PRAYER IS TO BE SHARED

Much that has been said about prayer might create the false impression that prayer is a private, individualistic, and nearly secret affair, so personal and so deeply hidden in our inner life that it can hardly be talked about, even less be shared. The opposite is true. Just because prayer is so personal and arises from the center of our life, it is to be shared with others. Just because prayer is the most precious expression of being human, it needs the constant support and protection of the community to grow and flower. Just because prayer is our highest vocation, needing careful attention and faithful perseverance, we cannot allow it to be a private affair. Just because prayer asks for a patient waiting in expectation, it should never become the most individualistic expression of the most individualistic emotion, but should always remain embedded in the life of the community of which we are part.

SWING SET?

"I tell you truly: you will weep and mourn while the world rejoices; you will grieve for a time, but your grief will be turned into joy." —John 16:20

Imagine a little boy sitting in a swing. This child's slightly older brother begins to push his brother in the swing. At first, the younger brother is delighted. Then his brother pushes the swing harder. The younger brother begins to become afraid. He cries to his brother to stop. The older brother pushes even harder. The younger child begins to scream and cry.

This scene is analogous to trusting in the Spirit. When the wind of the Spirit blows our swing, it can be delightful. However, if the Holy Spirit pushes harder, we might become afraid. Because of our fears, we can refuse to let the wind of the Spirit lift us up to the heights.

The Holy Spirit swung Paul so hard that he was sent to be a missionary to the Gentiles (see Acts 18:6). The cross is the ultimate push of the Holy Spirit. We are naturally afraid to be lifted up to the cross.

Tomorrow begins the Pentecost novena, which is often all about growing to trust the Holy Spirit before He pushes your swing harder. Pray with all your heart the Pentecost novena.

Prayer: Jesus, lifted up on the cross, in the Resurrection, and in Your Ascension, may I let you draw me to Yourself (Jn 12:32).

Promise: "Many of the Corinthians, too, who heard Paul believed and were baptized." —Acts 18:8

Praise: At a healing service, Jesus healed Nora's torn rotator cuff, restoring her full range of motion.

REFLECTIONS

WHAT'S THE SMOKE FOR?

Dear Johan,

I am alarmed by the conservative trends in the liturgy today. The changes in the celebration of the Eucharist that were recently imposed on us are but the tip of the iceberg. What should I do?

Gentle Reader,

I sometimes wish Jesus had left us with much clearer directives as to the celebration of the Eucharist. Of course, he didn't and undoubtedly purposefully so. Nevertheless, I wonder what exactly he had in mind when he told us, "do this in memory of me"?

Much has changed in the liturgy since Jesus gathered with his followers to break the bread and share the wine on the night before he died. The liturgy has evolved together with the church as it became more and more complex. Some of the landmark events that changed the liturgy over the course of time are the unification of the liturgy of the early Christian churches into the Roman Rite, the codification of the liturgy in light of the Council of Trent, and the fundamental changes in the liturgy after the Second Vatican Council.

Today's liturgy is characterized by the following five affirmations:

The Eucharist is the source and summit of everything we do as a community.

The entire Body of Christ in its varied ministries celebrates the liturgy.

Everyone is called to full, conscious, and active participation in the liturgy.

Christ is present in the gathered assembly, the celebrant, the Word proclaimed, and above all the consecrated bread and wine.

The Body of Christ worships best when using the local language and honoring local customs.

These fundamental theological concepts were published over fifty years ago in a groundbreaking document: the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (1963). On the basis of this document the liturgy was revised. The first edition of the revised liturgy was published in the Roman Missal of 1969. In the year 2000 the fifth revision of this instruction was promulgated in Latin. As in every round of revisions, there are some clarifications and some adaptation in light of contemporary liturgical needs. We have been using this version of the liturgy since Advent 2011.

Every shift in the way we celebrate the liturgy in the course of our history has been accompanied by praise and outcry. This was no different with the most recent change. Some people are very much for it while others are very vocally opposed. This holds true for both laypeople and clerics alike, even high ranking ones. Some say the changes go too far, others that they don't go far enough. On and on it goes.

Our calling as members of the church is to trust in the Holy Spirit at work, albeit in a sinful church and through fallible people. The beauty of the Catholic Church is that there is room for those who delight in singing Gregorian chant as well as those who clap hands and beat on the drums. So rather than set up theological barriers and delineate liturgical camps, let us build bridges we can cross together.

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TOGETHER WE PRAY TO GOD

Prayer is the language of the Christian community. In prayer the nature of the community becomes visible because in prayer we direct ourselves to the One who forms the community. We do not pray to each other, but together we pray to God, who calls us and makes us into a new people. Praying is not one of the many things the community does.

Rather, it is its very being. Many discussions about prayer do not take this very seriously. Sometimes it seems as if the Christian community is "so busy" with its projects and plans that there is neither the time nor the mood to pray. But when prayer is no longer its primary concern, and when its many activities are no longer seen and experienced as part of prayer itself, the community quickly degenerates into a club with a common cause but no common vocation.

By prayer, community is created as well as expressed. Prayer is first of all the realization of the community itself. Most clear and most noticeable are the words, the gestures, and the silence through which the community is formed. When we listen to the word, we not only receive insight into God's saving work, but we also experience a new mutual bond. When we stand around the altar, eat bread and drink wine, kneel in meditation, or walk in procession, we not only remember God's work in human history, but we also become aware of God's creative presence here and now. When we sit together in silent prayer, we create a space where we sense that the One we are waiting for is already touching us, as he touched Elijah in front of the cave (1 Kings 19:13).

¿UNA FE ALTAMENTE CONTAGIOSA?

"Apenas esta oyó el saludo de María, el niño saltó de alegría en su seno, e Isabel, llena del Espíritu Santo" (Lucas 1:41-42).

El viejo dicho es verídico: "La fe se aprende más por contagio que por ser enseñada". Si tienes al Espíritu Santo muy activo en ti, tendrás un breve encuentro con los demás, y muchos de ellos entregarán sus vidas a Jesús, recibirán el Espíritu Santo, y serán transformados. Esto es lo que sucedió cuando María visitó a Isabel. En el primer Pentecostés cristiano, tres mil personas escucharon un poco acerca de Jesús, y en unas pocas horas fueron bautizados en Él (ver Hch 2:41). Pablo fue de ciudad en ciudad y vio que las conversiones se llevaban a cabo muy rápidamente, tan repentinamente como su propia conversión ocurrida en el camino a Damasco (Hch 22:6-10). Esto también sucedió por medio de Pedro (Hch 10:44-48), Felipe (Hch 8:34-38) y otros discípulos de Jesús. La fe de aquellos en el Espíritu es altamente contagiosa. Aún un breve contacto con esta puede generar muchas conversiones.

¿A cuántas personas has contagiado tu fe últimamente? Si no son muchas, no culpes a los corazones endurecidos de aquellos que encuentres, sino busca en tu corazón para ver si estás apagando al Espíritu Santo (1 Tes 5:19).

Arrepéntete y recibe un nuevo Pentecostés mediante el cual el Espíritu "renovará la faz de la tierra" (Sal 104:30).

Oración: Padre, en este primer día de la Novena de Pentecostés, aumenta en mí el amor y el celo para ser un cristiano altamente contagioso.

Promesa: "¡El Señor, tu Dios, está en medio de ti, es un guerrero victorioso! Él exulta de alegría a causa de ti, te renueva con Su amor y lanza por ti gritos de alegría" (Sof 3:17).

Alabanza: La Santísima Virgen María no se guardó las Buenas Nuevas, sino que compartió a su Hijo con su primo y con nosotros. Este acto de bondad ayudó a soltar el poder del Espíritu Santo al mundo.

¿IMPULSOS DE COLUMPIO?

"Les aseguro que ustedes van a llorar y se van a lamentar; el mundo, en cambio, se alegrará. Ustedes estarán tristes, pero esa tristeza se convertirá en gozo" (Juan 16:20).

Imagina a un niño pequeño sentado en un columpio. El hermano un poco mayor comienza a empujar a su hermano en el columpio. Al principio, el hermano menor está encantado. Entonces su hermano empuja el columpio con más fuerza. El hermano menor comienza a tener miedo. Él le grita a su hermano que se detenga. El hermano mayor empuja aún más duro. El niño más pequeño comienza a gritar y llorar.

Esta escena es análoga a confiar en el Espíritu. Cuando el viento del Espíritu sopla nuestro columpio, suele ser delicioso. Empero, el Espíritu Santo nos impulsará más. Entonces, podremos inquietarnos. Si clamamos al Espíritu que pare, entonces, a diferencia del hermano mayor, el Espíritu se detendrá. Debido a nuestros temores, nosotros podemos negarnos a permitir que el viento del Espíritu nos eleve a las alturas.

El Espíritu Santo impulsó a Pablo tan fuerte que le envió a ser misionero de los gentiles (ver Hch 18:6). Esto traspasó, y por mucho, la zona de confort de Pablo. La cruz es el impulso final del Espíritu Santo. Naturalmente tenemos miedo a ser elevados a la cruz.

Oración: Jesús, levantado en la cruz, en la Resurrección, y en Su Ascensión, que pueda yo permitirte impulsarme hacia Ti (Jn 12:32).

Promesa: "Muchos habitantes de Corinto, que habían escuchado a Pablo, abrazaron la fe y se hicieron bautizar" (Hch 18: 8).

Alabanza: En un servicio de sanación, Jesús curó el desgarro del mango rotador de Nora, restaurando su rango completo de movimiento.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El 25 de abril la Iglesia conmemora a Pedro de Betancur (1626-1667). Originalmente de las Islas Canarias, a la edad de 24, se trasladó a Cuba. En 1651 llegó a Guatemala con la ambición de predicar a Cristo. Esto lo hizo, no como sacerdote ni religioso. El fue como laico, reconociendo su deber bautismal de evangelizar. En 1655 ingresó en la Orden Seglar Franciscana y como laico quiso poner en práctica la espiritualidad franciscana, ayudando a los pobres. Sin su propio pan o casa el alimentaba al hambriento y amparaba al indigente. A todos recordaba la necesidad de la salvación y en la simplicidad de su mensaje derretía el egoísmo de los ricos. Les abría el corazón enseñándoles a compartir con los más pequeños de sus hermanos y hermanas.

Eventualmente su nobleza de espíritu atrajo a hombres y mujeres que deseaban compartir su apostolado y fundó la Orden Betlehemitita. También fundó la primera escuela de niños en Centro América convirtiéndose en el alfabetizador de Guatemala. Así dio ejemplo de lo que la Iglesia debe hacer por el pobre y marginado.
