THE "10 MYTHS OF ANNULMENTS"

Annulment Myth #7: "It takes three to five years to get an annulment."

Truth: Most formal cases heard in the Sacramento Tribunal are finished in less than a year. Much depends on the participation of the parties and their witnesses to ensure a timely resolution to the case.

Annulment Myth #8: "Only Catholics need an annulment."

Truth: To marry a Catholic in the Church, both parties – whether Catholic or not – must be free to marry. Any and all previous marriages must be addressed. Persons who have divorced and remarried civilly without an annulment, and wish to become Catholic, must have their previous marriage(s) examined by the Tribunal before being baptized or received into the Church.

Annulment Myth #9: "A divorced person is excommunicated and cannot receive Communion without an annulment."

Truth: Divorced Catholics may receive Communion. Catholics who are divorced and remarried civilly without an annulment cannot receive Communion. **In neither case are they excommunicated.**

Annulment Myth #10: "If my former spouse does not participate, an annulment is impossible to get."

Truth: The former spouse has a right to participate in a case. However, if he/she does not participate in a formal case, the case still moves forward. Some types of cases do require the participation of the former spouse. Depending on your situation, the Tribunal determines the best possible way to proceed.

THE HOLY SPIRIT: PRAYER LEADER

"We do not know how to pray as we ought." —Romans 8:26

Jesus said there is "the necessity of praying always and not losing heart" (Lk 18:1). We are to "never cease praying" (1 Thes 5:17). Jesus prayed early in the morning (Mk 1:35) and late at night (Lk 22:39-41). Because we are His disciples, we imitate Him and pray so much that we are in the spirit of prayer during all daily activities. Jesus continues to invite us to watch and pray at least one hour with Him (see Mt 26:40).

Because we communicate with God in prayer, it is obvious that it is a privilege and a necessity to pray. Nevertheless, we struggle to pray always daily, faithfully, and deeply. The Spirit, however, "helps us in our weakness, for we do not know how to pray as we ought; but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us" (Rm 8:26).

The Holy Spirit helps us overcome our weakness in prayer in many ways. The Spirit calls us to:

- pray the Mass,
- pray with others (Mt 18:19),
- pray with our spouses,
- pray as a family,
- pray in tongues (1 Cor 14:2),
- pray from the Bible, and
- fast and pray (Mt 17:21, NAB).

The Holy Spirit is praying for you and leading you in prayer. "Since we live by the Spirit, let us follow the Spirit's lead" (Gal 5:25).

Prayer: Father, send the Holy Spirit to transform my prayer life and therefore my life.

Promise: "You gave Your sons good ground for hope that You would permit repentance for their sins." —Wis 12:19

Praise: He once was dead, but now He lives (Rv 1:18). Jesus is Lord! Alleluia!

THE REAL PRESENCE OF JESUS CHRIST IN THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST: BASIC QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Are the consecrated bread and wine "merely symbols"?

In everyday language, we call a "symbol" something that points beyond itself to something else, often to several other realities at once. The transformed bread and wine that are the Body and Blood of Christ are not merely symbols because they truly are the Body and Blood of Christ. As St. John Damascene wrote: "The bread and wine are not a foreshadowing of the body and blood of Christ—By no means!—but the actual deified body of the Lord, because the Lord Himself said: 'This is my body'; not 'a foreshadowing of my body' but 'my body,' and not 'a foreshadowing of my blood' but 'my blood'" (The Orthodox Faith, IV [PG 94, 1148-49]). At the same time, however, it is important to recognize that the Body and Blood of Christ come to us in the Eucharist in a sacramental form. In other words, Christ is present under the appearances of bread and wine, not in his own proper form. We cannot presume to know all the reasons behind God's actions. God uses, however, the symbolism inherent in the eating of bread and the drinking of wine at the natural level to illuminate the meaning of what is being accomplished in the Eucharist through Jesus Christ. There are various ways in which the symbolism of eating bread and drinking wine discloses the meaning of the Eucharist. For example, just as natural food gives nourishment to the body, so the eucharistic food gives spiritual nourishment. Furthermore, the sharing of an ordinary meal establishes a certain communion among the people who share it; in the Eucharist, the People of God share a meal that brings them into communion not only with each other but with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Similarly, as St. Paul tells us, the single loaf that is shared among many during the eucharistic meal is an indication of the unity of those who have been called together by the Holy Spirit as one body, the Body of Christ (1 Cor 10:17). To take another example, the individual grains of wheat and individual grapes have to be harvested and to undergo a process of grinding or crushing before they are unified as bread and as wine. Because of this, bread and wine point to both the union of the many that takes place in the Body of Christ and the suffering undergone by Christ, a suffering that must also be embraced by his disciples. Much more could be said about the many ways in which the eating of bread and drinking of wine symbolize what God does for us through Christ, since symbols carry multiple meanings and connotations.

LA PRESENCIA REAL DE JESUCRISTO EN EL SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCHARISTÍA PREGUNTAS BÁSICAS Y RESPUESTAS

CONTINUACIÓN...

¿El pan y el vino consagrados dejan de ser el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo cuando la Misa ha terminado?

No. Durante la celebración de la Eucaristía, el pan y el vino se convierten en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo, y como tales permanecen. No pueden volver a ser pan y vino, pues ya no son en absoluto pan y vino. No hay entonces razón para que cambien nuevamente a su estado "normal" ya que han pasado las circunstancias especiales de la misa. Una vez que la substancia ha cambiado realmente, la presencia del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo "dura todo el tiempo que subsistan las especies eucarísticas" (Catecismo, no. 1377). En contra de quienes sostenían que el pan consagrado durante la Eucaristía no tiene poder santificante si se reserva para el día siguiente, S. Cirilo de Alejandría replicó, "ni se altera Cristo, ni se muda su sagrado Cuerpo, sino que persevera siempre en él la fuerza, la potencia y la gracia vivificante" (Epístola 83 a Calosyrium, obispo de Arsinoe [PG 76, 1076]). La Iglesia enseña que Cristo permanece presente bajo la apariencia de pan y vino todo el tiempo que subsiste la apariencia de pan y vino (cf. Catecismo, no. 1377).

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Bartolomé de las Casas, el gran defensor de los indígenas, nació en Sevilla, España en 1474 y falleció en Madrid en el año 1566. Su larga vida fue dedicada a la presencia española en América.

Bartolomé llegó a la Nueva España para encargarse de una Encomienda. Después fue ordenado sacerdote y recibió a cargo una encomienda de mineros amerindios. Poco a poco su corazón cristiano le abrió los ojos a las injusticias españolas en América.

Por eso se hizo fraile dominico e hizo varios viajes a España en defensa de los derechos humanos de los amerindios ante los reyes de España, los cuales le dieron tierras en Venezuela y Chiapas para poner en práctica su teoría humanista acerca de los indígenas.

Hasta el fin de su vida este fraile y teólogo dominico luchó por los derechos de los nativos americanos, buscando convencer a los reyes españoles y a los Papas que la conquista no favorecía la evangelización de los pueblos. Gracias a sus esfuerzos se abolió la esclavitud indígena y se instituyó el diálogo, en lugar de la espada, como instrumento de conversión.—Fray Gilberto Cavazos-Glz, OFM, Copyright © J. S. El Espíritu Santo nos ayuda a vencer nuestras debilidades al orar de muchas formas. El Espíritu nos llama a:

- orar durante la Misa,
- orar con otros (Mt 18,19),
- orar con nuestras esposas y esposos,
- orar como una familia,
- orar en lenguas (1 Co 14, 2),
- orar con la Biblia y
- ayunar y orar (Mt 17, 21).

El Espíritu Santo está orando por ti y guiándote en tus oraciones. "Si vivimos animados por el Espíritu, dejémonos conducir también por Él" (Gal 5,25).

Oración: Padre, envía al Espíritu Santo para transformar mi vida de oración y toda mi vida.

Promesa: "Colmaste a tus hijos de una feliz esperanza, porque, después del pecado, das lugar al arrepentimiento" (Sab 12,19).

Alabanza: Él estuvo muerto, pero ahora vive (Ap 1, 18). ¡Jesús es Señor! ¡Aleluya!
