### FROM VICTIM TO VICTOR

**"God Who is mighty has done great things for me, holy is His name." —Luke 1:49**

In much of the Western world, this date is associated with victory, the end of World War II. In Catholic liturgical tradition, today's celebration of Mary being taken to heaven is associated with the ultimate victory: Jesus' victory over death and our victory over death through faith in Jesus. United with Jesus, the Church is "a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars" (Rv 12:1). In Jesus, the Church has total victory over Satan, the "huge dragon" (Rv 12:3); Mary and all those living their Baptisms share in this victory. Today's celebration of Mary's assumption into heaven proclaims the total victory of Jesus. "He has shown might with His arm; He has confused the proud in their inmost thoughts. He has deposed the mighty from their thrones and raised the lowly to high places" (Lk 1:51-52).

Today, on this holy day, the Lord wants to transform you from victim to victor. Today, you can be free from the sins, bitterness, resentments, unforgiveness, self-hatred, and compulsions which have victimized you. Today, in Jesus, you can win victories you had never thought you would win. Mary, assumed into heaven, pray for us.

**Prayer:** *Father, make me the conqueror of the world (1 Jn 5:5).*

**Promise:** *"Christ must reign until God has put all enemies under His feet." —1 Cor 15:25*

**Praise:** *Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption as a dogma of the Catholic Church in 1950. Mary's Assumption into heaven, body and soul, foreshadows the resurrection of our own bodies.*

### INCREASING GOD'S PROPERTY VALUE

**"That servant is fortunate whom his Master finds busy when He returns. Assuredly, his Master will put him in charge of all His property." —Luke 12:43-44**

My prayer is that you readers of One Bread, One Body will constantly be "faithful, farsighted" servants of God (Lk 12:42), busy sowing His Word in season and out of season (Lk 12:42; 2 Tm 4:2). If you are faithful in doing this, Jesus "will put you in charge of larger affairs" (Mt 25:21). In fact, He promises He will put you "in charge of all His property" (Lk 12:44).

What is God's property? Of what will He put you in charge?

- "Life (Ez 18:4):I would rejoice to see you readers in charge of all governmental decisions on right-to-life matters.
- Food: Jesus will use you as other Josephs, feeding the starving of the world (Gn 41:57; Jn 21:15; Lk 12:42) and ensuring human greed does not deprive anyone of food.
- Money (see Hg 2:8):The world has used money to enslave poor nations under impossible debt loads. Jesus came to set captives free through you (Lk 4:18; Is 58:6-7).
- Power (Mt 28:18, RNAB):"You will receive power" from the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8). Many use power unjustly. Jesus will use your power for justice (Rm 6:13).

If I, a mere human, find joy in visualizing you readers in charge of Jesus' property, consider the greater joy of Jesus in putting you in charge! Therefore, be busy about His work now, be put in charge (Lk 12:42-44), and "share your Master's joy!" (Mt 25:21)

**Prayer:** *Jesus, "here I am...Send me!" (Is 6:8)*

**Promise:** *"Be on guard, therefore. The Son of Man will come when you least expect Him." —Lk 12:40*

**Praise:** *Risen Jesus, by Your death and resurrection, You have set us free to do Your will. We exalt Your powerful name.*

#### WHAT'S THE SMOKE FOR?

*Dear Johan,*

***Most of the modern churches have one altar. Why does our church have so many and why do we only use the one in the sanctuary?***

Gentle Reader,

Indeed, churches that are built or renovated after Vatican II only have one altar. It is the central eucharistic table, the locus of the sacramental presence of Christ, and a permanent symbol of Christ in our midst. It is revered with bows and kisses and incense.

The multiplicity of altars is the result of a combination of historical factors. First, since the early Middle Ages, a "high" theology of the Eucharist and of ordained ministry developed. Second, there was a great abundance of priests. Third, different groups such as guilds and confraternities desired to have an altar dedicated to their own salvation and, dare I say, glory. As a result, it was not uncommon for churches to have multiple altars at which different priests celebrated their own daily Mass for the intentions of the people who built and cared for the altars. And they would do it all at the same time.

The Second Vatican Council called some of this into question, returning the Catholic Church to an earlier and more authentic eucharistic theology and praxis. This included an emphasis on the active role of the assembly in the celebration of the Eucharist. The introduction of concelebration allowed priests to observe their own daily Mass obligation within the context of the assembly, rather than in solitude. And altars were no longer built for the personal or collective glory and salvation of an individual or a group.

Today, most churches have but one altar symbolizing the one who is Lord of all. The multiple altars you have in your church are theologically confusing and liturgically superfluous. Nevertheless, they may have artistic and historical importance. Because of that, they ought not to be shipped off to an architectural antiques shop but rather should be preserved and honored.

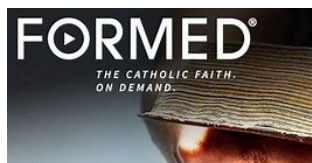

## MARIA, CAUSA DE NUESTRA ALEGRÍA

"Y mi espíritu se alegra en Dios mi Salvador." —Lc 1:47

La bien conocida oración "Letanías de la Santísima Virgen" identifica a María como "la causa de nuestra alegría." Este título de María es el más apropiado para nuestra fiesta de su Asunción a los cielos.

Toda su vida María halló alegría en el Señor (Lc 1:46). Ella repartió esa alegría a otros, inclusive al bebe Juan en las entrañas de su prima Isabel, quien saltó "de alegría" al sonido de la voz de María, cuando llevando a Jesús en su seno entró a la casa de ellos (Lc 1:44). María también estaba presente en la habitación alta en Pentecostés (Hch 1:14) y seguramente se regocijó con alegría en su Esposo, el Espíritu Santo, que llenó a los apóstoles, quienes en aquel entonces, trajeron tres mil personas dentro de la Iglesia.

Finalmente, María "fue tomada en cuerpo y alma hacia el cielo gloriosamente" (Catecismo, 966). "Ella comparte la gloria de la Resurrección de su Hijo, anticipando la resurrección de todos los miembros de Su Cuerpo" (Catecismo, 974) Ella ha sido exaltada por el Señor como Reina de todas las cosas, de manera que pueda ser más conforme a Su Hijo" (Catecismo, 966). Su Asunción es un signo de segura esperanza (Lumen Gentium, 68, Vaticano II) de que Jesús nos ascenderá para vivir con El por siempre.

El Señor en Su palabra nos ordena a regocijarnos con María, como hoy le hacemos honor. Como María es honrada, " todos los miembros comparten su alegría" (1Cor 12:26). Nosotros debemos "regocijarnos con" ella (Rm 12:15). María sería la primera en exclamar: "Regocijaos en el Señor siempre! Yo digo de nuevo. Regocijaos!" (Fil 4:4) Regocijaos con María, la "causa de nuestra alegría."

**Oración:** *Espíritu Santo, algunos Cristianos responden a la alegría de Tu esposa, María, con desdén. Convierte el ceño de ellos en sonrisas de alegría hoy.*

**Promesa:** *"Y se abrió el Santuario de Dios en el cielo y pudo verse el arca de Su alianza" —Ap 11:19*

**Alabanza:** *Alaba Al resucitado y El que regresará, Jesús, quien recogerá a todos hacia El! (Jn 12:32)*

"Este es el Pan que viene del cielo para que el hombre coma y nunca muera." —Juan 6:50

Aun el gran Elías se deprimió. Él fue al desierto, se separó de los demás (1 R 19:4), imploro la muerte, y se durmió (1 R 19:4-5). Sin embargo, el Señor rescata a Elías de la depresión por medio de un ángel, quien le ordenó a Elías que se levantara y comiera (1 R 19:5).

La solución a la depresión que nos tiene Dios es que comamos. La mayoría hace esto, pero de la forma errada. El mundo está lleno de personas depresivas que comen para sentirse mejor. No obstante, el Señor no ordenó a Elías simplemente comer, sino comer lo que El le ofreció a través del ángel. Si nosotros comemos la comida del mundo, nuestra depresión se hará peor, e inclusive perderemos el apetito por lo bueno de el Señor (Sal 34:9). Nos convertiremos espiritualmente en anoréxicos. Lo que debemos hacer diariamente, y especialmente en tiempos de dificultad, es comer la comida espiritual de Jesús Mismo que está en Su Palabra (ver Mt 4:4) y en la Eucaristía. Las promesas de Jesús: "Yo mismo soy el Pan de Vida venido del cielo. Si alguno come este Pan el vivirá por siempre; el pan que yo daré es Mi carne, y lo daré para la vida del mundo" (Jn 6:51).

Come, toma y se Cristiano, porque nunca moriremos.
