LOOKING BEYOND OURSELVES — The message found in today's readings is an oft-told story. Citizen Kane, Daddy Warbucks, and King Midas are only a few of the familiar fictional characters who thought enormous wealth could buy happiness and fulfillment. Daddy Warbucks admitted stepping on a few people in his climb to the top. Kane tried to buy the printed word and stardom for his young wife, while King Midas conjured immense wealth and tragedy by his very touch.

We learn clearly in today's readings that none of this is really possible. True happiness comes from caring for someone other than ourselves. It comes from the pursuit of the virtues Paul described to Timothy: faith, love, gentleness, godliness, righteousness, and endurance. The Gospel reminds us that we dare not ignore the needs of others, acting as though we don't notice their suffering. God's call to us is much too clear to disregard for even one more day. *Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.*

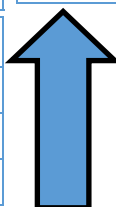

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We've been thinking about names lately, and there is hardly any tradition older than changing one's name when accepting a new vocation in life. In the time of Jesus, people would normally wait until the eighth day after birth for the naming of a child, partly because of the fragility of infant life, when the eighth day would mark the end of a survival crisis, and also because the elders would look for some clues as to the child's identity. In Jewish life then as now, it was not the custom to name a child after a living parent; notice there are no "juniors" in the genealogy of Jesus. Remember also how the relatives complained to Zachary and Elizabeth that no one in their family was ever named John. Then there are the changed names, Abram became Abraham, Sarai became Sarah, Saul became Paul, Simon became Peter. This spills over into Western culture in many ways, such as British royalty taking new names at coronation. It's anybody's guess, for example, whether the Prince of Wales intends to be King Charles II, or become Henry, or Edward, or George if he wishes.

Members of religious orders have until recent years swapped baptismal names for new ones, and the latest pope made a switch as well. Secular life has many parallels, and movie stars like Cary Grant, Judy Garland, and John Wayne might not have shone so brightly as Archie Leach, Frances Gumm, and Marion Morrison. There are some compelling reasons in our tradition for taking a new name when undertaking a new mission, yet also a clear preference for choosing the right baptismal name from the start!

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY | SEPTEMBER 25, 2016 | TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Amos castigates religious people who, “comfortably complacent” (6:1, 5), ignore the unfolding collapse of culture, nation, religion (6:6). In Jesus’ parable, such complacency becomes the rich man’s undoing. He neither hurt nor harmed Lazarus, neither denied him leftovers nor ordered him removed. That is Jesus’ devastating point. The rich man did nothing wrong to Lazarus; he just did nothing at all good for him. Only in death, separated by “a great chasm” (Luke 16:26), could the rich man finally see Lazarus, whom he had failed to see in life, right before his eyes. Like the rich man’s “five brothers still in my father’s house” (16:27–28), we who are alive in the Church still have time to see that same Someone, Jesus, lying neglected right at our door—and time to do something. Who, specifically, concretely, practically, is Lazarus in my life? What can I do for that Jesus-in-the-flesh during this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*? —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK | TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Theme: God cares for the poor and the oppressed, and we should too!

Breaking Open the Word Suggested text for faith sharing: Today’s Gospel

Step One: Listen to the Word: When you hear the story of the rich man, Lazarus, what catches your ear in it? What word or phrase really strikes you?

Step Two: Look into Your Life: QUESTION FOR CHILDREN: Jesus teaches us to share what we have with others. What do you have that you are able to share? QUESTION FOR YOUTH: The Gospel story tells us that we are judged by what we do or don’t do for the poor and needy. How are you currently reaching out to those in need? What more could you do? QUESTION FOR ADULTS: What choices can you or have you made to balance your own life with those who are homeless, poor and in need of assistance for daily living? How does this Gospel reading inform you about that?

THE GULF WAR

"Between you and us there is fixed a great abyss, so that those who might wish to cross from here to you cannot do so, nor can anyone cross from your side to us." —Luke 16:26

The rich man, traditionally known as Dives, spent eternity staring across a great chasm separating himself from the Lord (Lk 16:26). How ironic! Dives spent his lifetime constructing this chasm (or gulf) to isolate himself from the poor. Now this gulf, built day by day during his life, could not be undone in eternity. In the USA, many gulfs have been built to isolate the not-so-poor from the poor. We have suburbs, which the poor can’t reach because of distance and low income. We have expensive colleges and professional training, which often serve to exclude those without sufficient income. The high cost of medical insurance often excludes the poor from the treatment they need.

This is not meant so much to criticize those who enjoy these things as it is to make the point that those who have a gulf between themselves and the poor must work harder than ever to bridge that gulf. Charity obliges those with a sufficiency to share with those without (see 2 Cor 8:14). "Woe to the complacent" who do not reach out to the “Lazaruses” in their midst (Am 6:1).

King Jesus will judge us on our outreach to the poor (see Mt 25:35ff). All Christians are to "be mindful of the poor" (Gal 2:10) and even have "a preferential love" for the poor (Catechism, 2448). Reach out to the poor. Bridge the gulf now, before you have to stare across it forever.

Prayer: Jesus, You made Yourself poor for My sake (2 Cor 8:9). Give me Your heart, mind, love, and ministry to the poor.

Promise: "Happy he [.who] secures justice for the oppressed, [and] gives food to the hungry." —Ps 146:5, 7

Praise: Praise Jesus, Who is meek and humble of heart, yet Lord of the universe and Ruler of all creation.

Alleluia!

LA GUERRA DEL GOLFO

"Además, entre ustedes y nosotros se abre un gran abismo. De manera que los que quieren pasar de aquí hasta allí no pueden hacerlo, y tampoco se puede pasar de allí hasta aquí" (Lucas 16, 26).

El hombre rico, conocido tradicionalmente como Dives, pasó la eternidad mirando a través de un gran abismo que lo separaba del Señor (Lc 16, 26). ¡Qué ironía! Dives pasó su vida construyendo este abismo (o golfo) para aislarse de los pobres. Ahora este golfo, construido día tras día durante su vida, no se puede deshacer en la eternidad.

En los Estados Unidos, muchos golfos se han construido para aislar a los no tan pobres de los pobres. Tenemos suburbios a los que los pobres no pueden llegar debido a la distancia y los bajos ingresos. Tenemos colegios y formación profesional costosos, que a menudo sirven para excluir a los que no tienen ingresos suficientes. El alto costo del seguro médico a menudo excluye a los pobres del tratamiento que necesitan.

Esto no es criticar a aquellos que disfrutan de estas cosas, es para destacar el aspecto de que aquellos que tienen un abismo entre ellos y los pobres deben trabajar más duro que nunca para cerrar esa brecha. La caridad obliga a aquellos con una suficiencia a compartir con los que no tienen (2 Co 8, 14). "Ay de los complacientes" que no alcanzan a los Lázarus en medio de ellos (Am 6,1).

El Rey Jesús nos juzgará según nos acerquemos a los pobres (ver Mt 25, 35ss). Todos los cristianos deben "ser conscientes de los pobres" (Gal 2,10) e incluso tener "un amor preferencial" por los pobres (Catecismo# 2448). Acércate a los pobres. Cierra el abismo ahora, antes de tener que mirar a través de este para siempre.

Oración: Jesús, te hiciste pobre por causa mía (2 Co 8, 9). Dame tu corazón, la mente, el amor y el ministerio a los pobres.

Promesa: "Feliz el [...] que hace justicia a los oprimidos, [y] da pan a los hambrientos" (Sal 146:5, 7).

Alabanza: ¡Alabado sea Jesús, que es manso y humilde de corazón, pese a ser Señor del universo y Señor de toda la creación. ¡Aleluya! !
