Jesus said to the crowds: "This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come." He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

Breaking Open the Word - Suggested text for faith sharing: Reading II

Question for Children: Have you ever had to walk in the dark with no light? How is that like walking by faith and not by sight? What did you have to do to keep going in the dark?

Question for Youth: Do you pray and ask for faith? How do you work on building your faith?

Question for Adults: When do you find it hardest to have faith? Must you "see" answered prayer, or can you peacefully accept God's will?

"To what shall we compare the kingdom of God...?"

The practice of co-responsibility and accountability are not just organizational tools. They are disciplines that enable us to grow in holiness together. They are wise ascetical practices that teach us how to be more hospitable to the gifts, the wisdom, as well as the needs of one another. They are holy habits that keep salt from losing its flavor or a light from being hidden under a bushel basket.

Over the next 12 months, I invite my brother priests and the laity to join me in revitalizing our parish communities with a focus on offering greater hospitality and outreach to all our communities.

Reinvigorate Parish Pastoral Councils that foster accountability, co-responsibility, and collaboration. To this end, I will convene a Convocation on Saturday, April 17, 2021 for all Pastoral Councils. This will be followed up in October 2021 with an additional day of dialogue and workshops.

Pastors whose parish is without a Parish Pastoral Council are expected to inaugurate a Council by June 30, 2021.

To promote parish revitalization, Parish Pastoral Councils will meet monthly. I will propose agenda items for consultation among the pastor and the council members. The proposed agenda items are intended to augment but not replace parish agenda items. I would ask you to choose three to four of the agenda items listed below to work on over the next six months:

- **The Parish Pastoral Council is an effective tool for building parish co-responsibility and accountability.**
 - Communicate the membership, the agenda, and minutes of the Parish Pastoral Council as a means of building a common mission in the parish community.
 - Review the membership and leadership of Parish Pastoral Councils to ensure they reflect the membership of the parish.
- **Hospitality and Sunday Mass.**
 - Sunday Mass is the source and summit of parish life. Explore the ways Sunday Mass can bring others around the table of the Lord to share in the one saving sacrifice of Christ.
 - The worship and praise of the Eucharist should bring us into communion with the Father through Jesus Christ.
- **Hospitality in our Charitable works.**
 - The charitable works of the Church are an extension of the Sacrament of Charity, the Eucharist.
 - We meet Christ in the people we serve.
- **Hospitality in our Religious Formation.**
 - Religious Formation engages the lives of families and children helping them to meet Christ and follow him.
- **Hospitality for Young Families.**
 - Baptism is a graced moment to engage young families and develop a welcoming relationship to bring them to Christ.
 - Parish life is a support to young parents raising their children in the Catholic Faith.
 - Offer encouragement and support for women who are the sole providers of their families.
- **Hospitality for the unmarried and the engaged couples.**
 - Present Christian marriage as the way to grow strong in love.
 - Teach the beauty of sexuality as an expression of love and life.
- **Hospitality for the Dying and the Bereaved.**
 - Death and dying is a part of living. No one should be alone in the journey to the Father's House.
- **Hospitality to the sick and homebound.**
 - The sick and the homebound share in the sufferings of Christ. The accompaniment of the Church makes Christ Jesus more present to them as well as to the Church community.
- **Hospitality for Expectant Mothers and Fathers.**
 - The gift of new life creates bonds between the parents, the unborn child, and the Church.
- **Missionary outreach as hospitality.**
 - Each parish is a beacon and haven of home for everyone in the parish. Each parish community is called to be a good neighbor.
- **Hospitality and Vocations**
 - A vocation begins with the invitation, "Come, follow me."
 - These reflections hope to encourage us to foster together an authentic holiness of life in each disciple and a holy hospitality in the whole body of the Church so that together with Christ we can be His living sacrament of joy and hope in Northern California.

We are inspired by the example of holiness and hospitality found in the person of St. Joseph. His moment of salvation came when he heard the angel's good counsel, "Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home." (Mt. 1:20) Let us rely on the powerful intercession of the holy couple, Mary and Joseph, so that holiness and hospitality may open the door for our salvation in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

LETTER FROM BISHOP SOTO

Dear Friends in Christ:

Starting Friday, June 18, 2021, Pastors may accommodate the faithful for the celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass as well as other sacramental and worship services at 100% of the seating capacity in the parish churches.

I am rescinding the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Starting Sunday, June 20, 2021 all the Catholic faithful in the Diocese of Sacramento are obliged to personally attend and actively participate in the Sunday celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass (Canon 1247). Pastors and the faithful are counseled that individuals are not obligated to attend the Eucharist on Sunday or other obligatory solemnities if they are sick, have a vulnerable health condition, are caring for someone with a vulnerable health condition, or have other serious reasons (Canon 1245; Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2181).

All the faithful are reminded of the perennial obligation to keep holy the Lord's Day by observing Sunday with prayer, spiritual reflection, works of mercy, fellowship, and rest.

Pastors and the faithful should continue to observe sensible public health precautions:

- Practice frequent hand washing and use of hand sanitizer.

- Refrain from hand shaking and other forms of physical contact with others outside of one's household.

- Continue to clean the pews at least twice on Sundays and other days when there are multiple services.

- Facial masks are still encouraged.

- Priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers should continue to use facial masks for the distribution of communion.

 - During the distribution of communion priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers should have sanitizer available for use when needed.

For communion, the distribution of the cup is still suspended.

The exchange of the **sign of peace** during Mass may resume. The faithful should refrain from gestures of physical touching with persons outside of one's household. **A respectful bow or wave is encouraged.**

Congregational singing may resume. Musicians and choirs should observe sensible public health precautions. Pastors should use their discretion based on local circumstances regarding the use of facial masks by musicians, cantors, and choirs.

Liturgical processions may resume: Entrance procession, the gospel procession, the procession of the offertory gifts, and the recessional procession.

It is recommended that the collection baskets be handled only by the ushers rather than passed from person to person.

Holy Water may be made available to the faithful in the traditional fonts at the entrance of the church.

Livestreaming the Sunday celebrations of the Sacrifice of the Mass for the benefit of those who cannot attend in person due to illness or other circumstances noted above is encouraged.

All the faithful are encouraged to receive the COVID-19 vaccination when available. Consult with your doctor regarding any personal health concerns.

Other ministerial, catechetical, and social gatherings may resume while also observing sensible public health precautions as outlined above. Pastors should take additional precautions for the handling of food and the provision of materials to avoid the use of shared utensils. Avoiding self-serve options for food and drink is encouraged.

The return to regular congregational gatherings will be welcomed by many. Mutual respect, charity and patience should be cheerfully exercised so that all the members of the Body of Christ are welcomed and encouraged by this blessed opportunity. Over the course of the long pandemic journey, we have learned the personal duty we have for one another's spiritual and physical health whenever we gather and even when we are apart. The risks of infection still threaten us. Our communion with the charity and mercy of Christ will help safeguard us and lead us on the path of holiness together.

May the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary and St. Joseph, her most chaste spouse, bring an end to the pandemic and fill us with the joy and hope of the Lord Jesus.

Todos estamos esperando el juicio. Jesús nos juzgará en base a nuestra fe expresada en acción (ver Mt 25:31ss). Seremos juzgados según nuestra fecundidad como Sus administradores (Mt 25:14ss). 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DECRETO

El 13 de marzo de 2020, concedí una dispensa de la obligación de asistir a misa los domingos y días de precepto para todos los miembros de los Fieles Católicos en la Diócesis de Sacramento con el fin de amenorar la transmisión y devastación provocadas por la pandemia COVID-19.

Revise la información y los protocolos más recientes de los oficiales de salud pública, y ya no es necesaria una dispensa general. Mediante este decreto, revoco la dispensa general de la obligación de asistir a Misa los domingos y días de precepto, a partir del domingo, 20 de junio de 2021. Se restablece la obligación de los fieles católicos de estar presentes y participar en la Misa los domingos y días de precepto (1983 *CIC* c. 1247) a partir de esa fecha.

Se les avisa a los párrocos y fieles que las personas no están obligadas a asistir a la Eucaristía el domingo u otras solemnidades obligatorias si están enfermas, tengan una condición de salud vulnerable, estén cuidando a alguien con una condición de salud vulnerable o tengan otras razones graves (Canon 1245; Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, 2181).

Les pido a los párrocos de las parroquias en la Diócesis a discernir adecuadamente los medios para continuar e implementar los protocolos de salud y seguridad como parte del esfuerzo colaborativo para aliviar los efectos dañosos de la pandemia de COVID-19.

Los párrocos deben comenzar a ofrecer el número apropiado de misas para acomodar el regreso de los fieles a la oración, el culto y la comunión entre ellos.

Oren por los afectados por la pandemia COVID-19, sus familias y todos los cuidadores. Que la intercesión de nuestra Santísima Madre María nos traiga la misericordia y la gracia de su Hijo, Jesús.
