He wants to take us through this door into eternal life, love, and happiness with Him. However, we will be able to go through this door only if we have let Jesus know us personally, if we have accepted Him as the Lord of our lives. Otherwise, the door will be barred, and we will hear the eerie, horrifying words of Jesus: "I tell you, I do not know you" (Mt 25:12). Those who are not known by Jesus and do not know Him will be left outside in the darkness of hell where they will wail and grind their teeth forever (Mt 25:30).

Open the door of your life to Jesus. He will later open the door of eternal life to you.

Prayer: Jesus, Good Shepherd (Jn 10:11) and the Sheepgate (Jn 10:7), may I know You as You and the Father know each other (Jn 10:14-15).

Promise: "The Lord Himself will come down from heaven at the word of command, at the sound of the archangel's >>>

THE AUTHORITY OF COMPASSION

The Church often wounds us deeply. People with religious authority often wound us by their words, attitudes, and demands. Precisely because our religion brings us in touch with the questions of life and death, our religious sensibilities can get hurt most easily. Ministers and priests seldom fully realize how a critical remark, a gesture of rejection, or an act of impatience can be remembered for life by those to whom it is directed.

There is such an enormous hunger for meaning in life, for comfort and consolation, for forgiveness and reconciliation, for restoration and healing, that anyone who has any authority in the Church should constantly be reminded that the best word to characterize religious authority is compassion. Let's keep looking at Jesus whose authority was expressed in compassion.

FORGIVING THE CHURCH | *Henri Nouwen Society*

When we have been wounded by the Church, our temptation is to reject it. But when we reject the Church it becomes very hard for us to keep in touch with the living Christ. When we say, "I love Jesus, but I hate the Church," we end up losing not only the Church but Jesus too. The challenge is to forgive the Church. This challenge is especially great because the Church seldom asks us for forgiveness, at least not officially. But the Church as an often fallible human organization needs our forgiveness, while the Church as the living Christ among us continues to offer us forgiveness.

It is important to think about the Church not as "over there" but as a community of struggling, weak people of whom we are part and in whom we meet our Lord and Redeemer.

OUR SPIRITUAL LEADERS | *Henri Nouwen Society*

The Church as the body of Christ has many faces. The Church prays and worships. It speaks words of instruction and healing, cleanses us from our sins, invites us to the table of the Lord, binds us together in a covenant of love, sends us out to minister, anoints us when we are sick or dying, and accompanies us in our search for meaning and our daily need for support. All these faces might not come to us from those we look up to as our leaders. But when we live our lives with a simple trust that Jesus comes to us in our Church, we will see the Church's ministry in places and in faces where we least expect it.

If we truly love Jesus, Jesus will send us the people to give us what we most need. And they are our spiritual leaders.

REMUNERATION OF PRIESTS IN ACTIVE MINISTRY

Dear Parishioners,

After consultation and discussion, Bishop Soto has approved a revised Remuneration Policy for the Priests of the Diocese of Sacramento and promulgated it to be effective January 1, 2018. During the next few weeks, I will share with you some of the mains points.

The Remuneration of Priests in active ministry is broken into four categories:

1. Compensation
2. Benefits
3. Reimbursements
4. Entitlements

Compensation is taxable and includes the following: base salary, and funeral supplement at \$200 per month.

A. Base Compensation**

* "Yrs of Svc" refers to years of service in the Diocese of Sacramento. (Note that once a Priest is incardinated into the Diocese of Sacramento, years of service are calculated from ordination date)

** When a Pastor or Parochial Administrator is re-assigned as a Parochial Vicar, his salary will be adjusted to that of a Parochial Vicar according to the Base Compensation Schedule above.

B. Mass Offerings

The Diocese adopts a Tier I and Tier II system for Mass Offerings only for all priests in active ministry assigned by the Diocesan Bishop.

Tier I – The priest retains the allowed Mass offerings only (i.e., one offering per day, regardless of the number of Masses in a day or the number of intentions per Mass). All other offerings received must be turned in to the priest's source of income. Under this method the offerings are not included on a Priest's Form W-2, and therefore, he is responsible for the reporting of offering income on his personal tax returns.

-or-

Tier II – The Priest turns in all offerings including Mass offerings to his source of income, and in lieu thereof, receives a guarantee fixed amount of \$300 per month which is included on Form W-2.

LA SABIDURÍA

Nuestra tema de hoy es la sabiduría. La primera lectura del Libro de la Sabiduría presenta este valioso regalo como un espíritu femenino, una virtud muy deseable buscada por muchos y posible, por la gracia de Dios, para todos los que la buscan. En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús relata una parábola para ilustrar de una manera práctica y concreta qué es la sabiduría. Los sabios conservan sus recursos, los usan prudentemente, con atención al paso del tiempo. Los tontos, por otro lado, por no planear su futuro, quedarán en la oscuridad. Las dos lecturas indican lo accesible que es la sabiduría a todos los que la buscan de manera sencilla y sincera. Las palabras de Pablo no tocan directamente el tema de la sabiduría, pero describen un resultado de la verdadera sabiduría: A la persona sabia de fe ni la muerte le asusta, porque nuestra fe en la resurrección de Jesús nos dice que todos vamos a despertar a una vida nueva en Cristo.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En 1682 unos negociantes encontraron una caja abandonada en una playa al sur de El Salvador. Como no pudieron abrirla decidieron llevársela al pueblito de San Miguel para conseguir con qué abrirla. Montaron la caja en un burrito y comenzaron su camino. Al pasar por la iglesia parroquial, el burrito se sentó y la caja se abrió revelando una bella imagen de la Virgen.

En aquel entonces el pueblo de El Salvador estaba dividido por la guerra pero con la llegada de esta imagen milagrosa el pueblo buscó reconciliarse. En 1833 hubo otra guerra en El Salvador y los que salieron victoriosos prometieron a María no vengarse en contra de los perdedores. Por estos hechos se le concedió a la imagen el nombre Nuestra Señora de la Paz. Su imagen de madera tallada y vestida lleva una palma en la mano recordando un milagro donde por la intercesión de la Virgen de la Paz, Dios salvó al pueblo de la explosión de un volcán. La palma recuerda que el humo que salía del volcán formaba una palma en el cielo.

LAS PUERTAS

"Señor, señor, ábrelos" (Mateo 25:11)

"Se cerró la puerta" (Mateo 25:10).

Jesús está llamando a la puerta de nuestras vidas. Él dice: "Yo estoy junto a la puerta y llamo: si alguien oye mi voz y abre la puerta, entrará en su casa y cenaremos juntos" (Ap 3:20). Jesús quiere que nosotros le permitamos a Él conocernos personalmente. Él quiere que nosotros incluso, le dejemos tomar control sobre nuestras vidas de tal manera que en la verdad y práctica podamos decir: "Ya no vivo yo, sino que Cristo vive en mí" (Gal 2:20).

Hay otra puerta. No la puerta de nuestras vidas sino la puerta de la vida eterna. Cuando Jesús venga por nosotros en nuestra muerte o en Su venida final, Él quiere llevarnos por esa puerta a la vida eterna, al amor y a la felicidad con Él. Empero, podremos ir a través de esa puerta solo si hemos dejado a Jesús conocernos personalmente, si le hemos aceptado como Señor en nuestras vidas. De lo contrario, se cerrará la puerta y escucharemos las palabras espeluznantes, horribles de Jesús: "te digo, no te conozco" (Mt 25:12). Aquellos que no son conocidos por Jesús y no le conocen, se quedarán afuera en la oscuridad del infierno donde gemirán y rechinarán sus dientes para siempre (Mt 25:30).

Abre la puerta de tu vida a Jesús. Más adelante Él te abrirá la puerta de la vida eterna.

Oración: Jesús, Buen Pastor (Jn 10:11) y puerta de las ovejas (Jn 10:7), que nos conozcamos como Tu y Tu Padre se conocen (Jn 10:14-15).

Promesa: "Porque a la señal dada por la voz del Arcángel y al toque de la trompeta de Dios, el mismo Señor descenderá del cielo. Entonces, primero resucitarán los que murieron en Cristo. Después nosotros, los que aún vivamos, los que quedemos, serenos llevados con ellos al cielo, sobre las nubes, al encuentro de Cristo" (1 Tes 4:16-17).
