

Q: WHY IS OCTOBER REFERRED TO AS THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY?

A: The short answer is this: October is dedicated as the Month of the Rosary because we celebrate the memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary each year on October 7. To understand this feast, we need to go back in time. In the 16th century, the Islamic Ottoman Empire presented a serious military threat to western Europe and sent a fleet of ships to attack Christian defenses in southern Europe. Pope Pius V recognized the grave danger and organized a fleet called the Holy League to confront the navy of the Ottoman Turks.

On October 7, 1571, the two navies engaged in a pivotal battle that would determine who controlled maritime traffic in the Mediterranean, Adriatic and Aegean seas. The fate of western Europe depended upon the success of Christians in this navy battle, which involved more than 400 warships (it was the largest naval battle in Western history for centuries).

Pius V knew he needed more than just military strength to defend Christian Europe, so he asked that all the faithful pray the rosary, requesting the intercession of the Blessed Mother. At the end of the Battle of Lepanto, the Holy League was victorious and the maritime expansion of the Ottoman Empire was permanently prevented.

The next year, Pius V established a feast on October 7 in honor of the Blessed Mother, originally called Our Lady of Victory. After a few centuries, the name was changed to Our Lady of the Rosary to more clearly recognize that prayer was the greatest power at work that day on the seas.

In 1571, the rosary was still a relatively new prayer form for the universal church. Pope Pius V had issued a decree formally establishing devotion to the rosary in the papal bull Consueverunt Romani Pontifices just two years before the Battle of Lepanto. The Holy Father's universal promulgation recognized the growing devotion to the Blessed Mother throughout Europe, as well as the increased prayer of the rosary in various locations. Devotion to the rosary was especially promoted in the 13th century by St. Dominic and in the 16th century by St. Peter Canisius (who, according to tradition, added the final verse to the Hail Mary, in which we pray, "Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death" — printed officially in the Catechism of the Council of Trent in 1566; the first two verses of the Hail Mary are adapted from Luke 1:28 and 1:42).

REFLECTIONS

TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME | The Understanding Father

Jesus must have shocked the priests and elders when he said that prostitutes and tax collectors would enter the kingdom of God before them. After all, his listeners had spent their whole lives being faithful to the Law. But Jesus' point was not so much about final salvation as about our daily choices.

Remember the parable about the two sons. The second son said what his father wanted to hear, with no intention of doing it. The first was honest about not wanting to go to the vineyard, but then decided to do it anyway. I suspect the father of those men knew what each would or would not do.

And whom do we want to imitate? Are we honest enough to look at our lives and repent of our hatred, our selfishness, or whatever keeps us in sin, and then to follow Jesus with our whole heart? We may not always like doing what God asks of us, but God is an understanding Father who can accept our weaknesses and forgive them when we are ready to return to him.



REFLEXIONES

VIGÉSIMO SEXTO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Administración injusta

Jesús debe haber sorprendido a los sacerdotes y ancianos cuando dijo que las prostitutas y los recaudadores de impuestos entrarían al reino de Dios antes que ellos. Después de todo, sus oyentes habían estado fieles a la Ley por toda la vida. Pero el punto de Jesús no se trataba tanto de la salvación final como de nuestras decisiones diarias.

Recuerda la parábola de los dos hijos. El segundo hijo dijo lo que su padre quería oír, sin intenciones de hacerlo. El primero fue sincero sobre no querer ir a la viña, pero luego decidió hacerlo de todos modos. Sospecho que el padre de esos hombres sabía lo que cada uno haría o dejaría de hacer.

¿Y a quién queremos imitar? ¿Somos lo suficientemente honestos para mirar nuestras vidas y arrepentirnos del odio, del egoísmo o lo que sea que nos mantiene en el pecado, y luego seguir a Jesús con todo el corazón? Puede que no siempre nos guste hacer lo que Dios nos pide, pero Dios es un Padre comprensivo que puede aceptar nuestras debilidades y perdonarlas cuando estamos listos para volver a él.

“DANDO GRACIAS POR NUESTRA COMIDA” | “La cosecha es abundante, pero los trabajadores son pocos. Rueguen al dueño de los sembrados que envíe trabajadores para la cosecha” (Lucas 10:2).

Jesús les dijo a Sus discípulos que no debían esperar que Él les proporcionara ni dónde reclinar la cabeza (Lc 9:58). Les dijo que responderían a Su llamado de inmediato y que la vacilación continua los haría inútiles para el reino de Dios (Lc 9:62). Después de hacer exigencias tan extremas a Sus discípulos, Jesús comentó: “La cosecha es abundante, pero los trabajadores son pocos” (Lc 10:2). La reacción obvia a esta declaración sería culpar a Jesús por la escasez de trabajadores porque les exige demasiado. Jesús tiene una reacción diferente. Él no ve ninguna necesidad de diluir el llamado al discipulado radical; Él simplemente nos exhorta orar para que el Señor de la Cosecha envíe obreros.

Jesús no trata de vendernos sino de “agraciarnos”. Nos advirtió que seremos como “ovejas en medio de lobos” (Lc 10:3). Prometió enviarnos sin bastón, alforja ni sandalias (Lc 10:4). Jesús no trata de facilitar el discipulado. De hecho, Él parece intencionalmente hacerlo más difícil. El verdadero discipulado es imposible sin su gracia, que siempre es suficiente (2 Co 12:9).

Cuando vemos escasez de sacerdotes, hermanas, hermanos, ministros laicos o feligreses, la respuesta al problema no es comprometerse y pedir menos compromiso. En cambio, la solución es proclamar la naturaleza radical del Evangelio y orar más intensamente para que los trabajadores obedezcan al llamado de Dios.

Oración: Padre, ayúdame a ver las situaciones en las que necesito desesperadamente de Tu gracia. Dame solo Tu amor y Tu gracia.

Promesa: “La alegría en el Señor es la fortaleza de ustedes” (Neh 8:10).

Alabanza: Jesús le dio a santa Faustina una visión de Su misericordia como un vasto océano. Pasó su vida difundiendo la devoción a la Divina Misericordia.




