TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today, the languages of the whole world arise to God in a Pentecost of praise. In some American dioceses, the Mass is offered every Sunday in more than thirty different languages, including the silent praise of American Sign Language. Fifty years ago, the landscape of liturgy was very different. It was grounded firmly in Latin, which is to the present day still the official language of the Roman Rite. Very few people were fluent in Latin, even though in those days Latin was far more widely studied in school. Nevertheless, almost every Catholic was competent in the responses and chants of Latin since it is not difficult to pronounce. The clergy were normally minimally competent in Latin, since much of seminary education was conducted in that language.

When the Second Vatican Council was convened, all of the debate and daily work of the council was to be in Latin. In the first session in 1962, Boston's Cardinal Richard Cushing continually complained about it, and threatened not to return in 1963 if something wasn't done. He convinced the fathers when he rose to speak in fairly fluent Latin in an unforgettable Boston twang. The next year, he returned, but with a simultaneous translation system funded by the people of Boston. The ordinary everyday language of the people, the vernacular, had arrived at the Vatican via Boston!

MOUTH-TO-MOUTH

Jesus "breathed on them." —John 20:22

In the beginning, "the Lord God formed man out of the clay of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and so man became a living being" (Gn 2:7). The breath of the Father gives life where previously there was no life.

On His Resurrection evening, Jesus "breathed on" His disciples "and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit' " (Jn 20:22).

The breath of Jesus brought the Holy Spirit and peace where previously there had been turmoil and fear.

On the day of Pentecost, "suddenly from up in the sky there came a noise like a strong, driving wind which was heard all through the house where they were seated. Tongues as of fire appeared, which parted and came to rest on each of them. All were filled with the Holy Spirit. They began to express themselves in foreign tongues and make bold proclamation as the Spirit prompted them" (Acts 2:2-4).

The breath of the Holy Spirit brings every good thing (see Jas 1:17). First the Spirit breathes on us, then He breathes through us. God's words are given to us and spoken through us in the spiritual gifts such as teaching, evangelization, tongues, prophecy. etc. His breath brings life, peace, forgiveness, boldness, miraculous unity, and worldwide renewal (see Ps 104:30). The Spirit is breathing out. We just have to breathe in. It's Pentecost! Take a deep breath and "receive the Holy Spirit" (Jn 20:22).

Prayer: Holy Spirit, You are Lord of my life (2 Cor 3:17-18). Do whatever You will with me. I love You.

Promise: "To each person the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good." —1 Cor 12:7

Praise: Praise You, Holy Spirit, for giving Your life to the Church! Alleluia!

LA PRESENCIA REAL DE JESUCRISTO EN EL SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCARISTÍA PREGUNTAS BÁSICAS Y RESPUESTAS

CONTINUACIÓN...

1. ¿Por qué la Eucaristía no es sólo una comida sino también un sacrificio?

Aunque nuestros pecados hacían imposible que tuviéramos parte en la vida de Dios, Jesucristo fue enviado a quitar este obstáculo. Su muerte fue un sacrificio por nuestros pecados. Cristo es "el Cordero de Dios, el que quita el pecado del mundo" (Jn 1:29). Mediante su muerte y resurrección, venció al pecado y la muerte, y nos reconcilió con Dios. La Eucaristía es el memorial de este sacrificio. La Iglesia se congrega para recordar y reactualizar el sacrificio de Cristo, en el cual participamos por la acción del sacerdote y el poder del Espíritu Santo. Mediante la celebración de la Eucaristía, nos unimos al sacrificio de Cristo y recibimos sus inagotables beneficios.

Como dice la Carta a los Hebreos, Jesús es el eterno y sumo sacerdote que vive para siempre e intercede por el pueblo ante el Padre. De esta manera, supera a todos los sumos sacerdotes que a lo largo de los siglos ofrecían sacrificios por el pecado en el templo de Jerusalén. El eterno y sumo sacerdote Jesús ofrece el sacrificio perfecto, que es su persona y no alguna otra cosa. "[Cristo] penetró una sola vez y para siempre en el 'lugar santísimo'. . . No llevó consigo sangre de animales, sino su propia sangre, con la cual nos obtuvo una redención eterna" (Heb 9:11-12).

El acto de Jesús pertenece a la historia humana, pues él es verdaderamente humano y ha entrado a la historia. Pero al mismo tiempo Jesucristo es la Segunda Persona de la Santísima Trinidad; es el Hijo eterno, que no está limitado al tiempo o a la historia. Sus actos trascienden el tiempo, que es parte de lo creado. Entrando "a través de una tienda, que no estaba hecha por mano de hombre, ni pertenecía a esta creación" (Heb 9:11), Jesús el Hijo eterno de Dios realizó su sacrificio en presencia de su Padre, que vive en la eternidad. El sacrificio perfecto de Jesús está así eternamente presente ante el Padre, que eternamente lo acepta. Esto significa que, en la Eucaristía, Jesús no se sacrifica una y otra vez, sino que, por el poder del Espíritu Santo, su eterno sacrificio se hace presente una vez más, se reactualiza, a fin de que podamos tomar parte en él.

BOCA A BOCA

Jesús "sopló sobre ellos" (Juan 20, 22).

En el principio, "el Señor Dios modeló al hombre con arcilla del suelo y sopló en su nariz un aliento de vida. Así el hombre se convirtió en un ser viviente" (Gn 2, 7). El soplo del Padre da la vida donde antes no había vida.

En la tarde de la Resurrección, Jesús "sopló en" Sus discípulos y dijo: "Recibid al Espíritu Santo" (Jn 20, 22). El aliento de Jesús trajo el Espíritu Santo y la paz, donde antes había confusión y miedo.

En el día de Pentecostés, "de pronto, vino del cielo un ruido, semejante a una fuerte ráfaga de viento, que resonó en toda la casa donde se encontraban. Entonces vieron aparecer unas lenguas como de fuego, que descendieron por separado sobre cada uno de ellos. Todos quedaron llenos del Espíritu Santo y comenzaron a hablar en diferentes lenguas, según el Espíritu les permitía expresarse" (Hch 2, 2-4).

El aliento del Espíritu Santo trae cosas buenas (ver Stg 1, 17). Primero, el Espíritu nos da su aliento, y luego alienta a otros por medio de nosotros. Las palabras de Dios se nos dan y son pronunciadas mediante nosotros en los dones espirituales tales como la enseñanza, la evangelización, las lenguas, la profecía. El aliento de Dios da vida, paz, perdón, valor, unidad milagrosa y renovación en todo el mundo (ver Sal 104, 30). El Espíritu está soplando. Solo tenemos que recibirlo. ¡Es Pentecostés! Tome una respiración profunda y "reciba al Espíritu Santo" (Jn 20, 22).

Oración: Espíritu Santo, Tu eres el Señor de mi vida (2 Co 3, 17-18). Haz de mi lo que quieras. Te amo.

Promesa: "En cada uno, el Espíritu se manifiesta para el bien común" (1 Co 12, 7).

Alabanza: Alabanza a Ti, Santo Espíritu, por dar Tu vida a la Iglesia. ¡Aleluya!
