Often we remain silent when we need to speak. Without words, it is hard to love well. When we say to our parents, children, lovers, or friends: "I love you very much" or "I care for you" or "I think of you often" or "You are my greatest gift," we choose to give life.

It is not always easy to express our love directly in words. But whenever we do, we discover we have offered a blessing that will be long remembered. When a son can say to his father, "Dad, I love you," and when a mother can say to her daughter, "Child, I love you," a whole new blessed place can be opened up, a space where it is good to dwell. Indeed, words have the power to create life.

## MASTERING EVIL WITH GOOD

*Henri Nouwen Society*

The apostle Paul writes to the Romans: "Bless your persecutors; never curse them, bless them. ... Never pay back evil with evil. ... Never try to get revenge. ... If your enemy is hungry, give him something to eat; if thirsty, something to drink. ... Do not be mastered by evil, but master evil with good" (Romans 12:14-21). These words cut to the heart of the spiritual life. They make it clear what it means to choose life, not death, to choose blessings not curses. But what is asked of us here goes against the grain of our human nature. We will only be able to act according to Paul's words by knowing with our whole beings that what we are asked to do for others is what God has done for us.

## WAITING WITH OUR RESPONSE

Choosing life instead of death demands an act of will that often contradicts our impulses. Our impulses want to take revenge, while our wills want to offer forgiveness. Our impulses push us to an immediate response: When someone hits us in the face, we impulsively want to hit back.

How then can we let our wills dominate our impulses? The key word is wait. Whatever happens, we must put some space between the hostile act directed toward us and our response. We must distance ourselves, take time to think, talk it over with friends, and wait until we are ready to respond in a life-giving way. Impulsive responses allow evil to master us, something we always will regret. But a well thought-through response will help us to "master evil with good" (Romans 12:21).

## CHOOSING WORDS WISELY~*Henri Nouwen Society*

Words are very important. When we say to someone: "You are an ugly, useless, despicable person," we might have ruined the possibility for a relationship with that person for life. Words can continue to do harm for many years.

It is so important to choose our words wisely. When we are boiling with anger and eager to throw bitter words at our opponents, it is better to remain silent. Words spoken in rage will make reconciliation very hard. Choosing life and not death, blessings and not curses often starts by choosing to remain silent or choosing carefully the words that open the way to healing.

**FALSE FORGIVENESS** | "My heavenly Father will treat you in exactly the same way unless each of you forgives his brother from his heart." —Matthew 18:35

Many Christians don't forgive others because they have been deceived into thinking they have already forgiven. This deception about forgiveness results in our being handed over to the torturers (Mt 18:34) and not being forgiven ourselves (Mt 6:12). Therefore, we are doomed if we are deceived about having forgiven. One of the best indicators of false forgiveness is anger. Before and after the writer of Sirach commands us to forgive (Sir 28:2), he teaches us that "wrath and anger are hateful things" (Sir 27:30) and that anger prevents us from being healed (Sir 28:3, 5). We may not even feel angry with the persons who have hurt us, yet anger in any area may be an indication of unforgiveness toward someone.

Another indication of false forgiveness is not being very aware of the impossibility of human beings forgiving. The old saying is absolutely true: "To err is human; to forgive is divine." We cannot forgive; only God can forgive. Humanly speaking, we have a bear-hug on anger and unforgiveness (see Sir 27:30). We will never break this hold by our own power. By the Lord's power, however, we can forgive everyone for everything. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal any false forgiveness in your life. Ask the Spirit to pour out His love in your heart (Rm 5:5) so you have His power to forgive.

**Prayer:** Father, may forgiveness mean for me what it means for You.

**Promise:** "None of us lives as his own master and none of us dies as his own master. While we live we are responsible to the Lord, and when we die we die as His servants." —Rm 14:7-8

**Praise:** Praise the risen Jesus, our Peace! (Eph 2:14)

### FORGIVENESS

Nearly ten years before, a son and father had parted ways when the business they shared went bankrupt. The son blamed the father. They did not speak to each other again.

Then the father became seriously ill. The mother called the son and told him he had better come soon. The son walked sheepishly into the hospital room. The father motioned his son to him and whispered: "Did you ever think you could do anything that would keep me from loving you?"

Resentment and anger are foul things, the first reading from Sirach tells us. Remember the last things. Stop hating. Live by the commandments. As Saint Paul writes to the Romans, we are to live for the Lord and die for the Lord.

Jesus' parable in today's Gospel reminds us of God's compassion. The immense sin of humanity has been forgiven and stricken from the record. We are to forgive others in the same way. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

## LA PRESENCIA REAL DE JESUCRISTO EN EL SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCHARISTÍA PREGUNTAS BÁSICAS Y RESPUESTAS

### CONTINUACIÓN...

¿Por qué llamamos "misterio" a la presencia de Cristo en la Eucaristía?

La palabra "misterio" suele referirse a algo que escapa a la plena comprensión de la mente humana. En la Biblia, sin embargo, esta palabra tiene un significado más profundo y específico, pues se refiere a aspectos del plan de salvación de Dios para la humanidad, que ha empezado ya pero será concluido sólo al final de los tiempos. En el antiguo Israel, por el Espíritu Santo Dios fue revelando a los profetas algunos de los secretos de lo que iba a cumplir para la salvación de su pueblo (cf. Am 3,7; Is 21, 28; Dn 2,27-45). Igualmente, por la predicación y enseñanza de Jesús, **el misterio del "Reino de Dios"** se fue revelando a sus discípulos (Mc 4,11-12). San Pablo explicaba que los misterios de Dios pueden desafiar nuestro entendimiento humano o incluso parecer locuras, pero su significado es revelado al Pueblo de Dios mediante Jesucristo y el Espíritu Santo (cf. 1 Co 1, 18-25, 2, 6-10; Rom 16, 25-27; Ap 10, 7).

**La Eucaristía es un misterio porque participa del misterio de Jesucristo y del plan de Dios para salvar a la humanidad por Cristo.** No nos debería sorprender que haya aspectos de la Eucaristía que no son fáciles de entender, pues el plan de Dios para el mundo ha rebasado repetidamente las expectativas humanas y el entendimiento humano (cf. Jn 6, 60-66). Por ejemplo, ni los discípulos comprendieron al principio que era necesario que el Mesías fuera condenado a muerte y luego resucitara de entre los muertos (cf. Mc 8, 31-33, 9,31-32, 10,32-34; Mt 16,21-23, 17,22-23, 20:17-19; Lc 9, 22, 9,43-45, 18, 31-34). Asimismo, cada vez que hablamos de Dios hemos de tener presente que nuestros conceptos humanos nunca aprehenden enteramente a Dios. No debemos limitar a Dios a nuestro entendimiento sino de permitir que nuestro entendimiento, por la revelación de Dios, se extienda más allá de sus limitaciones normales.

### EL FALSO PERDÓN

"Lo mismo hará también mi Padre celestial con ustedes, si no perdonan de corazón a sus hermanos" (Mateo 18:35).

Muchos cristianos no perdonan a otros porque se equivocan al pensar que ya han perdonado. Este engaño sobre el perdón da lugar a ser entregado a los torturadores (Mt 18:34) y no ser perdonados (Mt 6:12). Por lo tanto, somos condenados si nos engañamos acerca de haber perdonado.

Uno de los mejores indicadores del falso perdón es el enojo.

Antes y después de que el escritor del Eclesiástico nos manda a perdonar (Eccl 28:2), nos enseña que "el rencor y la ira son abominables" (Eccl 27:30) y que el enojo nos impide ser sanados (Eccl 28:3, 5). Incluso, ni podemos sentirnos enojados con las personas que nos lastimaron, es más, la ira en cualquier área puede ser una señal de falta de perdón hacia alguien.

Otro signo del falso perdón es no estar muy consciente de la imposibilidad de perdonar de los seres humanos. Es absolutamente cierto el viejo dicho: "errar es humano; perdonar es divino". Nosotros no podemos perdonar; solo Dios puede. Humanamente hablando, hacemos un abrazo de oso a la ira y a la falta de perdón (ver Eccl 27:30). Nunca romperemos este abrazo por nuestro propio poder. Sin embargo, por el poder del Señor, podemos perdonar todo a todos.

Pídale al Espíritu Santo que revele todo falso perdón en tu vida.

Pídale al Espíritu que derrame su amor en tu corazón (Rom 5:5) para que tengas Su poder de perdonar.

**Oración:** Padre, que el perdón signifique para mí lo que significa para Ti

**Promesa:** "Ninguno de nosotros vive para sí mismo, ni tampoco muere para sí. Si vivimos, vivimos para el Señor y si morimos, morimos para el Señor" (Rom 14:7-8).
